## CJC Fall Semester Will Begin Wednesday, Aug. 29

The fall semester of the 1984-85 school year will begin Cisco Junior College as the first classes meet Wednesday, Aug. 29, after registration Monday and Tuesday, Aug. 27-28.

The outlook for a record student body was good, according to a report by Dr. Henry E. McCullough, president. A student body of some

1,200 for the Cisco campus was in prospect, and enrollment at Abilene campus was expected to be between 800 and 900. Clyde campus was expected to enroll some 500 students.

Giving impetus to the outlook was the micro-computer department in Cisco, Dr. McCullough said. The college added equip-

ment valued at some \$250,000 in updating the department during the summer months.

"We have an outstanding micro-computer laboratory," Dr. McCullough said, "and it is attracting many new students." The college is offering special incentives to members of the high school faculties of Big Country

Schools for micro-computer courses that will help them comply with new state regulations, the president added.

Preparations for the school year formally began with a general faculty meeting last Wednesday at the college. The dormitories opened Wednesday and began accepting students. Freshman orientation was held on the campus on Thursday, and the cafeteria opened the same day.

General registration was scheduled from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday and Tuesday. Registration was also set for 6 to 8 p.m. Monday.

The faculty and staff have been completed for the new semester. Added to the faculty was Dr. Jerry L. Ables, who began work Aug. 21 as a vice president for student services. He came here from Brownwood where he had been with the public schools. He holds MS and PhD degrees from East Texas State University. He will be moving his wife and two children to Cisco.

Also new to the faculty was Tianay Rabb of Cisco, who will teach office occupations. She is a graduate of Moran High School, Cisco Junior College, and Tarleton State University. She lives in Cisco with her husband, Glenn Rabb.

Mrs. Charlene Brooks of Moran also has joined the faculty to teach specialized computer courses. She lives in Moran with her husband, Jimmy Brooks, and their two children, Jim Jr., 12 and Melissa, 6.

James W. Ernest is new to the Abilene faculty to teach air conditioning maintenance. He has attended CJC, Tarleton and North Texas State and has worked at ACU as a refrigeration technician.

## Football Squad At CJC Makes Progress

Cisco Junior College's 100-plus football squad made good progress during the past week in preparation for their 11-game season that will open at Goodwell, Okla., against Panhandle State's junior varsity on Thursday, Sept. 6.

Coach Bob Keyes reported that injuries were minor and few during the two-day workout program that ended Friday. Daily workouts were planned beginning Monday.

The Wranglers were scheduled to be in Abilene and in Mertzon Saturday, Aug. 25, for scrimmage sessions. They were to meet the McMurry College junior varsity at McMurry Stadium

late Saturday and Sul Ross University's junior varsity at Mertzon.

Another scrimmage of Sept. 1 at Brownwood against Howard Payne University's junior varsity will complete preparations for the season against other teams.

## ISD Trustee Board Raises Tax Rate

A tax rate of 73 cents per \$100 valuation was set to provide budget requirements of the Cisco Public Schools during the 1984-85 school year by the board of trustees at a special meeting last Monday night. This was 20 cents per \$100 higher than last year's rate.

Supt. James Couch reported that the 73 cent tax rate would bring in \$921,744 as the school district's share of the total of \$2,381,966 budget adopted for the com-

ing year. The balance of budget requirements will be provided by state funds.

The new budget was nearly \$240,000 over the 1983-84 budget and a good part of this amount was necessitated by new salary scales set by the state legislature in a recent special session, Mr. Couch said.

The tax rate increase was necessary because school district valuations dropped from about \$162,000,000 to

some \$140,000,000 during the past year. Most of this was due to fluctuation in oil field property values, Mr. Couch said.

**Schools Enroll 917 Students**

A total of 917 students enrolled in the Cisco Public Schools as the 1984-85 school year began Monday, Aug. 20, according to Supt. James Couch. This was some 62 less than the 979 students that were enrolled on the opening day last year.

Enrollment by classes was reported as follows: kindergarten, 65; 1st grade, 91; 2nd grade, 64; 3rd grade, 86; 4th grade, 65; 5th grade, 62; 6th grade, 64; 7th grade, 73; 8th grade, 90; high school, 257.

Mr. Couch said several students have enrolled since opening day and that others are expected after Labor Day weekend.

touchdowns in the scrimmage.

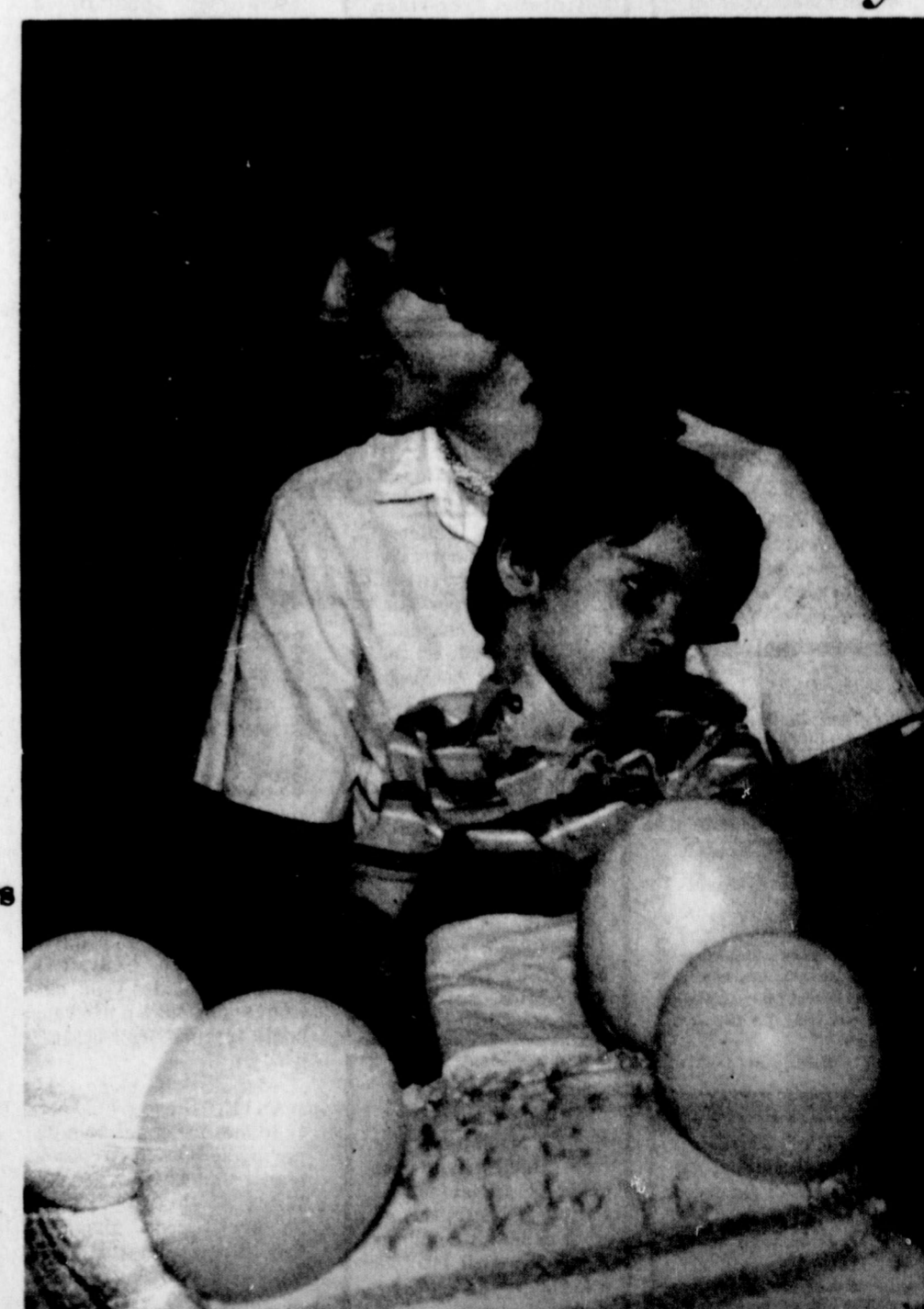

## Drilling Bits

Tri-Mor Production of Graham has filed for permit to drill the No. 6 Pugh "d", a 4,800-ft. developmental well five miles east of Breckenridge. Location is in a 20-acre lease in Stephens County's T&PRR Survey. The well is in the Moon Field.

Sun Exploration & Production Co. of Abilene has filed first production figures on two new oil wells in Stephens Regular Field. The operator has 318 acres leased, with drillsite one mile north of Breckenridge. The wells are designated as the No.s 23 & 24 Ackers-State.

The No. 23 showed potential to make 39 barrels of oil daily. Location is in the J. Neill Survey. The No. 24 well indicated ability to make 15 barrels per day. It is located in the ME&PRR Survey.

## Unemployment Spares Nobody

In an average year, about one of every five Americans is out of work, said Richard Bolles, an authority on career planning.

The author of "What Color Is Your Parachute?" recently spoke at a United Ministries in Education Conference at Texas Christian University.

"Nobody is safe from unemployment," he said. "No occupation is safe. Tenure or anything else doesn't mean a hill of beans."

Bolles said that at any given moment 40 million people in the United States are in a job transition. About 31 million of those go back to college or get some kind of education.

The career expert said that there are two types of unemployment: frictional and structural. Frictional unemployment refers to the inevitable gap there is between losing your old job and finding a new one. This is not a bid situation, he says, because your skills are needed, and there are such jobs in the market that can use those skills.

However, structural unemployment refers to those who are "dreadfully unemployed," because they lost their last job and there is nothing in sight, no matter how long they look. Auto workers and steel workers are caught in structural unemployment, he noted.

Occupational forecasters say that the next group of people that is going to be in real trouble in terms of structural unemployment is middle managers—whose primary job was to pass information along. These are the jobs that the computer is fitted to do exceedingly well, he explained.

"Much of the computer development and research now is going into what is called artificial intelligence, which means the ability of the computer to get more and more into the decision-making phase and not just into the informational conduit phase," said Bolles.

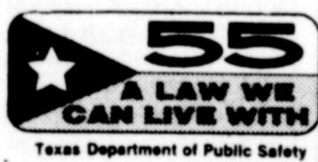

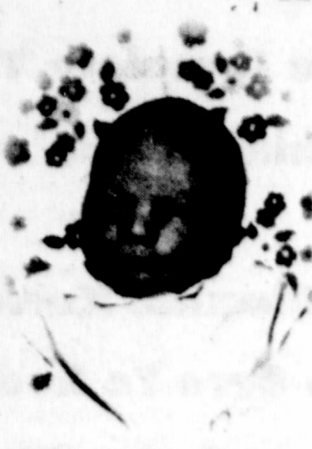

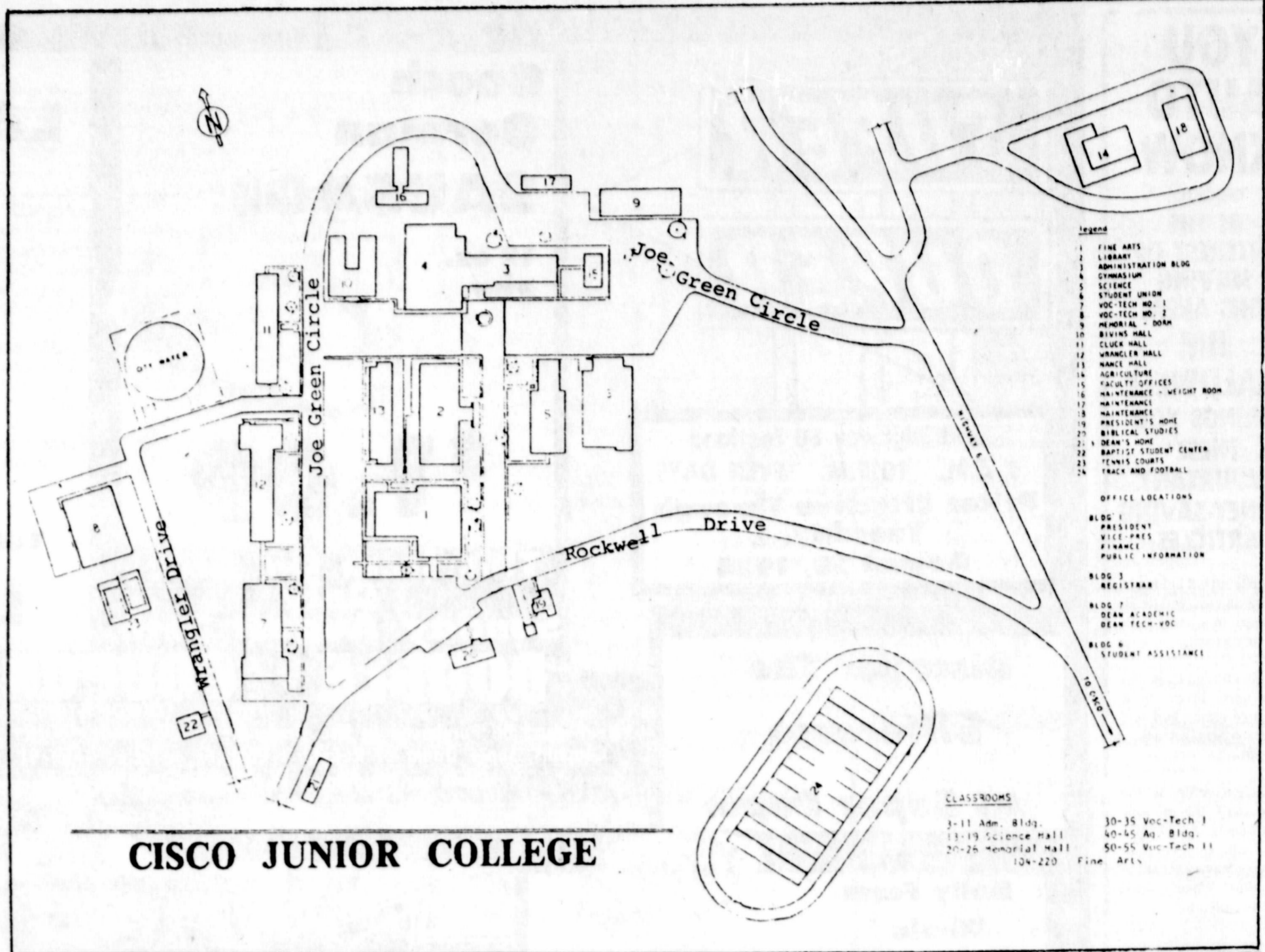

# Marathon 'Runner' Passes Thru County

We have seen some of Americas top athletes competing against other athletes in the Olympics, but a marathon runner who is competing against great distance, extreme weather, and danger from traffic, animals and people passed through Ranger, Eastland, and Cisco this past week.

Jim Letherer, a native of Michigan who has spent time in the front offices of some professional baseball teams, is running from Raleigh, North Carolina to San Diego, California.

The unusual thing about the marathon is that 'Captain Jim,' the name the 50 year old sports fan is known by, lost a leg to cancer and is running across the southern United States on crutches.

After he lost his leg, a stroke and a back injury left him partially paralyzed and in a wheel chair.

Raised in the Catholic church, Captain Jim said he realized that going to church didn't make him a Christian, so he accepted Jesus Christ as his saviour about seven years ago and that it has made all the difference.

He says that Jesus gives him the strength, hope and love which has inspired him to run this marathon.

If he completes the marathon pledged funds will be given to cancer research, but just as important to Captain Jim is to be able to say to young people who have lost a part of their bodies to cancer, "Life is not over, the Jesus that has enabled me to do this can lift you out of despair and help you to accomplish things too, if you will let him."

He seemed much more concerned about a young lady in Ranger who had also lost a leg to cancer than about the hazards of heat,

desert, and possibly rattlesnakes that may make his trip dangerous. He offered to give her a pair of crutches like he uses, but her father refused them. They were developed with shock absorbers by engineering students at North Carolina State to make their use less tiring.

While Captain Jim was still in a wheelchair, Joe Gibbs, head coach of the Washington Redskins pro football team, gave him a New Testament and told him that God would help him get out of that wheelchair.

Captain Jim says that he takes it one day or one mile at a time and depends on God to protect him and supply him needs.

At first he didn't have the van which he sleeps in and parks at his expected destination while he catches a ride back and runs to it. But after praying for one, he was approached by a man who said he didn't have any money and asked him to buy him a cup of coffee. After he bought the coffee for him, the stranger then told him that he was a millionaire and he bought him a van.

Captain Jim has gone about half way and he says, "If I can make it up Ranger Hill at 4 p.m. as hot as it was with God's help, I can make it the rest of the way."

And he left Eastland County headed west.

# Gravemarker Available to Vets Through Fed, Says Jack Mathis

Many families of veterans are not familiar with the fact that the Federal government provides a headstone or grave marker for a veteran's grave when he is buried in a private cemetery. According to Jack Mathis, Commander for V.F.W. Post 4136 Eastland, family members will choose and pay for a grave marker when one could be furnished free of charge by the Veterans Administration.

Even though last year the Veterans Administration provided more than 210,000 free grave markers for graves of veterans, many people still do not know that the VA does not pay for the installation of the marker at the grave site. The marker itself is provided free of any charge, and all shipping charges to its destination are paid by the government, but the cost of installing the marker at the grave site must be borne by the family member or members who authorized the burial. The charge for such installation is generally rather small, approximately \$50 or less.

The VA can also pay for burial allowance of \$300 if the veteran, at the time of his death, was in receipt of disability compensation or pension benefits. An additional \$150 can also be paid in most instances as plot or grave space allowance. The burial allowance and plot payment are applicable only if the veteran served during a period of wartime.

If a veteran's death is shown to have been caused by disabilities which were incurred during his or her military service, the VA can pay as much as \$1,100 toward the costs of the burial. Application for the burial allowance must be filed with the Veterans Administration region office serving the area where the veteran is buried. In most cases, the funeral directors will file the claim with the VA, and deduct from the total bill the amount that is paid by the VA.

Additional information on the VA burial allowance and the grave marker may be obtained from your local

Veterans County Service Officer. Veteran Service Officer is James Wright at the CofC.

**Article I: Name**

## Stop For School Buses

The Texas Department of Public Safety reminds all motorists, with the start of school, you will be seeing school buses on the streets and highways once again. Captain G.J. Matthews, Commander of the Texas Highway Patrol for the Abilene District, said all drivers are required to stop for school buses when the bus is stopped to load or unload school children and has its overhead red lights flashing. Captain Matthews pointed out that the law concerning stopping for a school bus applies to drivers on a city street as well as on a rural highway. He also stated that drivers must stop from either direction before passing the bus.

The only time a driver can legally pass a stopped school bus is for the red flashing lights to be turned off, the bus driver to motion a vehicle by, or for the bus to resume motion. Captain Matthews was careful to point out that in either of

these situation, a driver needs to remain alert for school students. They could still dart into the path of your vehicle, he said.

Captain Matthews said, "With the start of school, all drivers need to be extra cautious around our schools." He said, "the

children will be excited about a new school year and might not be thinking about all the safety rules in bike riding and crossing streets so it will be up to the motorists to protect them." "Drive as if you have a child attending that school," he said.

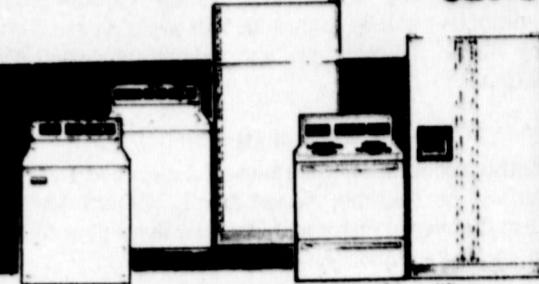

## Senior Citizens Nutrition Menu

Whatever your age, sex or level of activity, you need iron in your diet. It is vital for several body functions, particularly as a part of

hemoglobin, the pigment in red blood cells that carries oxygen throughout the body. Except for liver, few foods are rich in iron. Yet with a little planning you can get the most from what you eat.

Here is the first question. True or false food: Iron occurs in more than one form, and absorption depends on the type of iron that is eaten.

Answer: True. Iron occurs in two forms in foods. Heme iron accounts for about 40 percent of that found in animal tissues such as meat, poultry and fish. It is absorbed far more efficiently than the non-heme iron in these foods and in fruits, vegetables, grains and eggs.

Next week we will take up question number 2 in regard to the needs of iron.

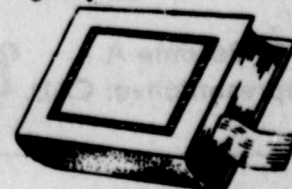

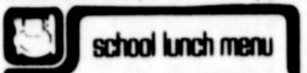
