Ranger Recognized! The Fort Chadbourne Foundation and the Former Texas Rangers Association remembered former Texas Ranger Private Benjamin Goodin Warren with a Ranger Cross during a ceremony Saturday, March 21, 2015, at Fort Chadbourne. Fort Chadbourne Foundation President Garland Richards (above) and Former Texas Rangers Association President Joe B. Davis were among those who addressed the large crowd that braved the rain to attend the ceremony. Ranger Warren died February 10, 1885. He was instrumental in bringing the worst offenders during the fence cutting war to trial and was assassinated in Sweetwater, Texas, the evening before the trial began. Owner of the Chadbourne Ranch and Garland Richard's great-great-great-grandfather, Thomas Odom, brought Ranger Warren's body back to Fort Chadbourne and personally buried him in the cemetery there.



Veteran Runner! Ernie Andrus (second from left), a 91 year old veteran, was accompanied on part of his journey through Coke County Tuesday morning by Carlos Cano of Corpus Christi, Jodie Arrott and Ray Barnett. Andrus began his cross country journey on October 7, 2013, at the Pacific Ocean near San Diego, California, and will run until he comes to the Atlantic Ocean at Brunswick, Georgia. This feat is being undertaken to raise money for the LST 325 SHIP MEMORIAL, INC. Andrus was one of the crew that brought the LST 325 back from the Isle of Crete, Greece to the US in 2000, 2001. One thousand fifty one LSTs were built during World War II. The 325 is the only one left that has been restored and is still operational.

Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor and Citizens of Coke County:

I feel like it is time for the public to be made aware of a serious problem occurring with the ambulance service for Coke County.

The East Coke County Ambulance Service (ECCAS) in Bronte has had three ECA courses in the last four to five years. This course is for anyone interested in being licensed as an Emergency Care Attendant to work on an ambulance.

At the present time, the Blackwell and Robert Lee ambulance services have not been able to get a crew many times when needed. This puts the responsibility on the ECCAS to make runs to cover all of

Coke County. The ECCAS has at least fifteen people who are licensed; however, some are middle aged and employed and others are over 65 years old.

The Cities of Bronte and Robert Lee, as well as the Coke County Commissioners Court, have been notified that in the near future (three to four years) Coke County might need a paid ambulance service. A paid ambulance service is very expensive and a tax burden to property owners.

If it gets to the point where there is no ambulance service in Coke County, the two nursing homes will have a serious problem with the state of Texas. There is a possibility that the nursing homes would have to close if ambulance service cannot be provided. Their closing would be a loss of 90-110 employees.

Now is the time to mention the Coke County Sheriff, Coke County Deputies and Constable Marty Boyd who help when ECCAS makes a run. Also included are both Robert Lee and Bronte Volunteer Fire Departments who respond to accident scenes and helicopter landing zones. Again, I appreciate the people who help ECCAS.


