

Tom Brown Challenged By 'Little Shop Of Horrors'

SHOP OF HORRORS about six years ago, I knew someday I had to direct it. It's a funny play and a challenge to director and designer."

"When I saw LITTLE

Tom Brown thus states his reasons for deciding to take on both demanding jobs in the first summer dinner theatre opening at the Hilton Dinner Theatre in Cisco.

"The plants, of course, are the main attraction. And so, if you can get the plant puppets to operate properly plus have actors who will act well with a piece of yellow cloth that has teeth and is stuffed into a flower pot, then you're all

Brown laughingly cautions that "of course that's not all. There are dozens of other factors that combine to make a successful show. I firmly believe that we've got a winner with this group."

Anyone familiar with LITTLE SHOP OF HOR-RORS knows that a total eclipse of the sun affects a plant purchased by a young shopkeeper in New York in the early 1960s. The plant grows extremely fast, attracts customers to the shop, creates problems for Seymour, the shopkeeper, and then solves the problems, in a most creative manner.

"We're lucky to have the plant operators that we do for this play. The two largest pods of Audrey II must be sat inside for long periods of time. The operator must be alert, ready to help the plant respond, "sing" and dance when necessary. It's a hot, stuffy thankless job that requires sharp thinking and muscle. Beau and Roanen (Brown of Cisco, who operates the third pod and Barren, of Rising Star, who operates the fourth pod) have worked hours to make it look easy. But both of them are dripping with perspiration after a session in the plant. It's tough work."

LITTLE SHOP OF HOR-RORS was a science fiction movie made in 1960 with Jack Nicholson as the shopkeeper. "It never got noticed except by movie buffs until the musical play was written in the early 80's. That musical spoofed the move in a gentle way. But then it was made into a movie with top name stars. And that went the way of all movies that try to sell tickets - they incorporated 'colorful' language and provocative situations and com-

The next edition of the Press will carry the special letter to the former Kings and Queens but just now I want to extend my special, doubly special thanks to Jean Coats Fitzgerald for finding the "unfindable" forme. She ferreted out every little clue and ended up with addresses for everybody but two, Queen Kay Phillips of 1938 and King Joe Perry of 1984. We're holding letters in reserve for them in case somebody finds the addresses.

In addition to the help Jean gave me, I am obligated to Gene Kinser who typed and xeroed more than a hundred copies of my "Royal" letters; and to Audye Wagley and Nell Hargrove who helped me with the folding, stuffing envelopes, and hand-stamping 107 letters.

Within our knowledge, there are only eight of our Lobo Royalty who have died. They include: C.H. Grist, first king; 1927 King and Queen, Brit Pippen and Velma Morrison; 1929 King and Queen, "Curley" Kellogg and "Dutch" Van Horn; 1940 Queen Alice Slicker Warren; 1973 King Lobo Billy Ervin; and 1976 King Lobo Kelly

prepared to control the pecan nut case bearers says, Eastland County Extension Agent DeMarquis Gordon. Commercial pecan producers and homeowners with yard trees should begin checking trees closely for the insect egg deposits and nutlet damage by newly emerged larvae and begin a spray program if necessary.

Pecan nut casebearers are the small worms that eats into the small pecans, destroying entire clusters before they get started. If uncontrolled, they can destroy the entire crop.

Adult moths of the casebearers deposit eggs on the tips of the small pecans. The white eggs are not much larger than a pin point, says Gordon. Just before hatching the eggs turn pink or light red. After hatching the small worms feed on buds for two or three days before eating its way into the pecan.

Growers should spray five days after observing the first eggs or when 1% or 2% entries are found in the pecans. The agent says that effective pecan nut casebearer control depends on proper timing and application of insecticides.

Zinc should be added to the pecan spray. Due to the good soil moisture most pecan trees are making very nice luxuriant growth. In order to insure proper leaf development, the trees should receive timely application of zinc. In the yard, homeowners will need to use one of the liquid zinc products in order to prevent burn to other plants in the landscape. Commercial growers can use zinc sulfate or one of the many other products available.



Chest pain is not the only indication of a heart attack in r ople at high risk. Doctors at the University of California/Los Angeles found that any unusual pain -- in the jaw, teeth, neck, wherever, may be a warning for high risk people.

New Recommended Dietary Allowances have been announced by the National Academy of Science's Food and Nutrition Board. They call for more iron for women, more calcium for men and women up to age 24, more vitamin C for smokers, and less sodium for everyone.

Experimental vaccine uses cowpox virus together with strains of melanoma cells to fight cancer recurrence in people who've had melanomas. Testing is coordinated at M. D. Anderson Cancer Center and six other centers are involved.

Lyme disease continues to spread across the country, and more people are using insect repellents to ward off the ticks that carry the disease. However, the products should be used strictly according to directions to avoid toxic reactions, especially among youngsters.

County Commissioners Approve Annexation of Carbon School

Eastland County Commissioners Monday, May 21 approved the request of the Carbon Independent School District to be annexed into the Eastland School District.

The annexation is expected to take effect July 1, ending more than a hundred years of public school in Carbon. The first school in Carbon was established July 29, 1884.

At Monday's called meeting Billy Bacon, Commissioner of Pct. 4, made the motion to approve the request for annexation. L.T. Owen, Comm. of Pct. 3, gave a Second to the motion. Comms. Robinson, Pct. 1, and Christian, Pct. 2 also approved the request, making the vote 4-0.

This action followed about thirty minutes of discussion between the Commissioners, representatives of the Carbon school district, the Eastland School, Rising Star, and others present.

From Austin was Dr. Pat Pringle, a monitor from the Texas Education Agency, and Attorney Coddy Capute, who represented Carbon ISD.

Pringle reviewed problems found in the Carbon system, which he said had caused hime to be appointed to seek solutions for the school. He listed declining enrollment as a main problem, but said he had also been concerned about student performance, cirriculum development, and teacher certification is advanced math and science.

On April 19 the Carbon School Board voted to keep the grade school but to contract students in grades 7-12 to Eastland and Gorman. Two more surveys of enrollment caused the Board - with four new members - to reconsider the April decision, Pringle

On May 15 the School Board voted 4-1 to rescind the April 19 action and annex all grades in to the Eastland

The legality of the annexation was discussed by the Attorney for the Carbon School, with comments by District Attorney Emory Walton and Judge Scott Bailey. Carbon School Superintendent reported that 109 students were enrolled this

Attorney Caputo said that all property of the Carbon School District would become part of the Eastland District. He said that Carbon School has no indebtedness that in fact, by State standards, it is considered a "rich" District. The District has a large area and tax base.

The Commissioners and other spoke of "fond memories" of Carbon School. Ray Kanady of Carbon asked about trophies, personal property and things of sentimental value.

Superintendent Keith Watkins of Eastland told the Court that the trophies and other mementoes would stay at the school for the community. He also said plans are being considered to use the buildings in some way involved with education.






