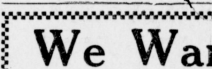

COLD FEET

Lay Pipe In City Park This Week To Irrigate The Trees

Work of laying pipe in Santa Fe municipal park, preparatory to irrigating the trees planted there this spring is being carried on.

Monday afternoon the Beautification committee staked out the line for the pipe location and 15 men were put to work digging the ditches under the direction of the local R. F. C. committee.

Eight hundred and ten feet of standard sage two inch pipe has been purchased from a concern in Wichita Falls and hauled here through the courtesy of A. H. Kuehn. The pipe is of the used kind but all in excellent condition, even the threads on joints being good, and it cost but six and one-half cents per foot.

The Kiwanis club members subscribed \$25.00 toward payment of this pipe, and members of the Girl Scouts, under direction of Mrs. J. C. Weaver, have raised about \$20.00 which is nearly enough funds to pay for the pipe, the laying of same to be paid with R. F. C. money.

There have been 250 trees planted in the park this spring, and it is understood several organizations of the city are also planning putting in of flowers and shrubbery of different kinds in locations designated by the landscape artist. Contributors to the pipe fund are as follows:

TWO GOVERNMENT CAMPS TO BE LOCATED IN PANHANDLE

Of the 45 government conservation camps to be established in Texas, two of them will be located in the Panhandle area, both being established in Palo Verde canyon. At these camps men will be enlisted in the \$1 per day forestry service.

It is thought these two camps may be established the first of next week. Approximately 300 men will be cared by each camp.
