

Cisco Youth In Jail For Kidnapping

A 17-year old Cisco youth was in Eastland County jail Friday after he was charged with aggravated kidnapping, burglary, and attempting to escape following an incident in Cisco late Wednesday

The youth, Erbey Reyes, was being held under a \$50,000 bond set by R.G. Lyerla, justice of the peace in Eastland, after his arrest here and charges being filed by District Attorney Emory Walton.

Tom Barrett, Cisco detective sergeant, reported that Reyes was accused of breaking into a Cisco home, kidnapping two brothers at gun point, and ordering them to drive him to Mexico. One of the brothers was Charles R. Boykin, Jr., 21, of 1908 Avenue H. The other

was a 14-year old youth. Officer Barrett said Reyes broke a window to enter the Boykin home. Soon after he forced the brothers into their car and started away, the older brother began scuffling with Reyes and was successful in pushing him out of his car in the 1000 block of Hilton Ave.

The brothers then drove away and reported the incident to police. Some 10 minutes later, Reyes was arrested by Officer Barrett, Sgt. Frank Thumsuden and Officer Darrell Shipman. He still had the gun, a .25 calibre automatic pistol, which was taken by policemen.

While he was handcuffed, Reyes broke and ran from police. They soon caught him and took him to the county jail. Officer Randy Haskins assisted with the chase and arrest.

Reyes had been released some two months ago from a Corpus Christi church home where he was sent by court order after he slugged a coach in an incident at Cisco High School last year, officers reported.



NEW SANCTUARY-- Calvary Baptist Church, 1801 Conrad Hilton, Cisco, held its first worship services Sunday, September 2, in their new sanctuary with 138 present. The new portion of the building, which will seat 250, was started the second week of October, 1983. Some finish work is still required and the church has future plans for extensive remodeling of the older portion of the building. Rev. Ronnie Shackelford, pastor of the church, says a dedication day will be held for the new building on Sunday, October 14, at 2 p.m. A program for the service will be announced at a later time.

Rev. Shackelford stated, "Up until now, everything is paid for in this construction. We will probably have to borrow about \$10,000 to complete the project." He explained that the majority of the work was done by men of the church and volunteers from other churches. Some of those volunteers were from the First Baptist Church in Cisco, the First Evangelical Methodist Church in Cisco, and one volunteer from Rainbow Baptist Church in Glen Rose who has been doing the electrical work. CHS Juniors Should Note PSAT Test Date

Juniors in high school who are interested in going to college after graduation should take note that the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) will be given on Tuesday October 23, 1984 at Cisco High School.

The PSAT/NMSQT is cosponsored by the College Board and the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. It is administered annually to more than one million students and measures verbal and mathematical abilities that are important in college work.

The PSAT/NMSQT gives students a chance to find out what the College Board's Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) is like and can be used to predict scores on the SAT. It also helps students in planning for college. Further, students who opt to participate in the College Board Student Search Servicee have an opportunity to hear from colleges that they might otherwise not learn about. The PSAT/NMSQT is also the qualifying test for students who wish to participate in the nationwide scholarship competitions administered by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. Students in competition for this scholarship awarded in 1986 must take the

PSAT/NMSQT in 1984. Before the test, students will receive the PSAT/NMS-QT Student Bulletin which contains a complete sample test with an answer key and scoring instructions. In December, students will receive a Report of Student Answers which displays the correct answers and the students' responses as well as scores. Schools will return test booklets at the same time so that students can review the original questions. Students will also receive "About Your PSAT/NMSQT Scores," a booklet containing information on interpreting PSAT/NMSQT results and

on general college planning. The fee for taking the 1984 PSAT/NMSQT is \$5.00 per student, to be paid at the time of registration. Fee waivers may be requested for students from lowincome families who cannot afford to pay the fee. Students may register for the test in the counselor's office before October 4th. Students requesting fee waivers must register before September 26th.

ACT and SAT Test Dates Given

High School juniors and seniors who are thinking of going to college after graduation will want to take note of the national test date schedule for the ACT Assessment Program and the Admissions Testing Program of the College Board (including the SAT and the Achievement Tests). Most colleges require that one or the other of these tests are taken for admission

Students who want to take the ACT or the SAT on the first 1984-85 national test date must have their registration materials completed and mailed before the





The October 2 starting date for many of the recent tax changes has left some people wondering why the Texas Legislature would pick such an awkward date. Why not start them on October I or even January 1?

The Legislature had little choice in the matter. The Texas Constitution says that bills cannot go into effect until 90 days after the end of the session in which they are passed. To override this rule,

Why October 2?

each house must pass the bill by a two-thirds majority.

Most of the tax increases were scheduled to take effect on October 1. But the final passage of the bill on July 3 by less than a two-thirds majority doomed the new rates to an October 2 starting date.

If the tax changes had been postponed until Janaury 1. education reforms and highway improvements would have been held up several more months.

This means quarterly sales taxpayers, for example, will include in their third quarter payments tax for items sold on October 1 figured at the old rate. Fourth quarter payments will be for items sold between October 2 and December 31.

The Legislature did, however, pass a special bill which enabled certain tax changes to become effective on August 1, whether the changes passed by a two-thirds majority or not.

State Comptroller Bob Bullock today sent checks totaling \$52.4 million in local sales tax payments to the 990 cities that levy the onepercent city sales tax.

"I don't know of a city official in Texas who doesn't lick his lips this time of the month," Bullock said.

Houston received the largest check, \$8.6 million, upping Houston's yearly total to \$107 million. Dallas' check for \$6.6 million was 27 percent over their September 1983 payment. San Antonio received \$3 million, and Austin's \$2.6 million check is 64 percent more than the city received last September.

Fort Worth's check for \$2 million is 66 percent more than the September 1983 payment. The Corpus Christi payment was \$967,000, bringing the Corpus Christi total

Bullock also sent checks to the state's four Metropolitan Transit Authorities. Houston MTA received \$9.6 million. bringing the yearly total to \$124 million. DART's check was for \$8.2 million, San Antonio's VIA check totaled \$1.5 million, and the Fort Worth Transit Authority received \$480,000.

CALFHOOD BRUCELLOSIS VACCINA-TION - AN AID TO PRO-DUCERS

After living in Eastland for 2 years I would sure get the general idea that livestock producers here like to hold on to their money.

In any agricultural iness that is a necessity

I'd like to make sure everyone realizes that brucellosis vaccination of hiefer calves is a service that is offered free of charge to any cattle producer by their local veterinarian through Texas Animal Health Commission.

Vaccination is a cornerstone in the Texas *Burcellosis Program which is aimed at eradicating this abortion causing disease from Texas. The other major element of the program is to identify and eliminate infected animals. Eastland county still has a few infected herds.

Research confirms that the currently recommended reduced dose strain 19 vaccine will protect cattle agairst brucellosis. There are iess obvious reasons for wanting your cattle vaccinated. Vaccinated cattle are worth more money and demand for vaccinated cat-

tle will increase. Vaccinated cattle can more more freely through market channels and the movement of nonvaccinated cattle will be more troublesome in the future. Many states require brucellosis vaccination as an entry regulation. This is obviously important for purebred producers but is also important to anyone with a bunch of stocker

hiefer calves. Cattle must be heifer calves 4 to 12 months of age to be eligible for vaccination. Accredited veterinarians of Texas Animal Health Commission personal are the only ones allowed to administer vaccince because of the record keeping involved. the fragile nature of vaccine, and the human health hazard involved in handling the vaccine, and calves must be properly identified when vaccinated.

Calfhood brucellosis vaccination is only one step involved in a good herd health problems.
