**Sausage Casserole
Makes Savory Meal**



There's nothing quite like a corn-sausage casserole as the main dish for a cold evening supper. Invites Marjorie Griffin, rural home editor of Capper's Farmer, nationally-circulated farm magazine.

Corn-Sausage Casserole.
 1/2 lb. sausage 1/2 tsp. pepper
 1/2 c. onion 2/3 c. whole kernel
 1/2 c. green pepper 1 c. corn
 1 tbsp. sugar 1/2 c. canned
 1 tsp. salt tomatoes
 1 c. rice cereal

Use link sausages or bulk sausage shaped into links; brown them in a heavy frying pan and drain well. Brown chopped onion and green pepper in meat drippings. Add four and seasonings and mix well. Add corn and tomatoes and simmer until juice has partially evaporated (about one-half hour). Pour into casserole, arrange sausages on top in wheel shape. Sprinkle cereal over top. Bake at 400° F. about 15 minutes. Serves 6.

Fruit Coffee Cake Liven Party Table



Fruit coffee cake waves a magic wand over the party table when friends drop in of an afternoon, writes the Country Cooking Editor of Capper's Farmer.

"Made of ordinary quick-bread dough, it's glamorized with raisins, nuts and spices," she writes. "Serve it at any meal for the family's delight. A thin icing puts it in the dessert class at lunch or dinner."

Fruit Coffee Cake. 1/2 c. water 1 tsp. flour 1/2 c. raisins 1 egg 1 tsp. lemon juice 1/2 c. milk 1/2 c. oil 1/2 c. sugar 1/2 c. brown sugar 1/2 c. baking powder 1/2 c. shortening. Combine seedless raisins and water. Bring to a boil and cook for two minutes. Gradually add 1 tsp. flour to mixture, stirring constantly, until thickened. Add lemon juice and a dash of cloves and cinnamon. Cool. Combine raisin mixture, lightly beaten egg and milk. Sift all-purpose flour, baking powder and sugar together. Work in shortening so particles are approximately the size of a small pea. Pour liquid mixture into middle of dry ingredients; stir two together just enough to mix well. Spoon into greased tube pan. Bake in a moderate oven (375° F.) for 25 minutes.

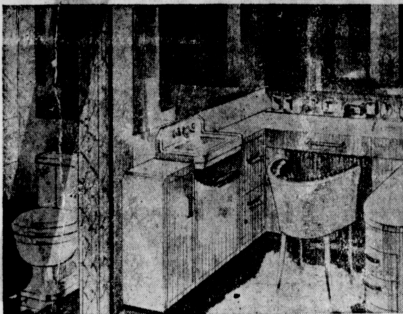

BAY's planes supported operations at Leyte, following up with air cover missions in other Philippines actions in Lingayen Gulf and Luzon. During that time, numerous suicide planes tried to knock her out.

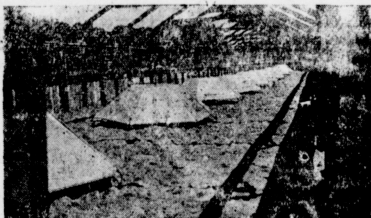

Information For The Veteran

Q. What constitutes new and material evidence necessary to reopen a claim that has been denied?

A. To be evidence it must relate to a new fact respecting the point at issue. To constitute material evidence the facts offered must relate to and have effective influence or bearing on the decision in question. Evidence which is cumulative or merely repeats what has been submitted before will not serve as a basis for reconsideration of a claim that has been denied.

Q. Does a National Service Life Insurance Policy have a loan value?

A. The five year level premium term policy initially issued does not have a loan value. A loan on any converter policy may be obtained after the first policy year. The loan may not exceed 94 percent per annum.

Q. If a veteran has several teeth extracted during service, may dentures be furnished by the Veterans Administration?

A. Not as a rule. It is held that the removal of defective teeth is a benefit rather than a detriment. If, however, dental work is necessary as an adjunct to treatment for a service connected disability, or as auxiliary to hospital treatment, dentures may be authorized.

Q. Is a veteran's child adopted by another person eligible for benefits provided for children of veterans?

A. A child of a veteran adopted out of the family of the veteran is nevertheless a child within the meaning of that term as defined in veterans regulations.

Q. Are the proceeds of a National Service Life Insurance policy subject to claims of creditors?

A. No, payments to the beneficiary of such policy are exempt from taxation and from claims of creditors either of the insured or of the beneficiary except as to claims by the U. S. Government arising under any of the laws relating to veterans.

Q. Is a medical examination necessary before a claim can be rated in the case of World War II veteran who files a claim at the time of his discharge from service?

A. A medical examination is unnecessary in the initial adjudication of the claim unless a considerable time has elapsed since the veteran's discharge or the records furnished present a problem that makes an accurate rating decision difficult or impossible.

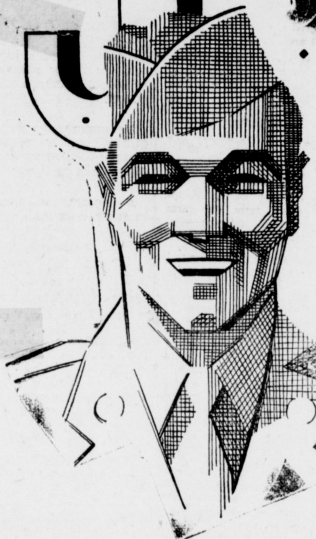

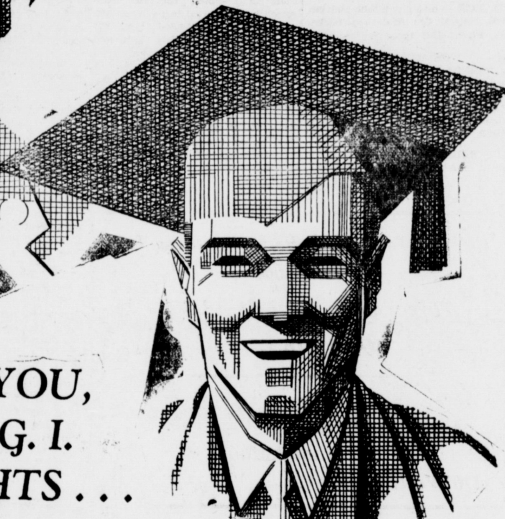

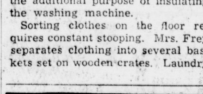

Here's How to Banish Washday Stoopng

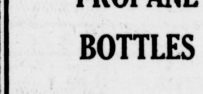
IT IS the stooping, bending and toting that make washday tiring. Dorothy Holladay points out in nationally circulated Capper's Farmer.
