

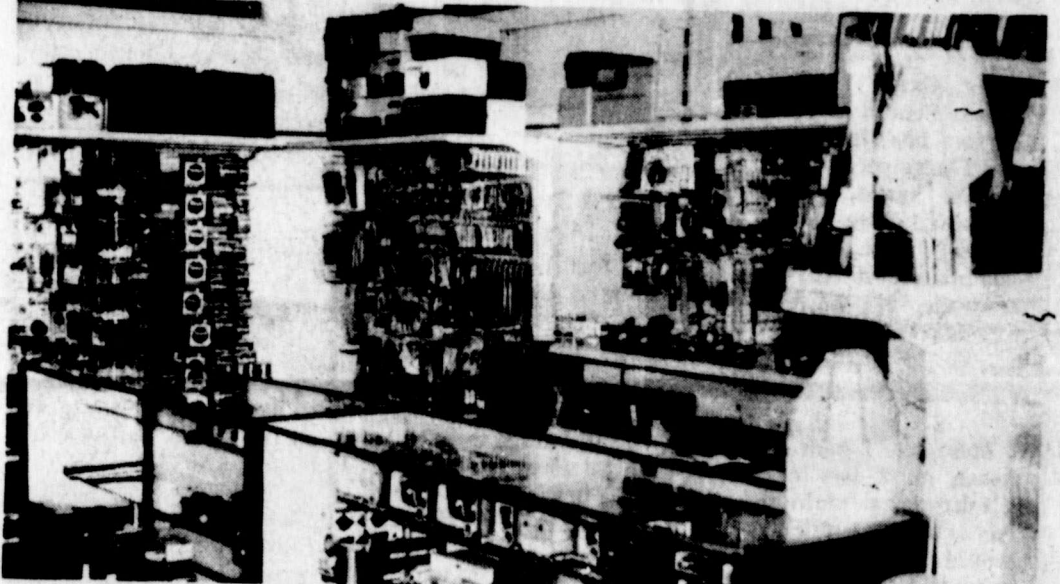
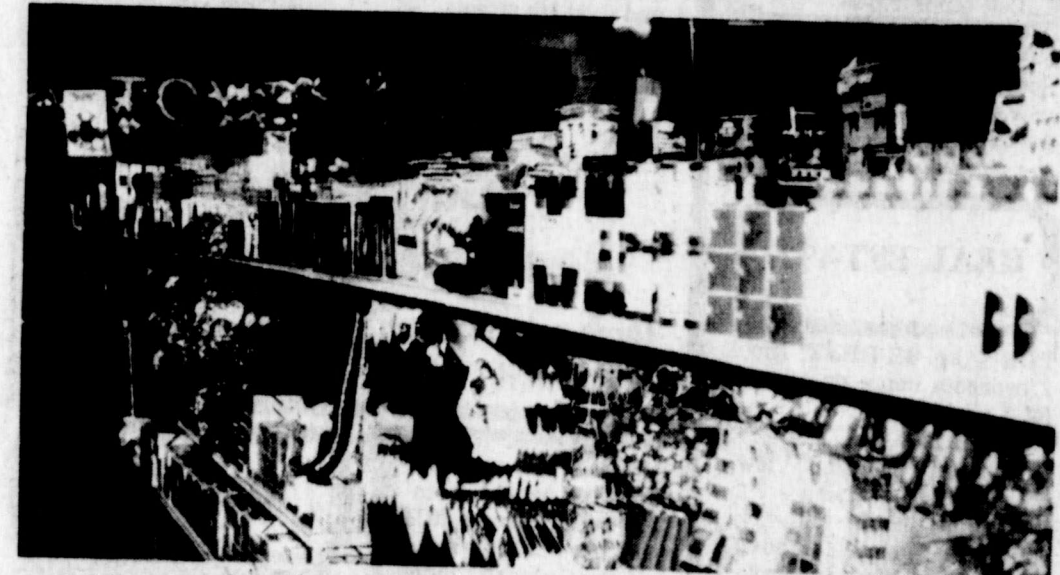

Wayne is still recovering from surgery performed at Baylor University Medical Center September 18 for rotational flap on decubitus ulcer. He had to lie on his stomach continuously for six weeks, going to therapy on a prone table.

So, he is reported to be very happy now to be able to sit up thirty minutes every two hours. He has made a lot of progress and is doing real well. He is expected to be there another four to six weeks.

## Munden Store Opens Friday

Munden Discount Center, corner of Conrad Hilton and West 10th Street, opened its doors to the public here Friday morning at 8 a.m. Plans called for the store to hold a three-day grand opening, Friday through Sunday.

The store was to be open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., Friday and Saturday during the opening, as well as from 1 to 6 p.m. on Sunday. Free popcorn and soft drinks were served during the opening.

Regular store hours, after the grand opening, will be 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and 1 to 6 p.m. on Sundays.

A ribbon-cutting ceremony was held at the store Friday morning and Munden general manager Bob Williams of Abilene was present for the event. Mr. Williams said Cisco is the first town where they have opened a store and have not heard any negative comments from the citizens.

Local store manager is Stuart McCoy. Originally from Ballinger, McCoy came to Cisco from Abilene where he was employed by Munden. McCoy has been with Munden about two months, but he had previously worked for the company for two years.

Headquartered in Abilene, Munden also has stores in Coleman and Clyde.

Health and beauty aids, as well as sporting goods and automotive supplies are expected to be some of the better selling departments, according to McCoy.

The local store has four full-time employees and one part-time.

"October the 13th, I was in hospital as emergency for one week and one day. I am

due to go back for surgery December 1, 1984. So, as you can see, our problems have not been a few. But, we are still hoping God is there to help. We know the Lord will never leave us alone.

"At present time, if we pay rent we don't eat. And, if we go buy food, we don't pay rent. We are behind all payments. But, like I say the Lord will provide."

Another request states, "I'm a single parent and the sole support of myself and son. I do not get any outside help like child support, welfare, food stamps, or whatever. It's hard to have any extra money at Christmas time. Whatever you help me with would be deeply appreciated."

A 73-year-old widow in Cisco writes, "I live alone and only receive a small Social Security check monthly. Have been under a doctor's care for the past year and am not able to work."

A single parent with two children states, "I have been out of work for nearly two months and as yet have not found employment. I have two school children and am the sole provider for our family. We are having a struggle right now just getting by."

Seventeen applications had been received by the Goodfellows of Cisco by Friday of last week from local families requesting a food basket for Christmas. The deadline for requests is December 10.

Letters of request for help from any family in Cisco are invited for review by the Goodfellows Board of Directors. The letters of request must be accompanied by an official Goodfellows application which may be picked up at the Cisco Chamber of Commerce office, 619 Conrad Hilton Avenue.

All letters seeking aid should contain the complete address of the person requesting help and the telephone number, if the family has a telephone. Letters should be mailed to: Goodfellows of Cisco, Box 1072, Cisco, Texas 76437. All requests for aid must also include one of the application forms.

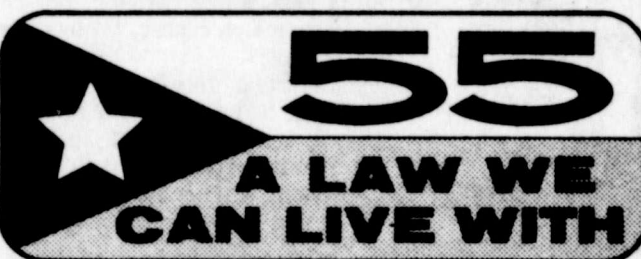

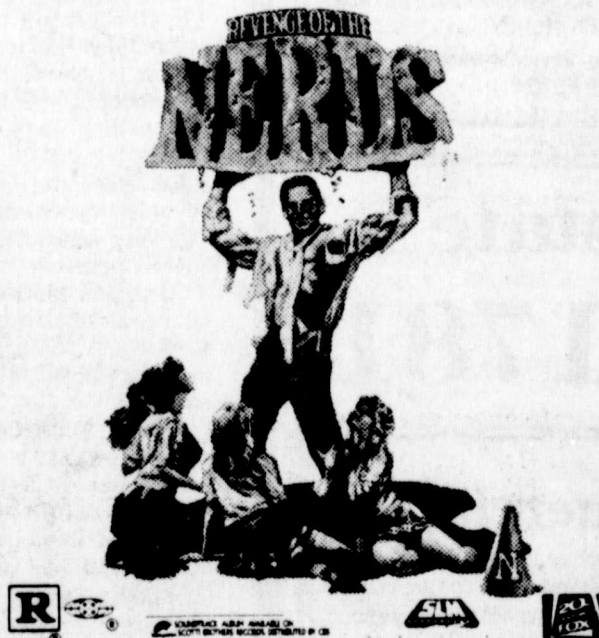

## Gordon Spot County Extension Agent

Fall is often the time when fruit tree care is forgotten or neglected, but it's critical time for controlling many peach and plum tree diseases to insure a good crop next year.

With the arrival of fall, there's often a tendency to forget our peach and plum that attach peach and plum trees in Texas. These are peach leaf curl, bacterial leaf spot and bacterial canker.

Puckered and distorted peach tree leaves that were either bright red or light green in diseased areas last spring were due to peach leaf with a copper-

containing fungicide such as Kocide 101 or Kocide 404.

Timing of the fall spray is critical for effective control and for avoiding tree damage. Copper is a severe and may cause metal defoliation unless applied correctly.

Spray when 70 percent of the leaves fall off the tree. Spraying too early will cause leaf shed or cause the spray to be ineffective later.

Bacterial leaf spot affects both fruit and foliage. The infection causes fruit to crack and leaves develop angular spots which drop out. Bacterial canker will kill trees slowly. Infected trees

will have gum or wax forming on the trunk and main limbs.

Fall spray is most often applied from Nov. 1 to Dec. 1 in Eastland County. Application time will vary with the season, so check your fruit trees closely.

Fall spraying is important to the health and production of fruit trees, because there's no other time when 50 percent of peach and plum trees diseases can be controlled with one spray.

The Texas Agricultural Extension Service is cooperating with the Internal Revenue Service in offering 38 Tax Practitioner Workshops across the state. The nearest workshop to our area is located at Stephenville on November 19 and 20th. These two-day workshops are specifically designed for tax practitioners who work extensively with farmers and ranchers.

Topics to be covered in the general workshops are: What's New (including the Tax Reform Act of 1984); Alternative Minimum Tax and Social Security Planning; Subchapter S Corporation; Financial Distress-Tax Considerations; and Retirement Plan Problems-IRAs, HR-10s.

This year 13 advanced programs will be offered in ma-

Mr. Moore is no stranger to horses of the real kind, having grown up on a farm near Putnam.

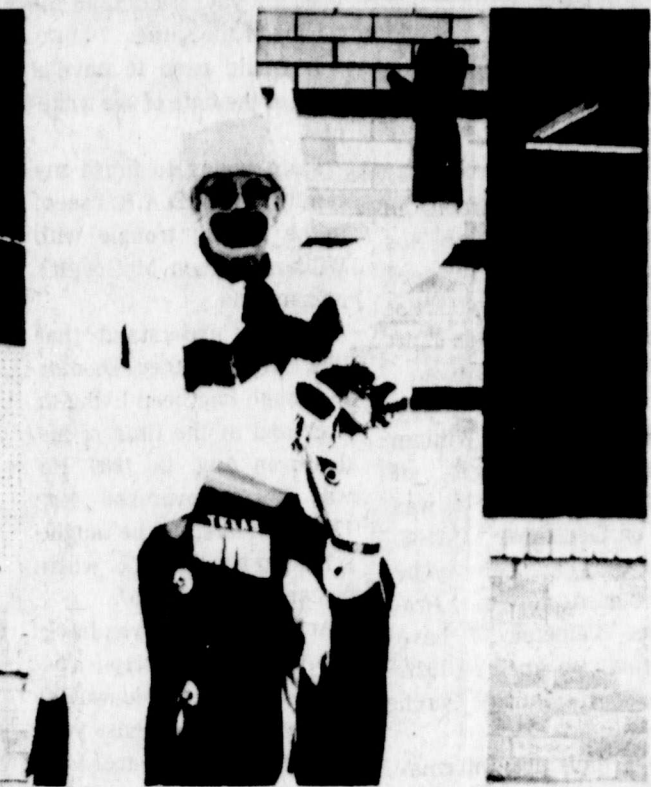
"I used to ride horses to go courting," he chuckles.

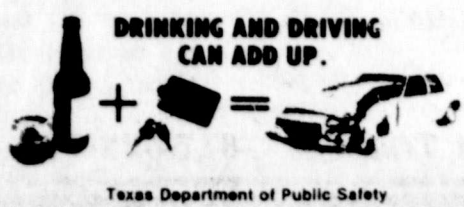

It would need to have a copy of the date of the write-up.

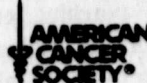
I am trying to finish my family line for D.A.R. I seem to be having trouble with William Carson McGough's information.

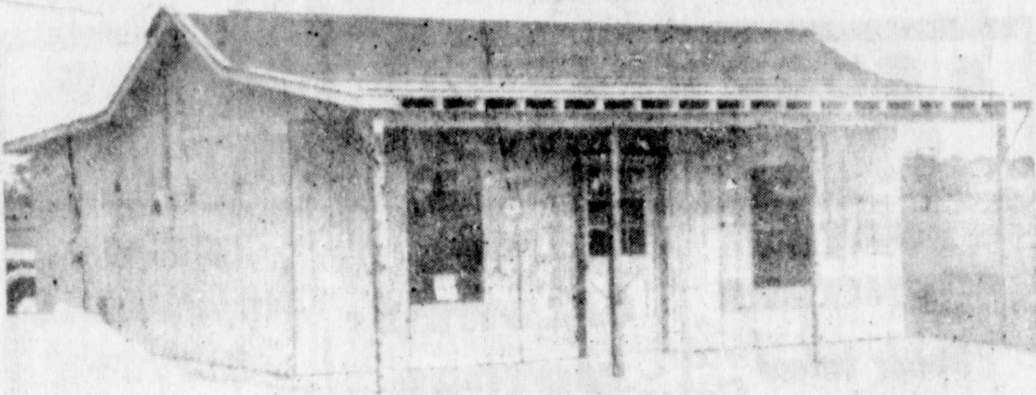

## Cisco City Council Holds Executive Session Tuesday

The Cisco City Council met in executive session here Tuesday night with members of Westbound Water Supply Corporation in continued efforts to reach some agreement on a contract with Westbound. Following the executive session, the Council approved the renewal and extension of a street grading contract with United Energex for six months. They also approved, on the first reading, an amendment to the City's Cablevision franchise increasing the monthly service charge for basic service. The new rates will not go into effect until expected improvements have been made to the local cable. An amendment to the city's junked automobile storage ordinance was approved by the council. The

city will begin addressing the problem of junked automobiles on public and private property and taking steps to have the problem areas cleaned up. An article will appear in next Thursday's edition of The Press to further clarify this new amendment. The Council agreed to open bids for the water Distribution System, which is the third phase of the city's water improvements. Bids will be opened on December 20 and hopefully will be awarded on January 8. The City is proceeding on its own with the construction of a new wastewater treatment facility, after being informed that it has no chance of receiving a construction grant from the Environmental Protection Agency. However, City Manager

Mike Moore said the City is pursuing a loan from the Farmers Home Administration which would have a 7 1/2 percent interest rate. The discussion of the Battle Creek pumping station was tabled and the discussion of establishing an "over-65 tax exemption" on homestead residences was also tabled, in order to give the city manager time to study the matter. It will be discussed at the January 22 meeting. A request from Intermediate School to close the 1100 block of Avenue H to through traffic on weekdays from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. was approved by the Council. Also approved was a decision to hold the November 27 meeting at the Chamber of Commerce to accommodate Henry Schaefer of Cisco.

## Reich Descendants Meet Here Nov. 11

Descendants of the late Mr. & Mrs. Adolph Reich met at Redeemer Lutheran Parrish Hall on Sunday, November 11, to observe the 100th anniversary of their family's immigration from Germany to the Lutheran community south of Cisco. Following the noon meal, Ted Herzog of Hamilton conducted a devotion of thanksgiving based on Genesis 32:10: "I am not worthy of the least of all the mercies, and of all the truth, which thou hast shewed unto thy servant; for with my staff I passed over this Jordan; and now I am become two bands." Under the direction of Edward Reich of Sweetwater, the group shared memories of its early founding in this area. Mr. & Mrs. Adolph Reich and their oldest son Charles came from Baranvo, Germany, to the Cisco area on November 4, 1884. Here they purchased land and raised to maturity thirteen children. They became charter members of Christ Lutheran Church, a rural church 7 miles south of Cisco, which amalgamated in 1965 with Grace Lutheran Church to become the present Redeemer Lutheran of Cisco.

Through frugality, diligence, and the blessing of Almighty God, Mr. & Mrs. Reich carved a heritage from the land for their thirteen children. During the drought of 1888 Mr. Reich walked the five miles to Cisco to work for the Texas & Pacific Railroad, earning a daily wage of \$1.00. At the time of Mr. Reich's death in 1937, he left a widow, eleven children (two had preceded him in death), 40 grandchildren, and 4 great grandchildren. Two of Adolph Reich's children are living today: Mrs. Alma Jost of Copperas Cove, Texas, and Theodore Reich, a longtime resident of Cisco presently living with

his son Edward in Sweetwater.

# Oil Belt News

## Drilling Bits

Eastland County gained a new producer when the No. 1 Norman Murdock was finalized by Don H. Hanvey Oil Interest.

Located one mile northwest of Cisco, the wildcat well flowed 2,730,000 CF gas per day on open choke.

The operation is in the C.G. Stephens Survey, A-979. It was taken to a total depth of 4,159 feet and will produce from a set of perforations in the Duffer Formation at 3,857 to 3,864 feet.

First production data have been filed for the No. 1 Schaefer, a new producer in the Schleuter-Matney Field, three miles southwest of Cisco, Eastland County.

With Katlaco Operating Co. as the operator, the well indicated it can pump 120 barrels of 46-gravity oil and one barrel of water in 24 hours.

The operator bottomed the well at 4,350 feet total drilling depth. Production will be from a perforated interval in the Mississippian Formation, 3,941 to 3,970 feet into the hole.

Drillsite was in the H&TC Survey, A-1373.

A 1,400-ft. developmental well is planned by Fishtail Trading Co. of Granbury at a location one mile east of Mangum, Eastland County. The well will be spudded in an 80-acre lease in the H&TC Survey, A-938, in the Eastland Regular Field. The well will be known as the No. 1 McCain.

Abilene-based HLM Oil Co. has filed for permit to drill the No. 1 H.L. Mauldin in the Scranton Field, Eastland County, two miles north of Scranton. With total depth projected to 1,800 feet, the well's location is in a 320-acre lease in the H&TC Survey, A-192.

An unsuccessful developmental well has been written off as a dry hole in Eastland County, one mile southwest of Bothan. The well probed to a dry bottom at 381 feet total depth. Bennett Operating Co. was the operator. The well had been designated as the No. 6 Isenhower Estate in the Eastland Regular Field.

Dyna Crop. Investments, Inc. has suspended operations in the Eastland Regular Field, two miles northeast of Carbon. The well was drilled to a total depth of 2,000 feet. It had been designated as the No. 1 Slater-Stokes "B".

First production figures for a total of seven new oilers

in Eastland County's Madewell Field have been posted by Pend Oreille Oil & Gas Co. The wells initial pumping potential are: the No. 26 C.W. Stroebel, 27 BOPD and four barrels water; the No. 27 C.W. Stroebel, 16 BOPD and 28 barrels water; the No. 28 C.W. Stroebel, 31 BOPD and six barrels water; and the No. 29 C.W. Stroebel, 18 BOPD and 36 barrels water; the No. 30 C.W. Stroebel, 29 BOPD and 11 barrels water; the No. 36 C.W. Stroebel, 12 BOPD and four barrels water; and the No. 37 C.W. Stroebel, 16 BOPD with 12 barrels water. Oil tested at 39-gravity.

Production intervals ranged from 1,344 to 1,369 feet into the wellbore, all in the Cross Cut Formation.

The wells are located in the H&TC Survey, one mile northwest of Nimrod.

Northridge Corp. has abandoned and undrilled location in Eastland County's REB Field, four miles north of Eastland. The well had been designated as the No. 1 R.O. Morton.

The operations are in a 195-acre lease in the H&TC Survey, A-2042 and a 167-acre lease in the H&TC Survey, A-1434, respectively.

Two 1,150-ft. developmen-

tal wells are planned by Taurus Energy Development Co. of Euleus at a location two miles northwest of Rising Star, in the Waldrop Field, Eastland County. The wells will be spudded in a 20-acre lease in the ETRR Survey, A-89 and will be known as the No. 6 R.A. Sone and th No. 7 R.A. Sone.

Pumping 35 barrels of 41-gravity oil and 204 barrels of water in 24 hours, the No. 1 Whiteside has been brought on line in Eastland County by Proco Operating Co. Inc. Location of the wildcat well is in the Joseph Rubarth Survey, A-417, nine miles south of Carbon.

The operator took the hole to a 3,397-ft. bottom and perforated the Caddo Formation for production at 2,388 to 2,404 feet into the wellbore.

An undrilled location has been abandoned by Ray Energy Corp. in Eastland County. The wildcat was to have been spudded five miles southeast of Eastland. It was designed as the No. 2 Blackwell "B".

SRG Oil Co. has given up on its efforts to make a producer out of the No. 9 Holt. It

was a developmental try in Eastland County, six miles southeast of Eastland in the Dead Horse Creek Field. It bottomed at 845 feet without production prospects. It will be plugged and abandoned.

At a location three miles north of Eastland, Snow Oil Co. has completed the No. 2 Williamson in Eastland County's REB Field.

The well pumped 26 barrels of 40-gravity oil and 22 barrels of water per day.

With drillsite in the H&TC Survey, A-300, the well was drilled to 3,890 feet total depth. It will produce from a set of perforations in the Marble Falls Formation, 3,436 to 3,474 feet into the wellbore.

Sun Exploration & Production Co. has finalized a new producer in Eastland County's Ranger Field, pumping 24 barrels of 38.5-gravity oil and 86 barrels water per day. Drillsite was in the Matt Finch Survey, A-134, four miles southwest of Ranger.

The well is designated as the no. 2201 Southwest Ranger Unit. Sun took the hole to a 3,451-ft. bottom and perforated the Marble Falls Formation for production at 3,261 to 3,283 feet.

Operating out of Weatherford, Thomas Hydrocarbons has driven stake for the No. 1 Yates, a wildcat try in Palo

Pinto County, five miles southeast of Pickwick. With projected total depth of 4,700 feet, the venture is in a 415-acre lease in the BBB&C Survey.

Other rushers were as follows: Danny Kearney, 47 carries for 213 yards, averaging 4.5 yards per carry; Steve Abbott, 33 carries for 125 yards, averaging 3.8 yards per carry; Wade Shackelford, 61 carries for 73 yards, averaging 1.2 yards per carry; Patrick Qualls, 2 carries for 13 yards, averaging 6.5 yards per carry; Shelby Nixon, 2 carries for 11 yards, averaging 5.5 yards per carry; and John Gonzales, 2 carries for 7 yards, averaging 3.5 yards per carry.

Wade Shackelford led in passing with 48 completions out of 124 attempts for 863 yards. He averaged 18 yards a throw during the season. John Gonzales completed 3 out of 3 attempts for 27 yards, averaging 9 yards per pass.

Receiving leaders were Patrick Qualls with 13 receptions for 356 yards, averaging 27.4 yards per reception; Steve Abbott with 10 receptions for 157 yards, averaging 15.7 yards per reception; and Johnny Ramirez with 11 receptions for 115 yards, averaging 10.5 yards per reception.

Other receivers were Eric Zarate, 5 receptions for 77 yards, averaging 15.4 yards per reception; Josh Potter, 3 receptions for 50 yards, averaging 16.7 yards; Danny Kearney, 1 reception for 45 yards, averaging 45 yards; Shelby Nixon, 2 receptions for 35 yards, averaging 17.5 yards; Mike Wester, 4 receptions for 30 yards, averaging 7.5 yards and James Berry, 2 receptions for 25 yards, averaging 12.5 yards.

## Hiring Of Emergency Dispatcher Eastland's Response To Workload

Board members supervising the Eastland County emergency dispatch approved the hiring of a part-time temporary dispatcher to help alleviate the workload during peak periods.

Chief dispatcher Bob Mercer discussed with board members the "heavy workload" a dispatcher experiences without breaks during an eight-hour shift and the lack of understanding by the public and some police officers when dispatch requests are not filled immediately.

Police traffic towns, emergency ambulance calls plus after-hours answering service for several companies are handled by one dispatcher.

Board members have the option of making the part-time dispatcher position a

permanent position. Board members asked

Department of Public Safety Sergeant Jerry Matthews, who was a guest at the meeting, to meet with police department heads in county towns and explain problems the dispatchers have and

enlist each officer's patience and courtesy.

Cecil Funderburg, Gorman police chief, suggested salaries and expenses of the dispatch be underwritten by the county.

### legal notices ..

**ORDINANCE NO. 0-84-16 AN AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 394 PROHIBITING THE MAINTAINING OR STORING OF JUNKED OR WRECKED AUTOMOBILES IN THE CITY OF CISCO REVISING THE FENCING AND SCREENING REQUIREMENTS; INCREASING THE FINE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**  
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS THAT: SECTION II, SECTION IV, SECTION V AND SECTION VI of the City of Cisco's ordinance prohibiting the maintaining or storing of junked or wrecked vehicles in the City of Cisco be amended to read as follows:  
SECTION II: The City Council defines the term "junked or wrecked automobiles or other vehicles" as used in this ordinance to mean and include any vehicle located within the city limits of the City of Cisco, whether on public or

private property, which has not been issued a current license plate by the State of Texas and which does not have a current inspection sticker as required by the laws of the State of Texas. Exceptions to provisions of this ordinance shall be the antique or special interest vehicle as defined in Article V of Texas Motor Vehicle Laws, if said antique or special interest vehicle is maintained in an outdoor storage area in a manner so it does not constitute a health hazard and is properly screened from ordinary public view.  
SECTION IV: Should any person, firm, partnership, or corporation desire to store or retain any such junked or wrecked vehicle, it shall be lawful for said person, firm, partnership or corporation to do so only if the same is completely fenced, on private lands, on all sides by an adequate and appropriate fence of at least six (6) feet in height; and that the same is shielded from public view along all streets, avenues and other major public thoroughfares, on private lands, by a solid screening fence, of appropriate fencing material, at least six (6) feet in height.  
SECTION V: The owner or person in possession of any junked or wrecked vehicle located in part or wholly on any public street, alley, or other public or private property within the city limits, shall have ten days after notification by registered mail by the City of Cisco to remove from such property any such vehicles. Should such owner or person in possession fail to do so within the ten day period, then the City of Cisco or its agents shall have the right to remove any such vehicle and dispose or sell the same and apply the proceeds of such sale to the cost of removal and storage.  
SECTION VI: Any person, firm, partnership, or corporation that violates any provision of this ordinance or fails to comply with any such provisions shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$200.00.
