WASHINGTON LETTER (From our regula corresondent) Washington, Feb 24, 1890.

It is not surprising that Aguin aldo shoul have had the idea that the sovereingty of the Poilippines would be passed from Spain to the U. S. by the ratification of the treaty of peace by our Senate, sin e the same idea was held by many iuteligent peasons in Washington, neluding some who are in Congress Such is not the case. The treaty of percmust be ratified by the Spanish Cortes and copies thereof be formally exchanged by representaives of the goverments of Spain and the U. S. before it decomes reconized as a law of the world. It is not necossary, however, to wait for the formal passage of the sovereignty of islands to proced against the rabble under Aguinalbo. Gen. Otis and Admiral Dewey have ample authority under the broad law of nations to use what ever means they may deem necessry to maintain law and 1899, against said Jas. H. Smithey order, not only in Musila, but in any portion of the islands.

Nothing but good words are heard in administration and Cong ressional circles, and also, from the general public, for Gen Otis.

He has proven his soldierry qualities by giveing the Filipinos as thorough a thrashing as was ever administered to any army, practically wiping out their army, and he showed that he possessed talent in the statesmanship line when he refused to confer with Aguinaldo, who has become frightened and wants to make some sort of terms, or recopize him to any manner whatever. Everybody i. Washington feels like hurrahing for Otis' and the general public hopes that the administratation will allow him a free hand in dealing with the Filipinos. All of our officer seem to do better when the politicians do not meddle feetl honorably in all business tran-

Unsual efforts are being made to get the Hull army bill through their firm the Senate, but it begins to look as though the only army logislation that can get through will be an amendment to the army appropriation bill containing the present status of the regular army, another year from next July.

Gen. Eagan is suspended from rank and duty for six years by the President, is generall regarded as from the mercantile business justifiable punishment, Under the sentence Cen. Kagan will continue to draw the salry of a Brigadier general: -5.500-but all of the usual allowances for officers will be cut off The sentence end Gen: Kagen's aet. ve service in the army, as he will be retired, under the age limit.in January 1005.
