3 cups soaked prunes, chopped.
2 cups brown sugar.
2 cups botting water.
3 cups sited flour.
1-2 teaspoon soda.
4 tabis-spoons fat.
1 teaspoon salt.
2 teaspoons baking powder.
(Clinamon, or other spices may be added, if desired.)
Mix the sugar, water, prunes and salt, boil for a minutes and add the fat. Cool. Sift the baking powder, soda, and spices, with the flour and stir not the first mixture.
Pour into a pan lined with greased jajer and ba's in a very moderate oven for one hour. As with other cakes under with orrown sugar, this cake will tend to secret if the oven is too hot.


