MEAT CUT Quiz



Q. What is the name of this cut of meat?
 A. These are cross-cut beef shanks.
 Q. Where does this cut come from, and how is it identified?
 A. This cut is taken from the fore shank of beef. It contains considerable connective tissue, varying amounts of lean, and the round leg bone.
 Q. How should this cut be prepared?
 A. Cross-cut beef shanks are always cooked in the presence of moisture, either by broiling with a small amount of liquid or in liquid to cover. As a result they are tender and flavorful, and considered among the finger eating by those who respect simple, hearty fare. They are cooked as individual pot-roasts, either in small casseroles or in a single large casserole, and are an unusual variation on favorite larger pot-roasts. The shanks are usually floured and browned in 2 to 3 tablespoons of fat. They are then cooked slowly in the presence of a small amount of liquid until tender, or cooked in liquid to cover in a covered container. The resulting drippings and juices may be thickened to serve as a delicious gravy with the meat.

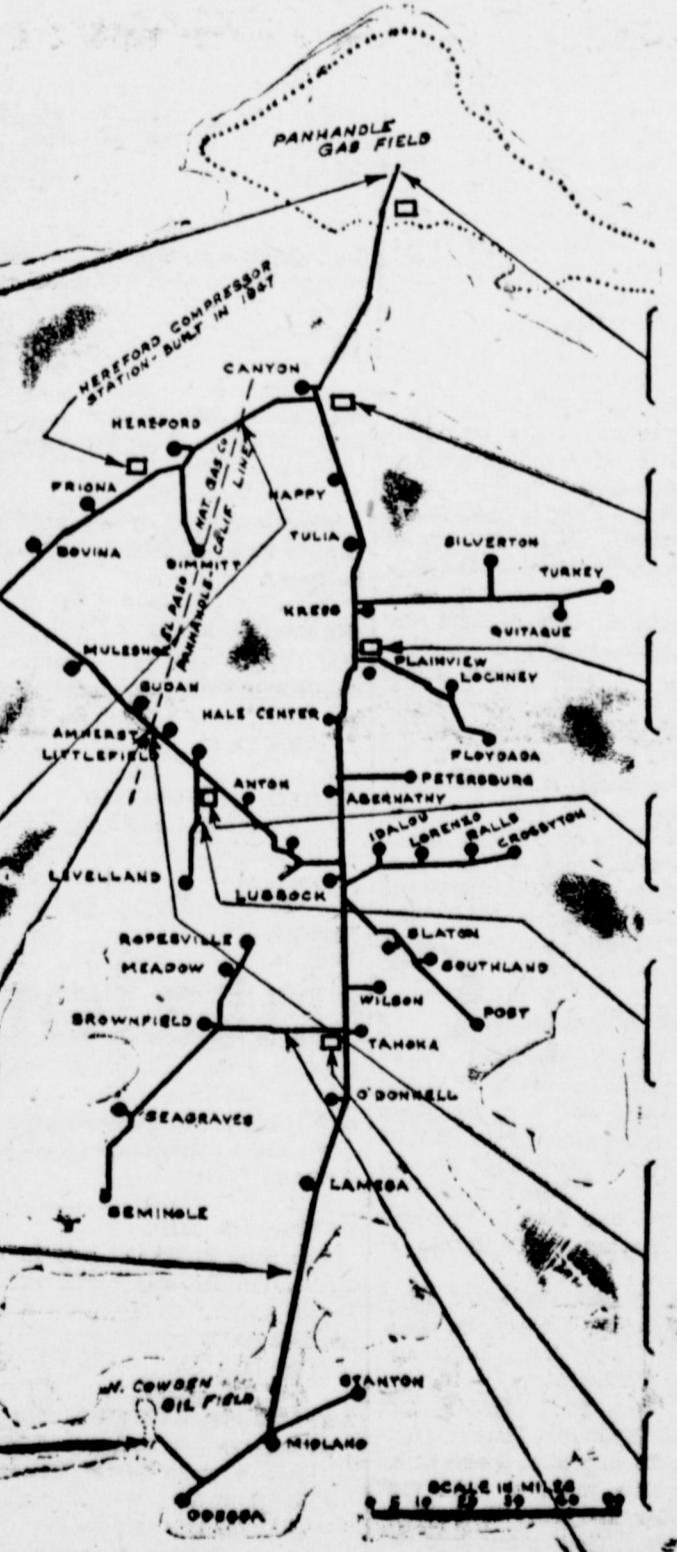
A REPORT TO OUR CUSTOMERS . . .
WHAT WE ARE DOING TO INCREASE OUR GAS PIPE LINE CAPACITY

TWO NEW SOURCES OF SUPPLY ARRANGED

We have signed an agreement with El Paso Natural Gas Company to purchase gas from that company at two points. Barring unforeseen contingencies, this gas, which will benefit all towns on our system, will be available by November 1, 1948.

Thus, by next winter, we will be receiving natural gas from FIVE sources, as follows:

1. From Panhandle Gas Field, through our own transmission lines.
2. From El Paso Natural Gas Company line at point of intersection with our line near Hereford.
3. From El Paso Natural Gas Company line at point of intersection with our line near Amherst.
4. At a point 25 miles south of Lamesa, from Empire Southern Gas Company, whose line from Andrews County to Big Spring intersects our line there.
5. From Cities Service Oil Company's Compressor Station in North Garden Field, Bator County.



NEW FACILITIES TO BE INSTALLED ON PIPE LINE SYSTEM

Here are the new facilities expected to be installed before next winter, with estimated month of completion:

1. Near Turkey Creek Compressor Station will be installed a 300 hp. booster compressor. (September.) Main plant is 2350 hp.
2. At McSpadden Compressor Station: three more 400 hp. compressors, increasing capacity to 2850 hp. (July.)
3. At Plainview Compressor Station: one more 300 hp. compressor, increasing capacity to 2400 hp. (December.)
4. At Littlefield Compressor Station: one 80 hp. compressor, to increase capacity to 330 hp. (August.)
5. Between Littlefield Compressor Station and Whitharral: nine miles of 6 1/2-inch pipe will replace 3 1/2-inch pipe. (4.4 miles, June; remainder when pipe now on order is received.)
6. From Littlefield to point of intersection with new El Paso Natural Gas Company line: ten and one-half miles of 8 1/2-inch pipe will replace 4 1/2-inch pipe. (Pipe expected in July; will be installed soon as received.)
7. At Tahoka Compressor Station: one more 300 hp. compressor, to increase capacity to 780 hp. (September.)
8. Between Tahoka and Brownfield: ten miles of 6 1/2-inch pipe will replace 4 1/2-inch pipe. (Pipe on order; will be installed soon as received.)

We are conducting investigations and studies which may result in our tapping still more sources of supply.

G. railroad beside it looked like fine sewing thread; the people who had gone down to sit on the incline were so small one could just see them move about.

We saw the Helen Hunt falls, the road to the Seven Falls was closed at that time. We drove thru many canyons and mountains, including the Garden of the Gods, Skyline Drive. One can hardly imagine driving so high that the cars, ranches, and houses look like toys.

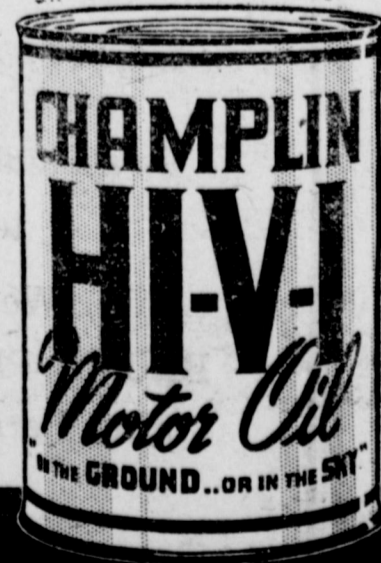

Methodism Launches 4-year Program

The Methodist Jurisdictional Conference convened in El Paso, Texas, on June 23, and closed on the evening of June 28. The purpose of the Jurisdictional Conference is to elect bishops as authorized by the General Conference; to put into action the general program of the Methodist

Episcopacy Committee to serve the Kansas-Nebraska area, and is stationed at Topeka, Kans.

The following named bishops were present at the conference: Bishop A. Frank Smith, Houston; Bishop Angie W. Smith of Oklahoma City; Bishop Charles C. Selecman, Dallas; Bishop W. C. Martin of Topeka, Kans.; Bishop Paul E. Martin, Little Rock; and Bishop Hiram Boaz, (retired) of Dallas. Bishop Selecman having reached the age of seventy two was automatically "retired." Bishop Dana Dawson was elected to fill the vacancy created through the retirement of Bishop Selecman. Each active bishop presided over the conference at the different sessions.

Some of the greatest preachers in Methodism were present and took their turns on the platform delivering challenging and inspiring sermons and lectures. Dr. Warfield, who is in charge of over seas relief in the Methodist church, explained the great needs of the suffering and starving peoples of Europe and Asia, and how great and effective was our ministry to these needy people.

Dr. Warfield explained that 55% of all funds which the Methodists contributed for overseas relief went directly to the suffering and needy people in both Europe and Asia. This fund was administered by our bishops, missionaries, and native missionaries, Church as authorized by the general conference, and to increase the number of officers of the church for a more effective service.

The Rev. Dana Dawson, pastor of the First Methodist Church, Shreveport, La., was elected bishop, and on the evening of June 28 was consecrated to the office and ministry of the Episcopacy. He was assigned by the Episcopacy, and no extra cost for administering this service and money. The other 45% of our funds was pooled in an interdenominational fund and administered without additional cost to the churches. These funds were spent in those sections of the countries where government monies had not gone and would not go. Our Methodist church has an orphanage in Poland with three thousand children supported by the over seas relief funds. This is just one of the many worthy things we are doing for the needy and helpless people. It is done in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord.

This year eight million Methodists in America will be asked to contribute the sum of 72 million to continue the world work and service to the helpless souls of Europe and Asia. This amounts to twenty-five cents per member. We could do a lot more than this paltry sum.

Dr. Roy Smith gave four great lectures or sermons during the sitting of the conference. His themes were: 1. America Grows Up; 2. Spiritual Leadership of a Mature Nation; 3. Our Faith; 4. Methodism Grows Up. Through these sermons Dr. Smith showed how power and leadership must also take responsibilities that always go with power. Our nation must take her responsibilities in world affairs, and at the same time our church, being the largest and richest Protestant church in the world, must assume under God her responsibilities in making this world a Christian world.

Dr. Harold A. Bostey, Dean of the School of Religion, Duke University, spoke on the subject, "The Ministry of Reconciliation." He pointed out that the business of the church is to make peace among all peoples. This peace cannot be had except through the love of Christ made incarnate in human hearts. To make the world a community of world brotherhood is the objective of the Christian religion. He made reference to the shortness of time remaining for the church and Christian religion to accomplish her task in saving our world from another and worse catastrophe. He said a scientist friend of his told him recently that in the field of bacteriology there are 6 different kinds of disease germs now in the hands of military scientists, any one of which, if released upon humanity could never be stopped. (THINK IT OVER, NEIGHBOR).

Should America release any one of these bacteria on any part of the world, it would eventually return to our nation and destroy our own people also. He also said that his friend told him that atomic power - the atomic bomb - had been increased many fold in power since our first bombs were made. An atomic bomb no larger than the cap of your fountain pen is now powerful enough to destroy a city the size of Houston or Dallas. We have come to the time when we must have world peace or world destruction. Can the churches of Christendom save us? The answer is NO. The kind of church people

we have in our modern world are not trained to be and do missionary work. Unless every person who is really Christian does something besides attend church once a week our world is doomed to destruction. Here it is, church members: Your welfare cfwypshrdiucmfwypvbgkqj pend upon what you can do about the matter. It is no longer a preacher church and a preacher religion. The time has come for each church member to be a Christian along with his particular church "ism". If there is a God, if there is a Christ, if there is a Holy Spirit, and man can possess power of divinity, he had better come to possess this power, or die. He will - we will.

Work Program Outlined
The program of work for the Methodist Church for this quadrennium is as follows:

1. To train 500,000 Methodist lay people for Christian service;
2. To recruit 244,000 new members each year of the quadrennium;
3. Church school attendance to be increased fifty per cent during the next four years;
4. All Methodists parents to establish altars of worship in their homes;
5. To enlist and train five thousand new Methodist preachers during the quadrennium to fill vacancies that will come through retirement, illness and death, and to train 8,000 new ministers during the next eight years, which number will be necessary to fill vacancies in Methodist pulpits;

6. An enlarged missionary program for World Service.

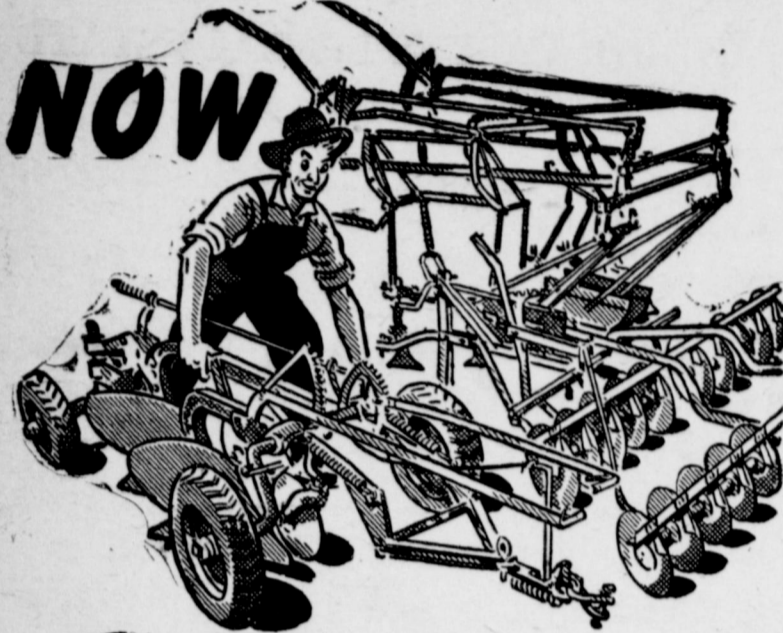
7. That at least twenty-five per cent of our membership become titheers.

Hundreds of congregations will spend \$180,000 in building of new churches during this quadrennium. Many others will be added to these

that have already planned to build new churches.

This is the program for every local Methodist church in Methodism. There is work to do for each of us. May God help us to make our religion a working religion.

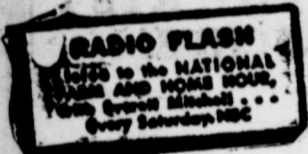
