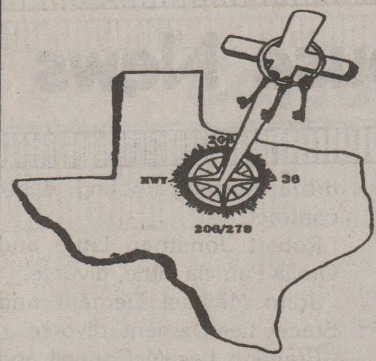

Makayla Cheyenne Cowan Named a 2013 State Farm Texas Scholar

State Farm Insurance awarded \$1,000 to Makayla Cheyenne Cowan of Cross Plains High School for being named as one of fifty State Farm Texas Scholar Award recipients for the 2012-2013 school year. She is the daughter of Michael and April Cowan of Cross Plains. Cheyenne is ranked 1st in her graduating class of 23 students. Her personal accomplishments well qualified her for this prestigious award.

For the twelfth year, the Texas Agents of State Farm Insurance are sponsoring the Texas School Award (TSA) Program which is two-tiered program. From a field of 1,528 nominations, 50 Texas Scholars were selected, each receiving a \$1,000 scholarship. All recipients were then invited to compete for an opportunity to receive one of the four larger scholarships—three awards of \$5,000 and one award in the amount of \$10,000 (awards were announced on May 1, 2013). In all, State Farm will award a total of \$75,000 in scholarships to high school seniors across the state.

Cheyenne will be recognized at the Cross Plains High School Senior Awards Ceremony on Thursday, May 23rd beginning at 1:00 p.m. at the high school auditorium.

On behalf of the Texas Agents of State Farm Agent Clint C. Coffee of Eastland will make the presentation to Cheyenne in the presence of her classmates and parents, as well as ISD and high school administrators and faculty/staff.

State Farm has made a commitment to Texas youth

through our sponsorship of UIL championship-level events in Texas. They also annually contribute \$50,000 to the UIL's Texas Interscholastic League Foundation (TILF) Scholarship Fund to reach even more young deserving Texans who aspire to attend college.

The State Farm Texas Scholar Award Program places great emphasis on academic distinction as well as leadership. Since 2001, State Farm has given \$387,000 in scholarships to Texas High School Seniors who demonstrate a commitment to excellence in the classroom, in UIL sanctioned competitions, and in their schools and communities.

The criteria for the 2013 Program were the most stringent, and the level of competition was stronger than, ever.

Some quick facts about the 50 Texas Scholars for 2013:

- * 96% rank in the top 5% of their class
- * 76% in the top 1%
- * 92% have GPA's that exceed the scale
- * 86% received National Merit honors
- * 68% scored 2000 or higher on their SATs
- * 48% are AP Scholars.

In fact, the applicant pool was so strong that in addition to the eminence of the 50 Texas Scholar Award recipients, 52% of the 250 students who were selected as Honorable Mention Scholars rank in the top 1% of their graduating class and 88% are in the top 5%. 28% received National Merit Honors, and all 250 demonstrated a diversity of involvement, leadership, and success in scholastic or athletic competitions as well as in community and church programs.

"REH in the Comics" is the

theme of the two-day event this year, as the scholars, researchers, editors, illustrators and the faithful followers explore the path that Howard's stories have blazed through the comic book industry. The day of the ten cent comic book has long faded, but the ever changing publishing formats continue to attract new readers. And the bottom line remains the same; a successful comic book has to have a dynamite script and eye catching illustrations to carry the story off the shelves, even at today's \$3.95 bar code.

Howard's stories with all their creative story lines, heroic characters and imaginary settings were ready made for the long journey through the pulps, the comics and now the graphic novels. This year's guest of honor, Tim Truman, has been a leading writer for the Dark Horse Comics for the past 7 years and knows his way around the process. He is currently scripting the massive, 12-issue adaptation of Howard's *Hour of the Dragon*; the first of which will be available just in time for Howard Days.

Several of the panel discussions held at the library throughout the event will focus on adapting Howard's stories for the comics. In addition to Truman, representatives from Paradox Entertainment and Dark Horse Comics will be on hand to visit with the masses. One panel will be a discussion of Howard as a Texas writer and another will go a different direction entirely. Rob Roehm and his father, Bob, have accumulated a massive amount of frequent flyer miles between Texas and California, as they have researched every nook and cranny that Howard lived/and/ or visited. Fittingly enough, their panel is entitled "Travels with Bob, Rob and Bob."

June 6 through 9 is going to be one big party as the Howard Days, the Barbarian Festival and the Tripoli Rocketry Association launching competition bring people to Cross Plains from far and wide. Be sure to mark your calendars so you won't miss any of the fun.

Students who have a valid driver's license on file will be allowed to sign out at 12:30 with a valid note from their parent or guardian - no phone call permissions will be granted. If student is 18 or older, no note is required, yet must have valid license and sign out appropriately. No students will be allowed to leave campus prior to 1:00 p.m. with anyone other than their parent or guardian who has followed the appropriate sign-out procedure.

Friday, May 31

Regular schedule of periods 1 thru 5A will be followed, with 5B class meeting the same time as 5A is scheduled (11:35 - 12:20). Lunch will be combined for JH & HS and held from 12:22 until 1:00 p.m.

The same procedure for signing out will be followed on this day. Students will be released at 1:00 p.m.

Semester Exam Exemption Policy

1. Applies only to students in grades 9 - 12
2. A student must have an average and meet attendance criteria as follows:
 - a. 90 or above, 3 absences
 - b. 87 or above, 2 absences
 - c. 88 or above, 1 absence
 - d. 80 or above, 0 absences
3. When above criteria are met, students may exempt:
 - 9th graders: 1 exam
 - 10th graders: 2 exams
 - 11th graders: 3 exams
 - 12th graders: 4 exams

For senior students: All exams are exempt if criteria are met in all class periods
4. A student who has been assigned to AEP, DAEP, ISS, or Out of School Suspension must take all of his/her exams
5. A student who has an "unexcused" absence must take all of his/her exams
6. College days for senior students (limit of 2 with approval of the principle) will not count against students for the purpose of exemptions
7. An exempt student will be counted present
8. Attendance portion of this policy will be based on official PEIMS attendance records
9. Grades for advanced courses will be weighed prior to determining exemptions
10. A student may choose to take the exam(s) even if he/she qualifies for an exemption
11. Every 4 (four) tardies will equal 1 unexcused absence (per class period) for the purpose of calculating absences as they affect semester exam exemptions

DPS increases patrols for Memorial Day weekend

AUSTIN - The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) will significantly increase trooper patrols this Memorial Day weekend to help keep Texas roadways safe. During the increased patrols Friday, May 24th, through Monday, May 27th, troopers will be looking for drunk drivers, speeders, seat belt violators and other traffic violators statewide.

"Memorial Day is a time of reverence and remembrance for all those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice in service to our nation," said DPS Director Steven McCraw. "DPS encourages Texans to mark the holiday responsibly by adhering to safe driving practices and by not drinking and driving. Troopers will be out in force, and are prepared to issue tickets to drivers disobeying traffic laws in an effort to keep our roadways safe."

Last year during the Memorial Day weekend, DPS troopers arrested 609 drunk drivers and issued more than 6,000 speeding citations, nearly 1,400 seat belt and child safety restraint tickets, and cited 825

drivers for driving without insurance. Additionally, troopers arrested 264 wanted fugitives and 219 suspects with felony warrants. The increased traffic enforcement also resulted in 10 drug cases and 16 stolen vehicles recovered.

Pushing The Limits At The Local Library May 23rd

The Cross Plains Public Library's fourth and final event for Pushing the Limits, a pilot project to explore ways for all of us to push the limits using science and technology, will be Thursday, May 23rd. We will meet at the Senior Citizens Center at 6:30 for a light supper and start the book discussion at 7:00. Participants have been reading the book *The Land of Painted Caves* by Jean Auel, author of the best seller *Earth's Children* series. Auel has spent more than thirty years in consultation with experts around the world, visiting numerous sites, and has done her own research for her long time love between the Neanderthal and Cro-Magnon during the Paleolithic era.

Join us, even if you have not read the book, for an interesting discussion on the subject of Knowledge. There will be a human-interest video shown that will make a great conversation also.

This four-part pilot program the library has been hosting on Nature, Survival, Connection, and Knowledge, has been funded by the National Science Foundation. The program was developed by a team of library professionals, scientist, and filmmakers. TxDOT plans intersection work at SH 36 and SH 206 in Cross Plains

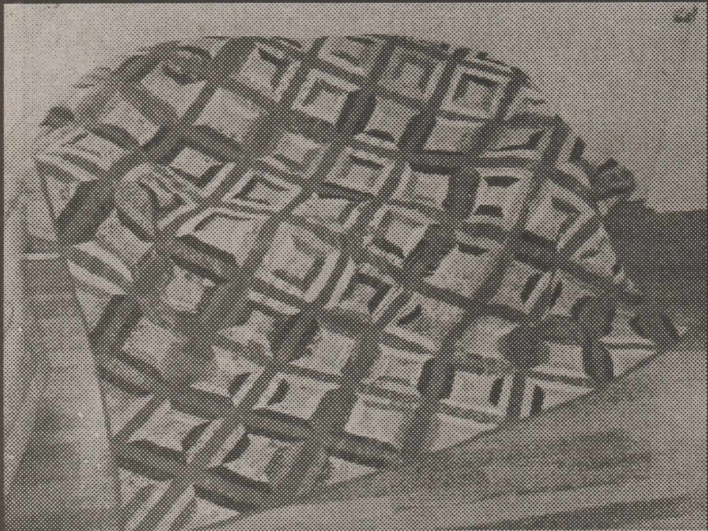
Cross Plains—The Texas Department of Transportation will begin work to replace the pavement at the intersection of SH 36 and SH 206 in Cross Plains the last week of May.

The project will replace the asphalt with concrete pavement, which will be more durable and require less maintenance.
