### Army Answers Your War Problems

Q. What is the cloth insignia looking like a wreath which some soldiers wear on their right sleeves?  
A. The laurel wreath insignia worn four inches above the lower end of the right sleeve is the Meritorious Service Unit Insignia. It means that the service organization to which the soldier belongs has been elected for superior performance or of outstanding devotion to duty.

Q. My husband is a soldier overseas so I am sending in the application for a family allowance for our child born last month. How much additional money will be taken out of my husband's pay as his contribution toward the child's allowance?  
A. Can a soldier take out insurance before going overseas, and then drop it after he is across?  
A. Yes. National Service Life Insurance is purely voluntary and may be cancelled by the soldier at any time.



**Waste Fats Badly Needed For War**

Housewives, Army mess sergeants, cooks and KP's are doing a land-slide business turning in used kitchen fats but collections must continue on the upgrade if this year's goal is met, Dan L. Loyd, district representative, WFA's Office of Supply announces. The armed forces have long recognized the importance of used tins to the war program and are saving millions of pounds yearly, explained.

In a recent statement to the WFA representative, Col Luther G. Weatherly, Eighth Service Command Quartermaster and director of salvage and redistribution, said "Grease for glycerin" had been a byword in every army installation in the southwest ever since housewives were asked to turn in used fats to their butchers. Last year, he said, more than 6,300,000 pounds of fused grease were earmarked for war uses from Army kitchens in the five state area of Texas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Arkansas and New Mexico and collections are continuing.

In all Army kitchens in the 8th Service Command, Col. Weatherly said "No amount of grease, however small, is wasted. Ammunition is needed too badly overseas."

Greatest untapped source of shed fat is the civilian kitchens from which still larger quantities must come this year if the goal is realized, Boyd said. For every pound turned in, housewives are paid two red points and four cents cash.
