ten years. Be it ordained by the city council, of the city of Amarillo, Texas, as follows:

Section 1. That a right of way and franchise to al! City sect'y.

the streets, avenues, alleys and public grounds, within the corporated limits of the city of Amazillo Texas, is hereby granted to Wayne C. Fright for the construction, operation and maintenance of a telephone exchange, within said city, which francise is hereby guaranteed to the said Wayne C. Wright for a period of 10 years, subject to the provisions hereinafter named,

Section 2. As part of the consideration for this iranchise which is hereby granted to the said Wayne C Wright, the said Wayne C. is construct and main Sulferit and is hereby bound to construct and main Sulferit and of 10 years, a telephone system.
