The M. E. General Conference.

LOUISVILLE, KY., May 23.—As

predicted the Methodist General

Conference adopted the report of

the Committee on Fraternal rela-

tions with the Methodist Episcopal

Church without alteration, except

to transpose some of the paragraphs.

The committee reported at 10 o'clock,

and the discussion was vigorous by

the majority favoring the report,

and the reverends got all the way

back to 1844, and dwelt upon the

plan of separation and the obsta-

cles in the way of union and Christ-

ian fellowship. It is claimed that

no cordial fraternity could exist be-

tween the two Churches until these

old difficulties were cleared up. The

substitute offered by Dr. Register

yesterday, which went to the com-

mittee, has never seen daylight

since, but the friends of the substi-

tute got before the Conference a

minority report, signed by three

members of the committee. The

report is simply all that part of the

majority report referring to fraternal

greeting without the historical

review. Dr. Register made a zealous

and earnest appeal to the Confer-

ence, urging the acceptance of the

minority report, claiming that the

occasion did not demand a review

of past disputes, that the Northern

delegates did not refer to them, but

expressed a willingness to wholly

ignore the past and stand together

as Christian brethren having the

same history, the same labors, the

same God and the same final heri-

tage. He was listened to respect-

fully, but it was apparent that a

large majority of the Conference

did not sympathize with him.

Dr. McFerrin, of Tennessee, and

Dr. Head followed in the same line

of remarks.

The majority became clamorous

for a vote, and the vote was taken

upon the minority report, which re-

sulted in its rejection, by 65 to 103.

The majority report was adopted

by 106 to 61. It must not be sup-

posed that the minority party in the

Conference are favorable to organic

union with the Methodist Episcopal

Church. They simply hold that

there is nothing in the existing state

of affairs that should interrupt frat-

ernal relations. The number of

men in this General Conference who

favor reunion with the Methodist

Episcopal Church in any event are

extremely limited, if there are any,

but it is well understood here that

the college of bishops are a unit

against organic union.

General News.

NEW YORK, May 24.—Gonzales,

commandant at San Jose de Guatama-

la, was not mortally wounded by

shots received in endeavoring to

escape on board the Pacific Mail

steamer Arizona, after fogging the

British Consul Magre, but was to

be tried on the 28th ult., and believ-

ed would be shot. Passengers speak

save Mr. Magre.

The death of General Coxton, U.

S. Minister to Bolivia, occurred at

La Paz on the 16th inst.

The authorities of Chili have de-

ecided that the international law

gave them no right to try and im-

prison Capt. Hyde for the loss of

the English steamer Tacona. He has

been set at liberty, and returned to

England.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., May 23.—The

delegation to Galveston returned

to day. They report the complete

success of their mission. The Texas

Central gives greatly reduced rates,

and pledges itself to give rates on

grain that will compel its shipment

via Galveston. The M., K. and T.

R. R. made arrangements with the

Fort Scott road by which it uses

that track, and will hereafter be

operated from Kansas City.

OUR neighbor, the Herald, has information that Gen. McKenzie has probably again crossed the Rio Grande in pursuit of cattle thieves.

THERE is only one sort of lynch law that we could possibly excuse, and that is where it is applied to white Americans who are engaged in leading Indians in their raids upon our frontier. The supposition is that there are many of them.

YELLOW FEVER.—We should like to know what our coast cities are doing in the way of guarding against a yellow fever epidemic this summer. Six whole seasons have passed without such a visitation, except the sprinkle of it brought from Mexico or South America last summer by a show company via Shreveport. It is very likely to come this summer, unless prevented by cleanliness and quarantine. Such a visitation now would damage Texas incalculably, and carelessness is the more reprehensible from the fact that it can be permanently kept out of the State by proper preventive care. Epidemic yellow fever never originates on the coasts of the United States.

THE Austin Statesman imagines that there has been a considerable "consultation" at Austin among leading republicans lately. The men the Statesman mentions will never be "leading" in any general movement of the Republican party in this State. They have done more to break it down than all the opposition it has ever encountered. They have used it simply for their own selfish purposes heretofore, and are now justly repudiated. It will be led hereafter by the best citizens of the State, and not by a greedy pack of speculators and scoundrels Washington, as well as Austin, may take notice.

The Great St. Louis Bridge Completed.

On last Saturday, the great railroad bridge over the Mississippi river at St. Louis, perhaps the grandest structure in the world, was thrown open to the public, and 20,000 people passed over; \$5000 worth of tickets having been sold before 9 o'clock in the morning. Five hundred Presbyterian clergymen, attending the General Assembly, passed over, and held a short service in the centre of it. In their short addresses they congratulated Col. Britton and Capt. Ends, of the bridge company, and sang the Old Hundred Doxology. Rev. Cyrus Dickson, one of the speakers said:

I have thought, while we were passing over this magnificent structure of the time, one hundred and forty years ago, when the pious La Salle and Hennepin came down the Illinois river from the lakes in a bark canoe, and landed in St. Louis, then a great wilderness, with no other white men around them. And what has not God wrought in our eyes! And this is the intention of Almighty God that such rivers should be spanned, that God's people and his blessed gospel should go everywhere. When I remember that there are here men who live at the Golden Gate, on the Columbia, far away, when I think that there are representatives from Kansas, so lately the mow of the buffalo, and from Wyoming, from Utah and Minnesota, the sources of this river, I rejoice in what God has done, and what God will do in the future.

Newspaper Criticism.

Our friend on Main Plaza, in relation to our criticism says:

When we want lectures on propriety, we will choose our monitors. Ah, brethren in the kingdom and patience of journalism, what a delusion! Indulge no longer. We journalists are considered public property, fair game, and all who choose can "pitch into" us. If we wish to "choose our monitors," others will wish to choose their objects

of criticism. We cannot escape, either from the "outside barbarians," or from our own captious brethren. And then it is not best. Newspaper men are awfully presumptuous fellow, and would tyrannize over the whole world if they should unite in a close corporation. But, happily for mankind, they are too quarrelsome for that. Then, as other sinners are not allowed to "choose their monitors," no more should journalists, who are frequently the most hard-headed sinners in the world, because they know they can whip out all those who preach to them about their sins. The public journal is a great power, but it is a dangerous and responsible one.

San Antonio Newspapers.

Another auxiliary in the promotion of the prosperity of San Antonio, in view of her early connection with all other points by railway, will be the establishment of daily journals of a high order. No place has ever become a city of importance and prosperity without the aid of able daily newspapers. It is only by such agencies that a city or a section of country can be brought to the notice of the rest of the world. The city of Houston is a prominent illustration of this truth. Her newspaper energy has made her what she is,—the political centre of the State, and the railroad center. It has built all her long lines of railroad, her Direct Navigation Company, her State Fair Association, her Glenwood Cemetery Association, her various manufactories, her magnificent City Hall, theatre, and market house, her street railways, and brought her Ship Channel to the point it has now reached. Newspapers have made Houston, and have given all Texas its present teeming population, its prominence and its prospects.

San Antonio will never become a great city without the aid of powerful newspapers. No San Antonio enterprises, in the way of public improvements, and the attraction of trade and capital, will ever prosper unless she has able journals to foster them.

San Antonio will never have able and powerful journals, unless her citizens become staunch supporters of her own newspapers. This is just as necessary as to raise money for the building of railroads, the establishment of agricultural fairs, or anything else. No citizen can be called a public spirited friend of the city unless he seeks to build up our own journals.

GREAT CHURCH JUDICATORIES are now meeting, or have just met, all over the Union. The National Presbyterian General Assembly is now in session at St. Louis, the Southern Presbyterian General Assembly at Columbus, the Cumberland Presbyterian General Assembly at Springfield, Mo., the Southern Methodist General Conference at Louisville, the Southern Baptist General Convention at Jefferson, Texas, the Reformed Episcopal Convention at New York. The sectional question and that of re-union, have made most of these meetings very interesting.

THE BURNING of witches in Mexico is fully confirmed. Señor Castilla, Alcalde of Jacobe, Sisalon, officially reports to his Prefect that he tried, convicted and burned Jose Maria Bonilla, and his wife, Diega, for bewitching Sylvestre Zecarias. Another old woman and son have since been burned to satisfy the populace. Such things are similar to the frenzy that crucified Christ, that martyred the early Christians, that animated subsequent religious wars, and that now inspires all bitter political partisans. They are all alike.

THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL SCHISM.—We give the news on this subject because the denomination is so large in this country, because their separation in 1844 was the entering wedge to political secession in 1860-61, and because the question of re-union or continued division is now destined to become an exciting one throughout the country, especially in the South. On our first page will be found the final action of the Southern General Conference.

THE INSURRECTION in Cuba has been maintained for five years, and is now stronger than ever, while the Spanish rule is becoming weaker every day. Cuba will win her independence without fail.

Telegraphic.

GALVESTON, May 27.—The following report is furnished by the Galveston Cotton Exchange. Sherman—Temperature 79 degrees, wind south; weather warm and clear.

Dallas—77 degrees, wind south-east. Shreveport—71 degrees, wind north-east. Waco—78 degrees, wind north; clear. San Antonio—65 degrees, wind calm; weather cloudy; barometer fall ng. Brenham—79 degrees, wind south east; weather threatening. Houston—Weather cloudy, and raining to the south. Indianola—76 degrees, wind south-east, weather cloudy, and light rain; barometer falling. Galveston—76 degrees, wind south-east; weather cloudy, and heavy rain with a falling barometer.

MEMPHIS, May 27.—The Council has ordered the demolition of Happy Hollow. The shanties and huts will be torn down, and the premises drained.

Alderman Jack Walsh, the noted ward politician, who is also county undertaker, was convicted last year for inhumanity in burying paupers, fined \$1000 and sentenced to county jail for six months. Jack appealed to the Supreme Court, which has affirmed the decision, and he is engaged in getting signatures to an application for pardon.

Real-Admiral Schunbrick, the senior officer on the retired list, died to-day. Age 83 years.

The monument of the mother of Washington, at Fredericksburg, is to be completed.

The Republique Francaise says the visit of the Czar to England was not to see his daughter, but to negotiate with England relative to maintaining the balance of power, which feeling still finds defenders.

Vasquez, the noted robber chief and murderer, has been brought to San Francisco. He will be taken to Monterey for trial.

The Emperor of Russia has instructed Gen. Tchernomir, the famous engineer who defended Sebastopol—to visit the Mennonites, and induce them not to emigrate to America, but to remain at home. They are to be excepted from the operation of the military law of Russia.

General Cortina has been ousted from the office of Mayor of Matamoros, Mexico, by Colonel Canales, who styles himself Governor of Tamaulipas.

GALVESTON, May 29.—Clear Creek bridge damaged by flood interrupting passage of freight trains.

PARIS, May 29.—Minister of Interior has issued orders prohibiting sale of 19th Century newspaper because it is offensive to public morality.

CHARLESTON, May 29.—The three County Commissioners of Barnwell convicted of corruption have been sentenced respectively to ten years, to nine years and to thirteen months in the Penitentiary.

ELWOOD, ILL., May 29.—Fifteen firms burned. Loss \$50,000.

ST. LOUIS, May 29.—In a cyclone several houses were unroofed. Steamboats lost their chimneys.

NEW ORLEANS, May 29.—Chief State Engineer, Thompson in a letter to Gov. Kellogg, says three million cubic yards of levee are required to be built to save the State from overflow next year, that Louisiana can't pay for construction of more than one-third and suggests an appeal for national aid.

WASHINGTON, May 29.—The Committee by a strict vote discharged from further consideration Sykes vs Spencer in Alabama Senatorial contest. This confirms Spencer in his seat.

CHICAGO, May 29.—Rocheport passed for New York. No demonstrations; they escaped by swimming to an English vessel; were over four hours in water.

PROVIDENCE, May 29.—Prohibitory liquor law has passed both Houses.


