

### BY THE OLD TIMERS

From A. M. Roberts, Long Beach,

Calif .: I remember while living in the country five miles from where our family doctor lived, and many times I have seen him on horseback, and sometimes on foot, trying to make his calls, and often times he would be as much as two or three days late in getting to our place. I have gone to the swamp, cut some slippery elm bark, brought it in and put some in a glass of water. So when the doctor came he would sit by the sickbed, cut some pieces of paper in which he would roll some quinine. This would then be put in a spoon with some slippery elm and given to the patient.

From Thurman A. Smith, Taylor, Nebr.: I remember when (1880) in the upper reaches of the North Loup river valley a frame house was rarely seen. Soddies, dugouts and log cabins were constructed and occupied almost exclusively by the pioneer homesteaders. Many were roofed with dirt and willow thatch, and the floors were of clay and the walls plastered with the same material.


HOW MANY of Jesus' teachings we would never have had, if no one had interrupted him or asked him questions! How many of his miracles would never have been done if he had refused to perform any but those he planned and scheduled himself! It is what we do "by the way" that makes up life's service, for the most part.

In Jesus' story of the Good Samaritan (no doubt an incident from real life) we are not told what were the original errands of the priest, the Levite and the Samaritan. Very likely the first two were on time for their appointments.

But the priest and the Levite missed a wonderful chance, just because the poor beaten traveler was not, so to speak, on their agenda. The Samaritan was delayed, and
