

In Seminole in 1912 the county seat had grown to the point where cattle were fenced off the square. Note the stiles over the fences looking west and north. Old timers spent time and a lot of money getting the shade trees started on the square. Caliche seen piled up on the north and west part of the square was used to build walkways to the courthouse. The business buildings from left to right; Austin Store housing General Merchandise and Post Office, behind it the Light House Plant. Going north, O. F. Haygood Barber Shop, Cothes Drug Store. The two story building is The Lone Star Hotel. The windmill and tower belongs to it. Stark Grocery, and across the Hobbs highway the Telephone Office. East and across the Seagraves highway the W.H. Brennan's Mercantile Store. The big building east and north is the local Blacksmith Shop. In the background on the left is the Caudle house, the Baptist parsonage, the Methodist Church and the School. Across the Hobbs highway, the Slaton's house and windmill, Grandpa Miller's house and John Miller's house. The W.H. Brennan residence can be seen over the top of his store building. To the right is the J. S. George house. Note the automobile in front of the hotel and the cows grazing north of the square.

Ben arrived in Galveston 2 months ago in a coma and at the point of death. He was put on a kidney machine after an operation and gradually regained his health so the kidney could be transplanted from his sister, Mrs. Villa Mae Vandergriff from Pasadena, Texas. The transplanted kidney had to be taken out.

Mrs. Roy Jerden of Hobbs, New Mexico a sister-in-law reported that they left Galveston Saturday and it was amazing how well he was doing. He has to spend hours on the kidney machine twice a week so his blood can be purified.

It is reported that another attempt will be made in the near future for a new transplant.

Robert Matthews reported that a Blood Mobile out of Lubbock will be at the Community Building, Tuesday, July 6th from 10 a. m. to 4 p. m. to take blood for Ben.

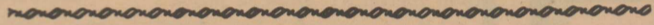

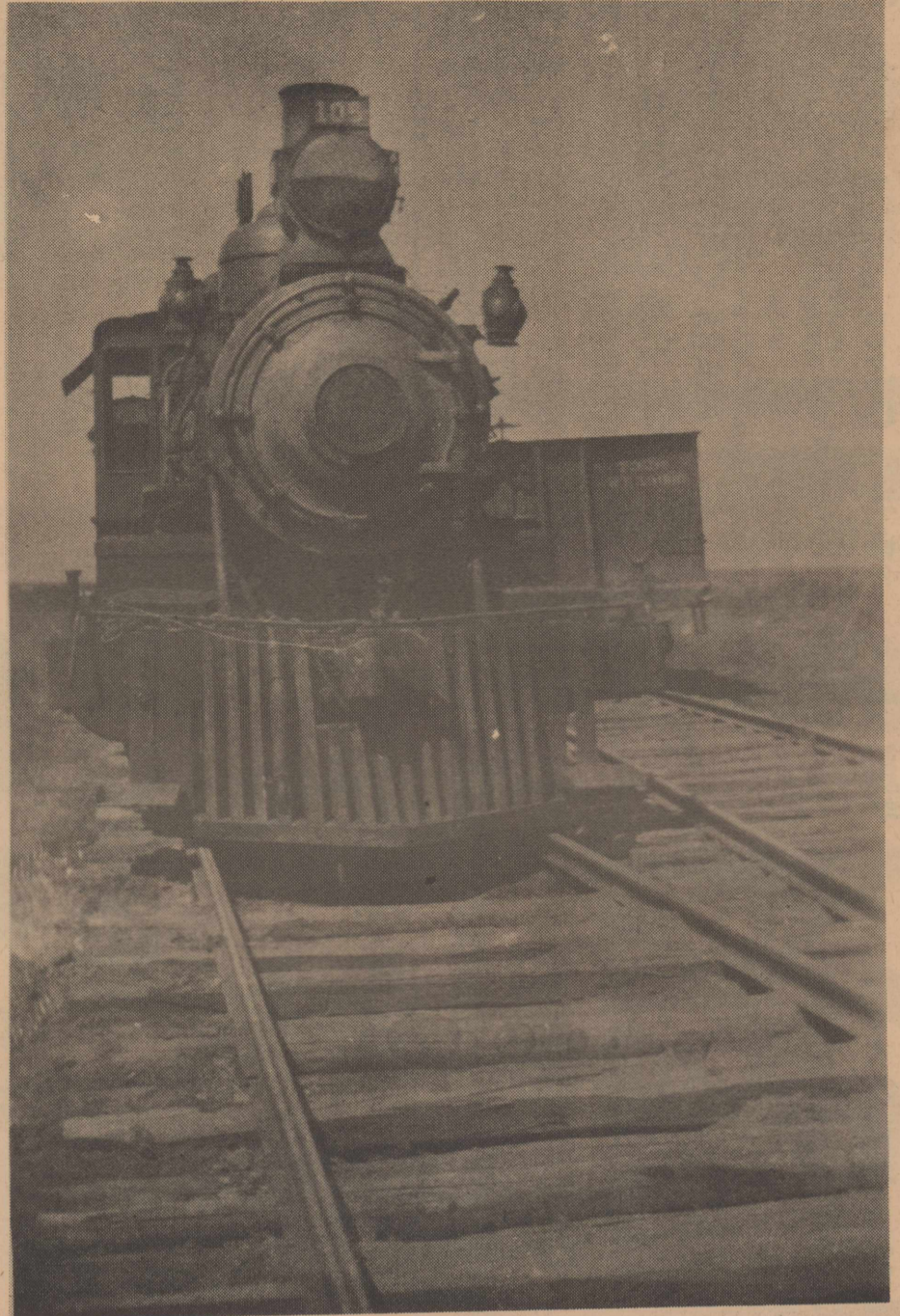

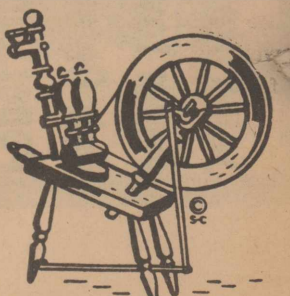

Present for the occasion were board members, James Phillips, vice-president; Ed Rodgers, hospital administrator and Don Moore, secretary-treasurer.

**HOSPITAL DISTRICT BOARD MEETS**

The Provisional Board of the Seminole Hospital District met last night in the Gold Room at the Seminole State Bank for the purpose of organizing.  
The Provisional Board accepted the resignation of Jameil Aryain and appointed Richard Watts. Brom Marchbanks, Phillips, Paul Condit, Don Moore, Delbert Warren and Ken Willis officially resigned from the Gaines County Hospital Board. Brom Marchbanks was elected as temporary chairman and then President of the new board. James Phillips was elected Vice-President and Don Moore as Secretary-Treasurer.  
The group voted to have their regular meeting the second Tuesday of each month in the Gold Room at the Seminole State Bank.  
It was pointed out in the meeting that the new board would officially take over the operation of the present Seminole Hospital on July 22, 1971. This would be 30 days after the official canvass of the votes from the last election.  
Ed Rodgers reported that the hospital would receive an official inspection by H. E. W. on July 23rd. He was appointed as Administrator under his present salary of \$1,000 per month.  
The Board authorized payment of the judge and clerks that held the New Hospital District election and the payment of newspaper advertisement.  
Joe Smith, an attorney for the First Southwestern Investment Company, who was employed by the board as council pointed out the necessity of setting a tax rate by July 20th. The board further decided to meet with Commissioners Court before it was set. Smith gave his fee for taking care of the Bonding Council and other work for 60 months at \$14,347.50.  
John Shepperd, local attorney, was appointed as General Council for the board. The architect firm of Stiles, Roberts and Messersmith was employed by the board. Their fee of 7.75% to 8% will include council of the firm of O'Connell and Probst in Austin, Texas, an architect firm that specializes in Medical facilities.

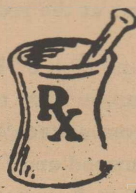
## POSTAGE RATES CHANGE
