Livestock Show and Fair set for next weekend

The 77th edition of the Coke County Junior Livestock Show will be held Friday and Saturday, January 15 and 16, 2016, at the Sterling Lindsey Memorial Exhibition Building in Robert Lcc.

This year's show will feature animals in the Market Lamb, Market Goat, Market Swine, Market Steer shows and new this year Market Meat Pen Rabbits, but more importantly, many young exhibitors from around the county.

The Pee-wee show will be held again this year immediately following the Sheep and Goat Shows on Friday evening, January 15 and is open to all children 8 and under who are not 4-H members. Clover bud members are eligible to participate. Participants will need to find a lamb or goat to borrow for the show and sign up at the concession stand during the Sheep and Goat Shows. There will also be a showmanship following the pig show. So if you have a little one interested in showing please come sign up at the concession

In addition to the Junior Livestock Show, classes of competition are open to Coke county residents of any age in the following categories: Art; Photography; AG Mechanics -Metal Works; and Repurpose

Project (trash to treasure).


The county stock show offers the youth of Coke County an opportunity to exhibit their livestock projects which they have worked with for more than 11 months, in many cases.
