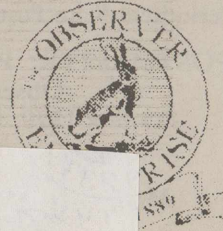

Football Season begins tonight

Coke County Championship set for Friday, August 28

The Robert Lee Steers will travel to Bronte to take on the Longhorns in an eleven man game Friday, August 28. Kick-off is set for 7:30 pm.

The old rivalry was revived last year in a hard fought six man contest last year in Robert Lee. Although the game was close in the first half, the Steers prevailed in this first game 58-49.

The football rivalry had been

put on hold in 2004 when the Steers began playing six man football.

The Steers are coming off a 7-2 record from 2014, while the Longhorns suffered a winless season last year.

Blackwell opens season at home

The Blackwell Hornets will host the Sterling City Eagles at 7:30 pm tonight to open their 2015 football season. The Hornets fell to Sterling City last year 24-38 on the road, but went on to compete in the play-offs.

Dove season set to open on Tuesday; Record numbers anticipated

Wow! What an upcoming dove season we are expecting. Record rainfall during the winter and spring seasons have resulted in good crop yields and a tangled growth of weeds. The end result is a great volume of seed heads, which should make this year's season a really good one.

One of the biggest negatives for local farmers and ranchers has been the 100 plus degree heat and dry weather we have experienced the last couple of months. If those conditions hold, that will be another plus for dove hunters, as water holes will be few and far between, concentrating the dove numbers around tanks and other water sources late in the afternoon.

As to numbers, I have seen large groups of whitewings around the house, as well as a good number of collared doves almost every day. It also seems like there is an increased number of mourning doves in the area due to the good feeding conditions.

As in most good dove hunting years, some of the best hunting opportunities will be at the very beginning of the season. Once those birds get some hunting pressure, they'll be off to a safe zone, where they don't get shot at so much. If conditions get right to bring some northern birds into our area, we'll have some real hunting opportunities.

Tuesday morning, September 1, 2015, will mark the beginning of the new dove season in Coke County and throughout the Northern and Central zones of Texas. The Northern dove

hunting zone is basically the area above Interstate 20, with the Central zone being bordered on the north by Interstate 20 and on the southern end by Interstate 10. The South zone is below Interstate 10, and their season does not open until September 18.

The season in our area will run from September 1 through October 25, 2015, with an additional late season from December 18 through January 1, 2016. Daily bag limit is 15 mourning, white-winged, and white-tipped doves in the aggregate, to include not more than 2 whitetips. Possession limit is three times the daily bag limit. Don't forget that there is no limit on collared doves; however, you will want to leave plumage on these birds for identification purposes.

Legal shooting hours are from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset. Don't forget to plug those autoloaders and pump shotguns, as dove are considered migratory birds, and plugs must be in place so that the firearm can hold no more than three shells.

A new hunting license will be required to hunt this fall, along with a \$7.00 migratory game bird stamp if you will be hunting dove or waterfowl, plus another \$7.00 stamp if you will be hunting upland game birds, which include quail, turkey, and pheasant. If you will be hunting waterfowl, you will also need to purchase a \$25 migratory game bird stamp endorsement (duck stamp).

Butch Davis was born on June 21, 1939, in Robert Lee, Texas to Emory Copeland DooDad and Corena Tena Davis. Surrounded by his family, he passed from this world on August 22, 2015, at the age of 76.

Butch grew up in Robert Lee, Texas, and was the youngest of four brothers. He graduated from Robert Lee High School in 1957 and attended San Angelo College. He was a talented musician, but speech was his favorite class.

In the summer of 1958, at a baseball game in his hometown, Butch laid eyes on Carolyn Sue Johnson, who was in town visiting her sister. Less than a year later, he drove across three states to marry his Mississippi girl. They were married 56 years and had three children, Donna, Barry, and Carrie. During their life together, they called many towns home, including Robert Lee, Sweetwater, Mertzon, San Angelo, and Seguin. Strong in his faith, he was a Christian and a Baptist.

Butch Davis loved his family, but also had a passion for business. His working life began in the Coke County Courthouse; he soon moved on to the retail sector. He was a talented and highly respected businessman. He was happiest meeting and greeting people while walking the aisles of B & W Merchandise and Del-Tex Candy Company. He continued his career as a business owner. He owned and operated grocery stores, restaurants, and other retail operations in San Angelo, Robert Lee, and Bronte. Butch loved his customers, and they loved him. He truly never met a stranger.

After retirement, Butch devoted his life and his time to his family. He and Carolyn traveled throughout the United States together, and time spent on trips in the RV brought him joy. Butch was the kind of father who always had time for his children and grandchildren. He loved long phone conversations and visits, and you could count on him to make you laugh with his quick wit. Butch was fair-minded and an optimist, traits he passed on to his family.

He was civic minded too, receiving recognition from many organizations and clubs he supported along the way. He served as a Director of the West Texas Boys Ranch and was a member of the Robert Lee School Board. He was named the NCWA Candy Distributor of the Year, an award he treasured.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Corena and Emory Davis, and his brothers, Vaughn Davis and Garland Davis.

Butch is survived by his wife, Carolyn Sue Davis, of San Angelo; his children, Donna Pochls of Bronte, Barry Davis and wife Leigh of Southlake, and Carrie Westbrook and husband Bobby of Christoval; his brother, Waymond Copie Davis and wife Jean of Dime Box; his grandchildren, Brandon Pochls

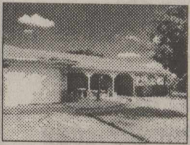

2015 Property Tax Rates in WEST COKE COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT

This notice concerns the 2015 property tax rates for WEST COKE COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual tax rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers start rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

"Meet the Steers" night will



Sheep/Goat event set for San Angelo

What organizers tout as the largest, most comprehensive sheep and goat production educational opportunity in recent times is coming to fruition. A diverse and changing sheep and goat industry will highlight two back-to-back educational opportunities in San Angelo on Friday and Saturday, August 28-29. The venue is actually two events set back-to-back on August 28-29 in San Angelo, said Marvin Ensor, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service regional program leader in San Angelo.

The first of the two is the 42nd Annual Sheep and Goat Field Day conducted by and on the grounds of the Texas A&M AgriLife Research and Extension Center located just north of San Angelo. That event starts with registration at 8 am, followed by the program from 9 am to 1 pm August 28.

The second event is the first ever Texas Sheep and Goat Expo set from 2 pm to 8:30 pm, also on August 28, and again on August 29 from 7 am to 4 pm at the San Angelo Fairgrounds.

"The Texas sheep and goat industry is undergoing tremendous change," Ensor said. "And the AgriLife agencies, AgriLife Extension and Texas A&M AgriLife Research, are staying abreast of those changes. The industry is as diverse now as perhaps it's ever been, so we are offering these events that will specifically target this diversity."

The annual Sheep and Goat Field Day is a long-standing tradition of the AgriLife center dating back to the 1970s. The field day is generally scheduled the first Thursday of each September, but Ensor said both events complement one another so well that planners opted to move the field day to coincide with the expo as a convenience to participants.

The expo is to be a premier state-level event with emphasis on

demonstrations and hands-on activities that will follow the center's August 28 field day. Activities on August 29 will start early at the San Angelo Fairgrounds with a chuck wagon breakfast followed by concurrent sessions featuring the various management and marketing techniques specific to wool breeds, hair sheep, club lamb production and meat goats.
