8. Be sure to criticize departed guests in the presence of your child. He will respect your integrity.
9. Never give your child a reason for the commands laid upon him. Let him guess; it's much easier.
10. Don't let him discuss his plans, problems, or pleasures with you. Be too busy so he

won't look for trust and confidence.

11. Don't consider his educational and emotional development a parental responsibility. What are schools for?
12. Don't open your home to his companions; they will muss up the place. Don't be concerned where he spends his free time.
13. Don't teach your child to be tolerant toward people who differ from him in race, creed, or color. Teaching fairness in others will train bad citizens.
14. Don't give him an allowance because he might learn to save or spend wisely. Never let him know how much the "old man" makes, he might tell the neighbors. Don't ask him to give to community needs or services. "Dig down" yourself. It's the easiest way!
15. Don't be calm and poised. Be shocked and explode when he tells you he did something wrong. Then he won't confide in you the next time.
16. Don't make a pal of him. Go alone to your sports and entertainment and let him go to his. He would only be in the way.
17. Always buy your children the most expensive games and toys because if you get something simple they might have to use their imagination, and who wants imaginative children.
18. Never let your child forget that if it wasn't for you he would not have a roof over his head. You will become a pain in the neck to your child, and he loves to hear about the many sacrifices you make for him.
19. Be sure to keep your home from becoming a center of cheer. Make it a dumping ground for your grouches. Your child will love you for your thoughtful uncheeriness.
20. Be sure to forget the promises you make to your child because he could also learn to forget the promises he makes to you later, and children have no sense of appreciation.
21. Never praise your child for his worthwhile effort because he might take advantage of your attitude and try harder to please you in the future.
22. Never give your child any affection, and never, never tell him how you love him. He will get the idea you are a softy and you wouldn't want him to get that impression.
23. If you forget all the other 22 points, never forget this one: Be a poor example yourself. "Do as I told you. It's none of your business what I do."

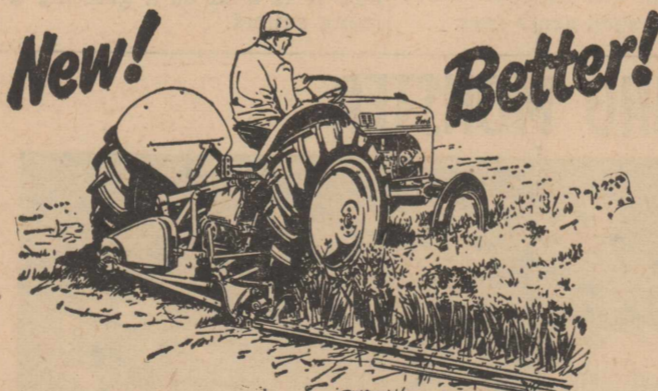

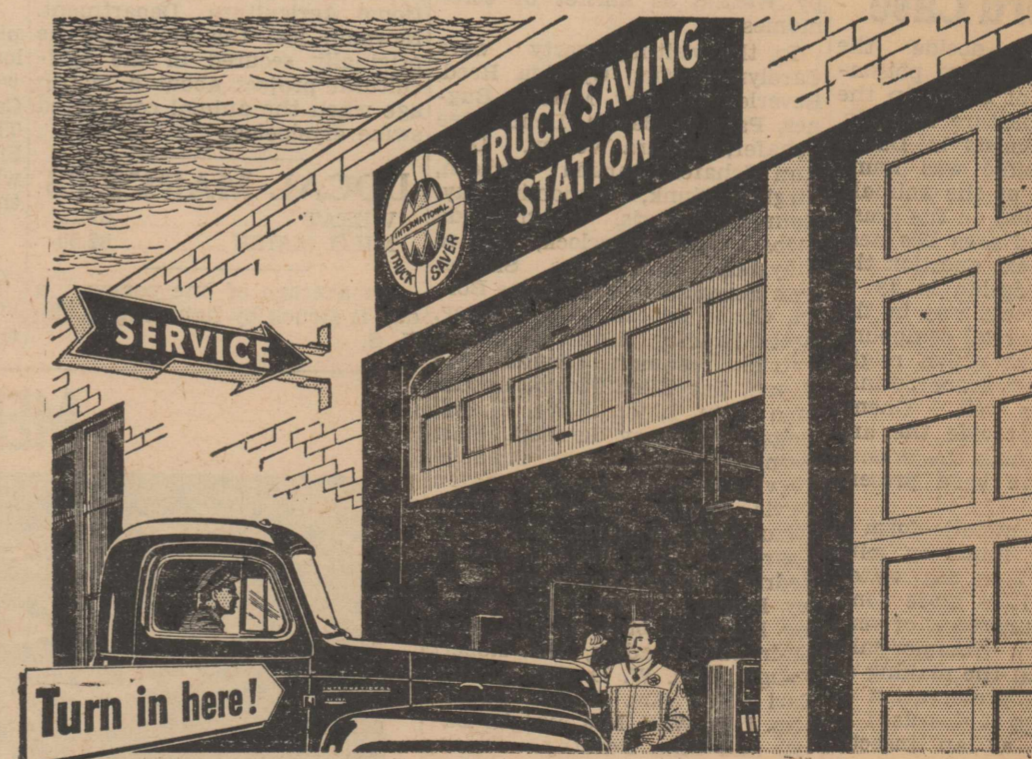

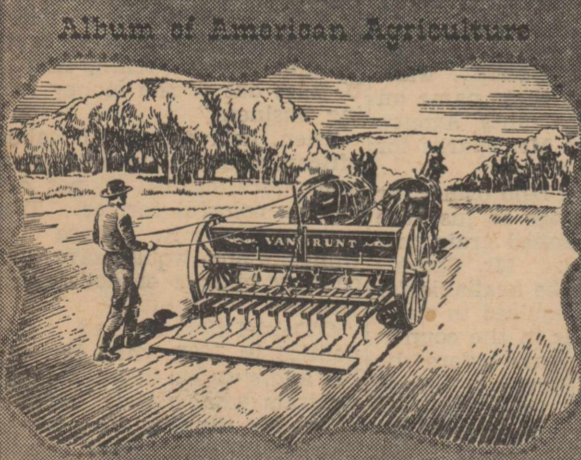

Popular Recipe
GREASY FRYING PANS and skillets can be cleaned by adding a teaspoon of soda and covering the bottom with boiling water. Boil until grease dissolves.
For grease spots on floors, cover with soda until the grease has been absorbed, then scrub with soap and as hot water as the hands can stand.
Waffle irons should not be allowed to overheat because they will become soiled in appearance even though you do not grease them first. Always wipe off food which has spilled on them as quickly as possible, and use a stiff-bristled brush on the waffle surface to remove loose crumbs.
Remove discoloration from aluminum by boiling in it some water to which is added a piece of rhubarb or tomato skins and bits of other vegetables with some vinegar.
Defrost the refrigerator quickly by removing the ice cube trays and filling them all with hot water

RECIPE OF THE WEEK
Barbecue Sauce for Chicken
(Serves 12)
½ cup salad oil
2 cloves garlic, peeled and minced
2 cups butter or substitute
2 cups vinegar
2 tablespoons worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon tabasco sauce
1 cup lemon juice
2 tablespoons mustard seed
2 tablespoons celery seed
2 tablespoons paprika
Heat salad oil, add garlic and cook 1 minute. Add all remaining ingredients and stir over low heat until well blended. Brush sauce over chickens to be broiled, after they have browned. Use remaining sauce to baste chicken while it finishes cooking.

to return to the freezing unit. Leave the refrigerator door open to hasten the defrosting.
Rinse sinks and drains free of grease at least once a week by pouring a strong salt solution in boiling water down them once a week.
Stains from wooden kitchen tables can be removed by adding a little chloride of lime to water, covering the stains with this for a short time. Scrub and rinse as usual to remove the solution.

Ricochet Deadly

Bullet is hidden by splash as it almost goes under.

Science cautions shooters against firing rifles where bullets may ricochet off water or stone, warning that such bouncing bullets lose very little of their velocity and will carry almost as far as a direct shot.

Facts to support the warning were established by scientific tests made at the nation's foremost ballistics laboratories. The tests were dramatically documented by super high-speed photographs taken at 2/1,000,000ths of a second.

The tests conducted in the interest of safe shooting by experts at the research and development labora-

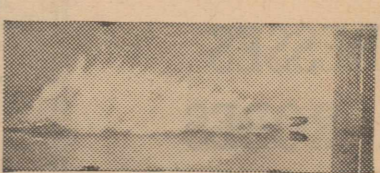


Water disturbance subsides as Super-X 22 begins to deflect.

ories of Olin Industries' Western Cartridge Company of East Alton, Illinois, show that a Super-X 22 caliber long rifle bullet has a velocity of 1,240 feet per second at 13 feet from the muzzle.

Ricocheting from water at this distance, the bullet still has a velocity, after leaving the water, of 1,195 feet per second—a loss of only 45 feet per second! And bullets will ricochet from water at angles up to 11 degrees, although they will not ricochet at 15 degrees or more, the tests disclosed.

also lost little velocity and were deformed and upset so that they would cause severe wounds.

Cubes of gelatin, backed up by blocks of wood, caught the bullets after they ricocheted, and it was noted that penetrations were almost as deep as those of bullets fired directly into the blocks. The upset bullets, which ricocheted off stone did not go so deep, but instead plowed wide channels.

Rifle experts who have warned of the danger of shooting at water or stone now have the scientific data to back up their warnings.

Praise for DU

Canada's prairies, while home to the continent's waterfowl, has an even larger stake in the democratic nations' economy. The prairies produce much of the world's wheat, rivaled only by that produced in Russia's Ukraine, and to a lesser extent, in our mid-west states. The source of all this economic wealth is inevitably tied to waterfowl, for the same ingredients—water and prairie land—are what produces both. Thus sportsmen of the United States, out to produce waterfowl for hunters, have aided the economic recovery of a nation.

Ducks Unlimited has been officially recognized and praised for the role it has played in nearly every corner where water conservation is of primary interest. The water stabilization committee of Alberta recently issued a report showing the work it has done since 1947. Recognition of DU importance in the work is illustrated by its membership on the committee, appointed by the provincial government, consisting of engineers from the government and Ducks Unlimited.

The objective of the committee is the conservation of water, the objective of DU is the conservation of waterfowl. With their objectives so closely knit, the two have provided a model of cooperation. When propagation of wild fowl is the main purpose of a project, Ducks Unlimited pays two-thirds of the cost and the Province one-third. When the major benefits accrue to the people of Alberta as a whole then the distribution of cost is reversed. On one lake where thousands of waterfowl nest, the Province provided \$140,000 of the cost as against DU's \$10,000.

Use The Reel

Although one can successfully land the average fish caught on a fly-rod by using the line, it is both smart and good insurance to use the reel when playing a really good-sized fish. When the slack is taken up, you can let the fish take line directly from the reel, which will mean that the tension is kept uniform and there is no danger of too much snubbing, as might be the case in hand-playing, and thus losing the fish.

One Out Of 8 U. S. Workers Are Farmers

Only about one working person out of eight in the United States is actually engaged in farming.

That significant fact emphasizes the necessity of a national soil and water conservation program which protects the interests of the seven non-farm workers as well as the farmer, says R. C. Buckles, chairman of the Sherman County PMA Committee.

As he explains it, "although the farmer owns the land, the other seven workers depend on this land for food and clothing just as much as the farmer does. Cities and the industries of cities can exist only because farmers can produce enough over their own needs to supply them."

This means, the chairman points out, that when a farmer carries out soil and water conservation practices on his farm under the Agricultural Conservation Program, he is doing it not only to protect his own interest in the land but he is insuring a sufficient supply of food and fiber for the seven non-farm workers and their families.

Mr. Buckles explains that when a farmer cooperates in the Agricultural Conservation Program he is in reality cooperating with these other seven workers in protecting the land upon which all depend. It is a partnership in which the farmer does the work and all of the people help pay the cost. The assistance for conservation practices under the program averages about 50 per cent of the out-of-pocket costs of practices. The farmer puts up the other half in addition to supplying the labor, transportation of materials and other costs. Much additional conservation work is encouraged and stimulated by the assistance provided by the program.

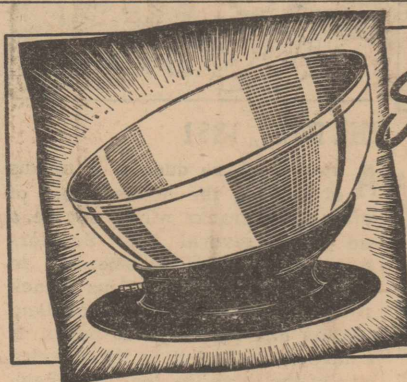

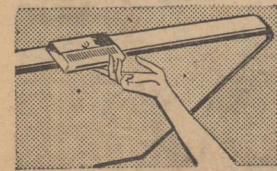
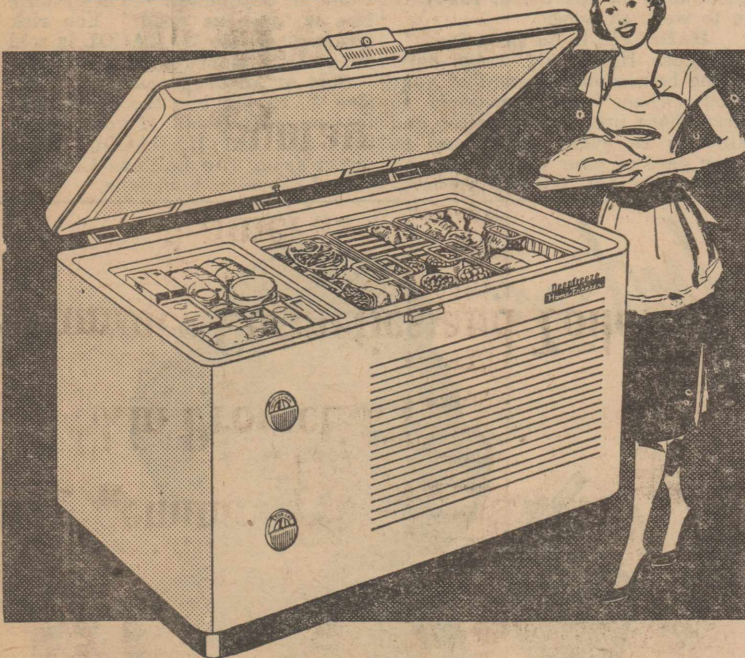
