Two Former Briscoe Countians To Be Inducted Into Sports Hall of Fame

Two former residents of Briscoe County will be inducted into the Panhandle Sports Hall of Fame on January 18 at 2:00 p.m. along with a former coach at Amarillo College. The ceremony will be held in Ordway Auditorium on the Amarillo College campus.

Gene Mayfield, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Mayfield of Quitaque, who graduated from Quitaque High School, and Harley Redin, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Redin of Plainview, a graduate of Silverton High School, are two of those to be inducted.

Mayfield was an outstanding football player and outstanding coach.

He played six-man football at Quitaque High School. Following military service, he quarterbacked West Texas State to the Border Conference championship in 1950. He was named as the Little All-American quarterback.

Mayfield served as a member of the Buff coaching staff for two years. He was head coach at Littlefield High School, 1954-57, Borger High School, 1958-64, Odessa Permian High School, 1965-70, and West Texas State, 1971-76. His high school teams won 156, lost 35 and tied six. He was 32-12-2 at Littlefield, 62-13-2 at Borger, and 62-10-2 at Permian. Nine of his teams reached the state playoffs.

His 1962 Borger Bulldogs lost in the state finals. His Permian Panthers won the state championship in 1965 after being ranked last in their district.

Mayfield's West Texas State teams were 24-39-2. His 1972 Buffs shared the Missouri Valley Conference co-championship.

He soon joined the Mesa Petroleum Company of Amarillo. Redin coached the Wayland College Flying Queens to six national championships. He was runner-up six other times. He coached the Queens to five National Women's Invitational Tournament championships in Amarillo.

In 18 seasons, he won 429 games and lost 63 from 1956 through 1973.

Redin coached the men's team for 11 seasons starting in 1946. His first team was 8-14. That was his only losing season in 27 years of coaching. His Pioneers won 204 and lost 117.

The Pioneers won their way to the NAIA national tournament three times.

He resigned in 1973 to join the City National Bank in Plainview as an officer.

Redin was an outstanding play-

er for Silverton High School and John Tarleton State University at Stephenville. He graduated from North Texas State University in 1942. Following military service, Redin entered North Texas State to work on his masters degree. He then accepted the position at Wayland.

The Panhandle Sports Hall of Fame was established in 1959. It is co-sponsored by the Y's Men's Club of the Amarillo YMCA and the Amarillo Chamber of Commerce sports committee.

All sports followers are invited to attend the ceremonies. There will be no charge and food won't be served. There will be a reception following the ceremonies.

Just a year ago, the Hall of Fame inducted George Ray Colvin. George Ray, a graduate of Turkey High School where he was an outstanding athlete, went on to attend West Texas State and became one of its celebrated basketball players. Mr. Colvin was a teammate of Joe Fortenberry who was the first athlete inducted into the Panhandle Sports Hall of Fame. Mr. Colvin died last summer just a few months after becoming one of the Panhandle's celebrated athletes.

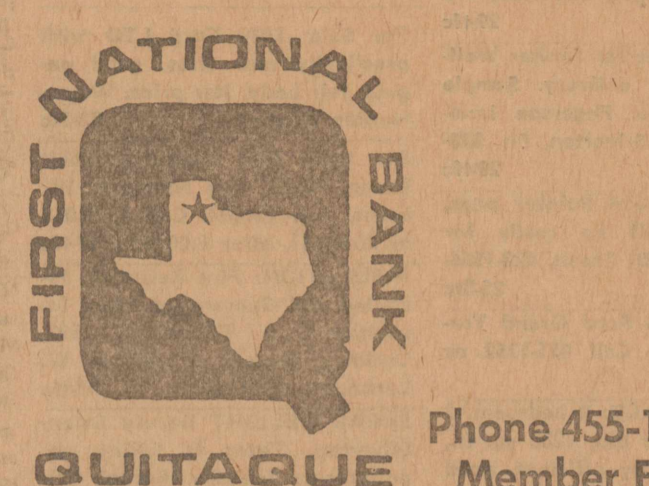
