We had the pleasure this morning of meeting with Mr. W. C. Galloway, Agent of the Ohio and Mississippi railroad, between St. Louis and Cincinnati, which is part of one of the great through lines to New York. This line now runs the celebrated "Jim Fisk" sleeping cars, without change, between St. Louis and New York. Mr. Galloway is no stranger in San Antonio, having been for a long time agent at this place for the El Paso stage line with Maj. Ben. Ficklin. Mr. Galloway, of course, is here in the interest of travel over his line of road, and we wish him all success, as we do all other railroad men who come to San Antonio, for we hope soon to have this place made a railroad city, with four or five roads converging here. We wish to be brought into close rail and trade connection with all the North and West.

WHAT NEWS from the work on the extension of the Pierce railroad toward San Antonio? This is the question most frequently asked in our streets. It is understood that the road between Harwood, the present terminus, and Luling, near the San Marcos river, is nearly finished, and that the cars will be running to the latter place sometime during the present month, or at least by the first of September. As to the extension of the road further this way, all is in darkness. Col. Pierce still says that he will stop work on the road as soon as he reaches Luling, if he is compelled to comply with the Ireland Amendment and go by Seguin. On the other hand, the work on the bridge over the San Marcos is being steadily prosecuted, and as the river is four or five miles this side of Luling, it looks a little like the road would be pushed right through. Let us hope that the matter will be settled, so that the road may be speedily completed to San Antonio a distance of only fifty miles.
