The mission and motto of the Anderson Network is to be a PATIENT TO A PATIENT AND A FRIEND TO A FRIEND.

They do this by providing support and understanding, answering questions and walking down that path with a cancer patient as they journey into the very real challenges of cancer diagnosis, treatment and the maze of a large institution.

On Saturday, June 2, 1990 the Anderson Network is hosting a Network Patient Conference for all former and current M.D. Anderson patients, family members and friends.

It will be a day long event where patients and family members can become informed on cancer site information, participate in sessions on coping skills, learn of ways to deal with insurability and employability concerns which are relevant to the cancer patient, be alerted to resources in the community and within M.D. Anderson and just generally share in a day of social interaction and refreshment with others who truly understand the cancer experience. M.D. Anderson physicians, staff and Networkers will be presenters at this unique and very special event and it promises to be a day filled with information and support.

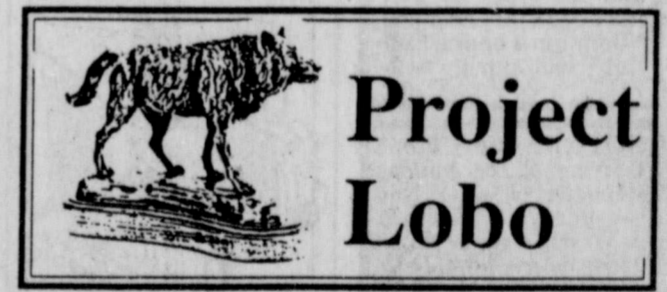

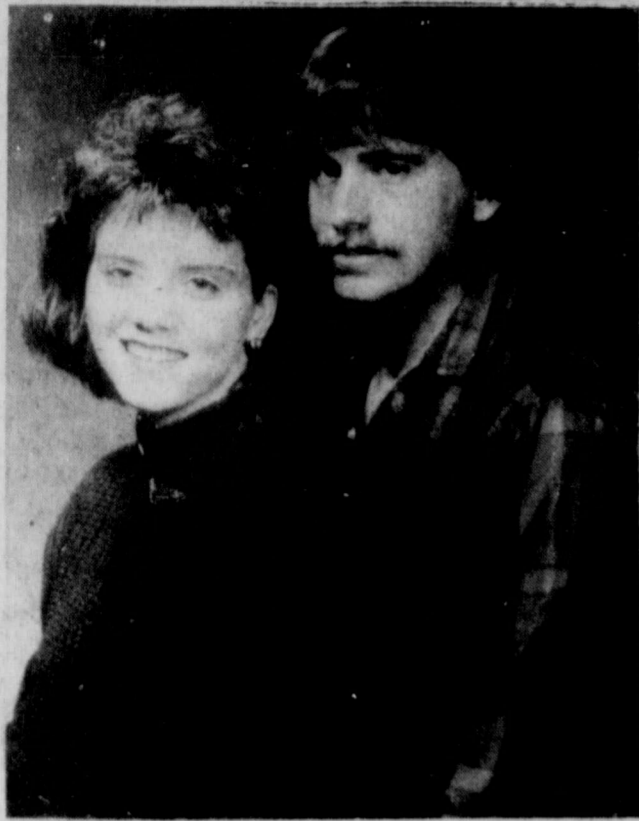

**Carbon News**

Sunday was a beautiful day, for all mothers to be honored on their special day.

Each year in the Sunday morning services at the Baptist church a special recognition is given to the oldest mother and the youngest. Crickett Walker was given a beautiful corsage for being the eldest and Shirley Anderson received a beautiful corsage for being the youngest. Some mothers had their married children and grand children at church with them, Elizabeth Sandlin had her daughter, Kathy, and family of Fredicksbury; with Mrs. Hazel Campbell were her daughter, Collene of Nimrod; and Addie Walker and daughter, Sallie, and son Collin of Burkett.

Myrtle Higgins and I were treated with a nice mothers day lunch in Abilene with my daughter, Lavoda and family. I guess you could say I had two mothers day lunches. Dale, my son, carried me out to eat Friday night, he also spent the night with me.

Most all tractors have been running in high gear. Some farmers are having to turn on wet places. Several farmers have taken turns pulling each other out of boggy places, the top looks dry but then the bottom falls.

So many people are sad, the school has been a part of Carbon since before the turn of the century. The present building, the main structure was built in 1915, or that is the date on the corner stone. In 1942-43 the building was made larger. I have not been able to find out when the 1st class graduated, some say 1910 or 1912.

I can take you to the room and show the spot where I first set at a desk in Carbon School. I was a scared little blonde headed girl, 6 years old. I went to school at Carbon until 1943 when my par-

ents moved away. We moved back to the Carbon area in 1949, so I started and finished at Carbon, with a few years in between else where. ## Murderers Being Considered For Paroles Release

When the men convicted of murdering Mrs. Johnnie Wilson of Rising Star and ten year old Tona Worthington of Abilene were sent to T.D.C., some Eastland Countians, and Abilenians, breathed a sigh of relief, thinking that they would no longer be a threat to society.

But that sense of security was recently shattered when it was learned that both were being considered for paroles. Rising Star residents have signed petitions asking that Jimmy Ervin Christian, convicted of murdering Mrs. Johnnie Wilson, not be paroled. More than six hundred people, more than half the cities population, signed the petition.

Also considered a threat by countians is James Duke Creel, who was convicted of kidnapping elementary student Tona Worthington, raping her, savagely killing her, and stuffing her body in a covert in northwest Abilene. Creel was tried in Eastland on a change of venue, and the trial took three weeks.

At the top of each letter inside the envelope, you should write: Reference - Jimmy Ervin Christian, Inmate no. 242992, or Reference - James Duke Creel, Inmate no. 232292.

A letter at present might influence officials in reference Christian while a letter closer to the first of the year might be better in reference to Creel.
