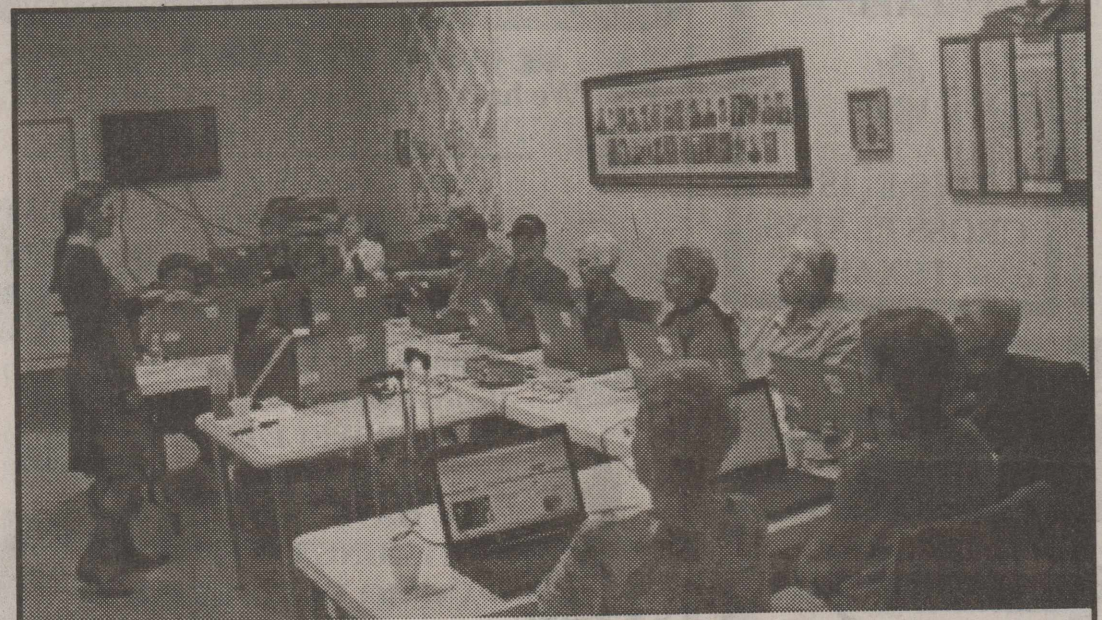

AUSTIN - Five Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) troopers and canines graduated today from an 11-week training program and will soon be stationed around the state.

They will join 35 other canine teams stationed throughout Texas, including six explosive detector teams stationed in Austin.

"The DPS canine program has achieved remarkable success in helping interdict drugs across the state of Texas. These dogs are also used to patrol the Capitol complex when needed to search for explosive devices," said DPS Director Steven McCraw. "The dogs and their handlers serve a vital role in the DPS battle against criminal elements in the state of Texas and help keep drugs off the streets and out of our neighborhoods."

The canines for the program are acquired from private individuals, shelters, rescues and the Department of

Defense. All of the canines that graduated today will be used for drug detection four Labrador Retrievers and one German Shepherd.

In 2011, DPS canine teams assisted in the seizure of approximately 60,000 pounds of marijuana, 750 pounds of cocaine, 110 pounds of heroin, 130 pounds of methamphetamine, 80 pounds of other drugs, and millions of dollars in cash.

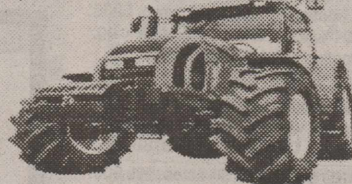

# Commissioners approve funds for renovation to Callahan County Livestock Show Barn

The Callahan County Commissioners' Court, holding a regular meeting Tuesday, November 13th at the County Courthouse in Baird, voted to contribute funds to renovate the Callahan County Junior Livestock Association show barn located in Cross Plains.

Debbie Gosnell, representing the City of Cross Plains and the Cross Plains Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors, and Franke Hyles, President of the Callahan County Junior Livestock Association, met with the commissioners' court to discuss renovation of the Callahan County Junior Livestock Association show barn in Cross Plains. A budget was presented which showed the cost being shared by all the local governmental entities.

In the letter to the commissioners' court, Hyles stated "As I'm sure you all are aware, the building is without sufficient heat to make the building even tolerable, much less comfortable. It is our hope that we can raise enough funds to install sufficient heating so that participants and observers alike will be able to come and enjoy the showing of the animals. Last year's temperatures reached such a low degree that the exhibitors were so cold that it was next to impossible to show their animals in a professional manner."

Hyles added, "We have enclosed a budget of items that we feel are necessary to make the building comfortable for all involved. We have also included some cosmetic repairs and renovations that will be paid by other donations. We are only asking that you help with the renovations that will contribute to the comfort of exhibitors and spectators. Heating and restroom facility repairs are a must. We hope that you will feel that these repairs are a much needed improvement and will contribute to this endeavor."

"We have researched the repairs and costs of such and if you can commit to your portion of these repairs, we will get started right away to have them finished in time for the stock show in January 2013," Hyles said.

"We ask that you contribute your portion of the budget. We know budgets are tight, but we ask that you contribute as much as possible. Currently, this building is only used for the annual stock show and therefore, all communities involved, Cross Plains, Baird, Clyde and Eula all will benefit from the improvements being proposed," Hyles stated in the letter.

The budget for the renovations included four heating units, wire, 300 gallon propane tank-slab, electrical repairs and labor totalling \$10,300.

The budget also included sep-

tic system work-protection fence, bathroom repairs, fence work, paint, sign for building and entry gate at \$9,200.

The total expenses amounted to \$19,500.

The association is seeking income from Cross Plains ISD in the amount of \$1,500; Baird ISD in the amount of \$1,500; City of Baird in the amount of \$1,000; Eula ISD at \$1,500; Clyde CISD at \$1,500; Callahan County in the amount of \$2,500; and Callahan County Junior Livestock Association at \$1,000. The total heating income is \$10,500.

The association will also seek \$5,000 from the City of Cross Plains, \$3,000 from the Cross Plains Economic Development Corporation, and another \$1,000 from the Callahan County Junior Livestock Association for income to pay for the septic system work, sign for the building and entry gate. The total income sought is \$19,500.

On a motion by Commissioner Cliff Kirkham and a second by Commissioner Tom Windham, the commissioners' court voted 5-0 to approve Callahan County's part in the budget for the renovation of the county show barn.

Other items brought before the commissioners' court included:

—Callahan County Judge Roger Corn called the commissioners' court meeting to order at 9:33 a.m. with Precinct #1 Commissioner Harold Hicks, Precinct #2 Commissioner Bryan Farmer, Precinct #3 Commissioner Tom Windham, and Precinct #4 Commissioner Cliff Kirkham present. Also present at the meeting were Donna Bell, County Clerk, and County Treasurer Dianne Gunter.

—The minutes of the previous commissioners' court meetings were reviewed and signed.

—Under public comment, there was none.

—Discussion was had between Sam Day and the commissioners' court over the condition of County Road 477. Mr. Day was concerned about the road holding water and being washed out by a heavy rain and that the condition of the road had been a problem for years. Commissioner Kirkham said that he would look into it and see what could be done to improve the situation. No action was taken.

—No action was taken on the Countywide Burn Ban. The Burn Ban remains lifted.

—Commissioner Farmer made a motion to proclaim November 2012 as "Home Care and Hospice Month." Commissioner Hicks seconded the motion and the motion carried with a 5-0 vote.

The proclamation follows:

2012 Home Care and Hospice Month Proclamation

Whereas, home care services provide high quality and compassionate health care services to those in need, especially at times of community or personal health care crisis; and

Whereas, home care is the most preferred method of health care delivery among disabled, elderly, and chronically ill individuals eager to live independently in their own homes as long as they possibly can; and

Whereas, home care in Texas is a growing alternative to hospitalization or other institution-based forms of health care for acute and chronic illnesses, providing care to hundreds of thousands of Texans each year; and

Whereas, hospice care provides humane and comforting support for terminally ill patients and their families, including pain control, palliative medical care, and social, emotional and spiritual services; and

Whereas, hospice fulfills basic human needs of feeling comfortable in familiar surroundings and of attaining physical and emotional peace during the last stage of life; and

Whereas, there is a need to increase public discussion about advances in pain control and the care options available to individuals of all ages, races, and backgrounds who are at the end of life; and

Whereas, the Texas Association for Home Care & Hospice, and home care and hospice providers in Texas have declared November 2012 as "Home Care and Hospice Month" with the theme of "Home Is Where The Heart Is" and are calling on all Texans to observe this occasion with appropriate ceremonies and activities;

Now, therefore, We, The Callahan County Commissioners Court do hereby proclaim November 2012 as "HOME CARE AND HOSPICE MONTH" and encourage the support and participation of all citizens in learning more about the home care and hospice philosophy of care for the elderly, disabled and the terminally ill.

**Visitors from Across the Country Visit the Howard House** — Scot and Nina Rowell of Denver, CO spent the night in town before visiting the Museum on Monday morning. Scot is a true scholar of Robert Howard's writings, having read nearly all of the books that are carried in the Museum Gift shop. As a member of the Robert E. Howard Foundation, he also has most of the books that are published by the Foundation. Another part of his Howardian collection is the set of the Wandering Star books that were published in England several years ago. They also have the "One Who Walked Alone" book and the movie, "The Whole Wide World," which portray the relationship of Howard and Novalyn Price, the young English teacher at CPHS. Like many, the Rowells feel this is just as good story to be enjoyed by everybody, not just fans of Howard. 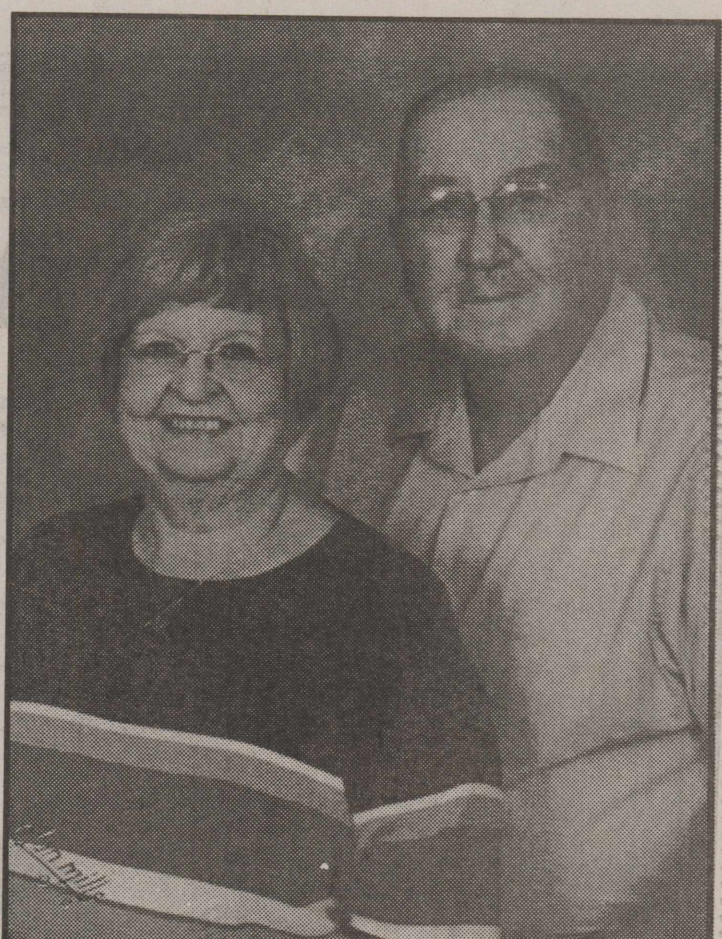
