LEXINGTON, Va. (AP)—Sen. Alvin W. Barkley of Kentucky, former vice president of the United States, collapsed and died yesterday on the speaker's platform at a university political gathering.

Barkley, 78, slumped to the floor after a keynote address to the meeting at Lee University in Washington and Lee University Tuesday.

NCAA Enforcing Committee Meets At New Orleans

National Collegiate Athletic Assn.'s enforcement arm, the Committee on Infractions, gives its annual report today to the groups powerful council.
Walter Byers, NCAA executive director, said A. D. Kirwan of the University of Kentucky, committee chairman, had just started his report when the first session of the three-day council meeting ended yesterday. Byers declined to say what the report contained.
Most of yesterday's session was devoted to selecting committees, approving applications for membership and interpreting rules.
The council worked out a plan for the Olympic basketball squad to practice against college opposition without violating NCAA rules. The plan is subject to the approval of whatever conferences are involved and will be in effect only for this year.
The council approved applications for allied membership from the Midwestern Athletic Assn. and the Pacific Northwest Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.
The Midwestern is made up of schools in Ohio, Louisiana, Kentucky, Missouri and Tennessee. The Pacific Northwest group has members in Idaho, Oregon and Washington.

Rheumatic Fever Gives Some Advance Warning

HEMOLYTIC streptococcus is the villain in the rheumatic fever picture.

Actually we don't know just what causes this insidious disease. But it is possible that as many as 90 per cent of rheumatic fever cases begin two or three weeks after a hemolytic streptococcal infection like a sore throat, tonsillitis, infection of the middle ear or scarlet fever.

Key to Prevention
Therein lies the key to prevention of this crippling. Prevent such an infection, or have it treated promptly, and you safeguard your youngsters.

Strept infections are most common in the wet, cold winter weather we now have in most sections of the country. So it's of the utmost importance that you now heed these suggestions.
Teach your child to avoid anyone with any kind of nose or throat trouble. Explain to him just why he must follow your advice.

You might tell mothers of his neighborhood playmates about this precaution, too, so they'll cooperate in case one of their youngsters comes down with nose or throat trouble.

Nutritious Meals
Make sure your child gets plenty of rest and good, nutritious meals.
Once your child develops a sore throat, you've got to analyze the situation quickly. A "when to call your doctor" check list has been prepared by the American Heart Association to alert you parents to the possible presence of a strep sore throat.
