OPENING A SECOND FRONT will be the job of troops seasoned to the shocks of war. That is why the British troops shown in these pictures are being trained today, not only to be efficient with their own weapons, but also to know what it feels like to be "blitzed." At left, a plane has just screamed low over their heads in an "attack," and now a mine is detonated right in front to simulate the burst of the "dive-bomb." Above tank men in low-slung fast British Valentine tanks feel what it's like to have two very close explosions. Below, infantry literally "go through fire" as part of a two-week course at a Battle School in South-East England. When the time is ripe for the Second Front, they will know what to do.
