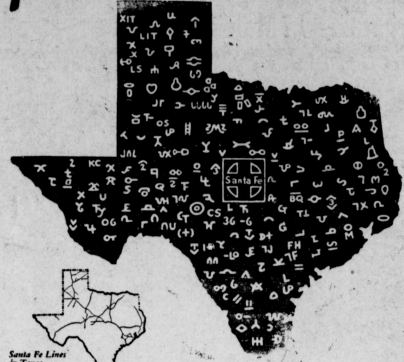

Army Answers Your War Problems

Q. How long will my son have to serve overseas before he is allowed to come home on a rotation furlough?
A. There is no specified period of overseas service after which rotation furloughs are granted. Considerations governing granting of such furloughs include the availability of replacements, facilities for transportation and many others. No soldier may go unless he can be spared from his organization. In Life Insurance regulations, the furloughs, however, commanding off-

cers give preference to those who have served overseas longest.
Q. My husband has left for overseas. Will I get a 20 per cent increase in my family allowance to correspond with the 20 per cent increase he gets in his base pay for overseas service?
A. No increase is made in the family allowance of a soldier's dependents because of the overseas service of a resident.
Q. Can my fiancé make me the beneficiary of his Army insurance when he is inducted into the service?
A. No. Under National Service selecting soldiers for rotation fur-

child, parent, sister or brother.
Q. When a cadet in flight training is appointed a flight officer, will his wife continue to receive a family allowance?
A. No. Dependents of flight officers are not eligible to receive the family allowance.
Q. Must a widow have been married to a veteran of World War I any specified length of time to be eligible for a pension?
A. Full information about a bill now in process to provide pensions for widows of World War I veterans may be secured from the nearest office of the Veterans Administration, which will administer such pensions.

Letters From Service Men

publishing a letter written by a Corporal Louis stationed in India. Another, Mrs. Annie Swan, of Muleshoe. Heaving his fourth year in Army, has been overseas

about 30 months.

Somewhere in India

Dear Mommy:

It seems I have failed to start off the New Year right. The Japs left lots of fox holes scattered about, and I stepped in one New Year's Eve and almost broke my ankle. The Jap army must be the diggingest outfit in the World. They dug thousands of little holes about big enough for two men and covered them over with dirt and

brush so cleverly that a person has to look mighty careful to locate them.

Some time ago I took a trip up close to the front. I guess you read in the papers how this town was captured from the Japs. I won't mention the name of it now.

Anyway, I got there just a few days after the battle. Talk about a place torn all to pieces, that place was. Deep bomb craters were everywhere, the holes were big enough to drop a boxcar in. Not

a tree, not a house, escaped a bullet hole. Jap dugouts were everywhere. Clothes, ammunition, shoes were still in them. In some fox holes dead Japanese soldiers were still sitting in the position they were in when death struck them. The smell of unburied bodies filled the air in some places, and if some of those dreaming, striking, grasping people back in the States could have seen this place, they would wake up to the fact that war is hell and we have got

plenty more of it to come. It didn't take me long to get all I wanted of the place and I was glad to leave it. Well, I have been quartered by the Doctor until my foot gets well. It's nothing bad, just a sprain. I have me a can of lard and some flour in my tent, so when I shoot a squirrel or a wild chicken I have a feast that the Army never puts out in its daily meals. We have been after a deer that hangs around the jungle close to our
