Manuel Jennings and family, Jay Wyer and family enjoyed the generous hospitality and a lovely meal in the home of Melva and Cecil Davis last week.

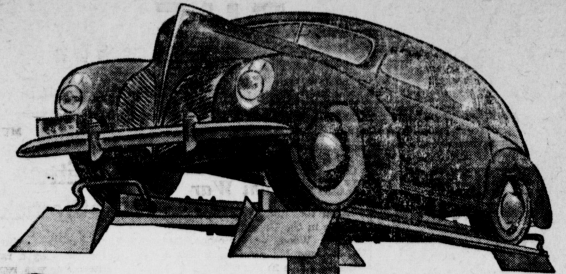

DALLAS, April—Donill Byron Duncan, Seaman Second Class

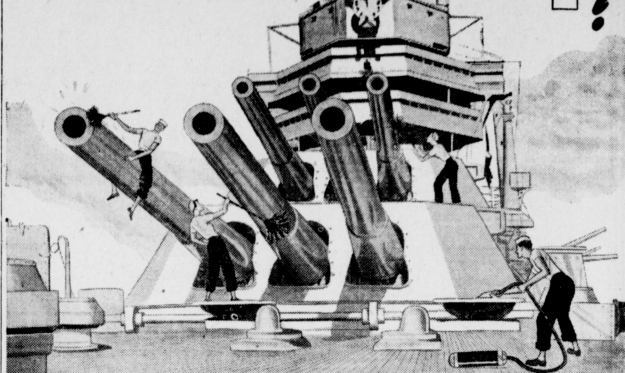

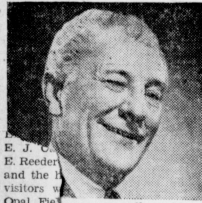

Army Answers Your War Problems

Q. My husband was killed in action overseas. Along with other papers, I am sending to the company with which he held civilian life insurance. I will have to include a death certificate. To whom in the Army should I write to obtain one?

A. Write for form 0670-1 to the Casualty Branch, the Adjutant General's Department, Washington 25, D. C. Be sure to include your husband's full name and serial number and the designation of the organization in which he was serving at the time of his death.

Q. Before I was discharged from the Army, I applied for maternity care for my wife, who is soon to have a child. Will a dis-

charge prevent her from getting this aid?

A. No. If your wife became pregnant while you were in the service and you filed an application for maternity and infant care before you were discharged, the aid will be granted.

Q. I have seen soldiers wearing shoulder patches on both sleeves under what circumstances are they allowed to do this?

A. Soldiers who have served overseas and who are now stationed in units in this country are permitted but not required to wear the insignia of their overseas units on their right shoulder sleeves. At the same time, they must wear the insignia of the units to which they are now assigned on their left shoulder sleeves.
