## Swine Validation deadline nears

It is once again that time of year to order swine validation tags for FFA and 4-H members planning on exhibiting swine projects at the Coke County Show and the major stock shows.

Any barrow must have a state validation tag to be eligible to enter Fort Worth, San Angelo, San Antonio, Houston, or Austin stock shows. Also, any gilt must have a state validation tag to be able to participate in the CTBR Stars of Texas gilt show at the San Angelo Stock show.

To place your tag order, contact your Agriscience teacher or the Coke County Extension office. The tag order is due by Thursday, September 22, 2016, to the swine validation chairman. Swine validation will be held in November and will be set by the county stock show board of directors.

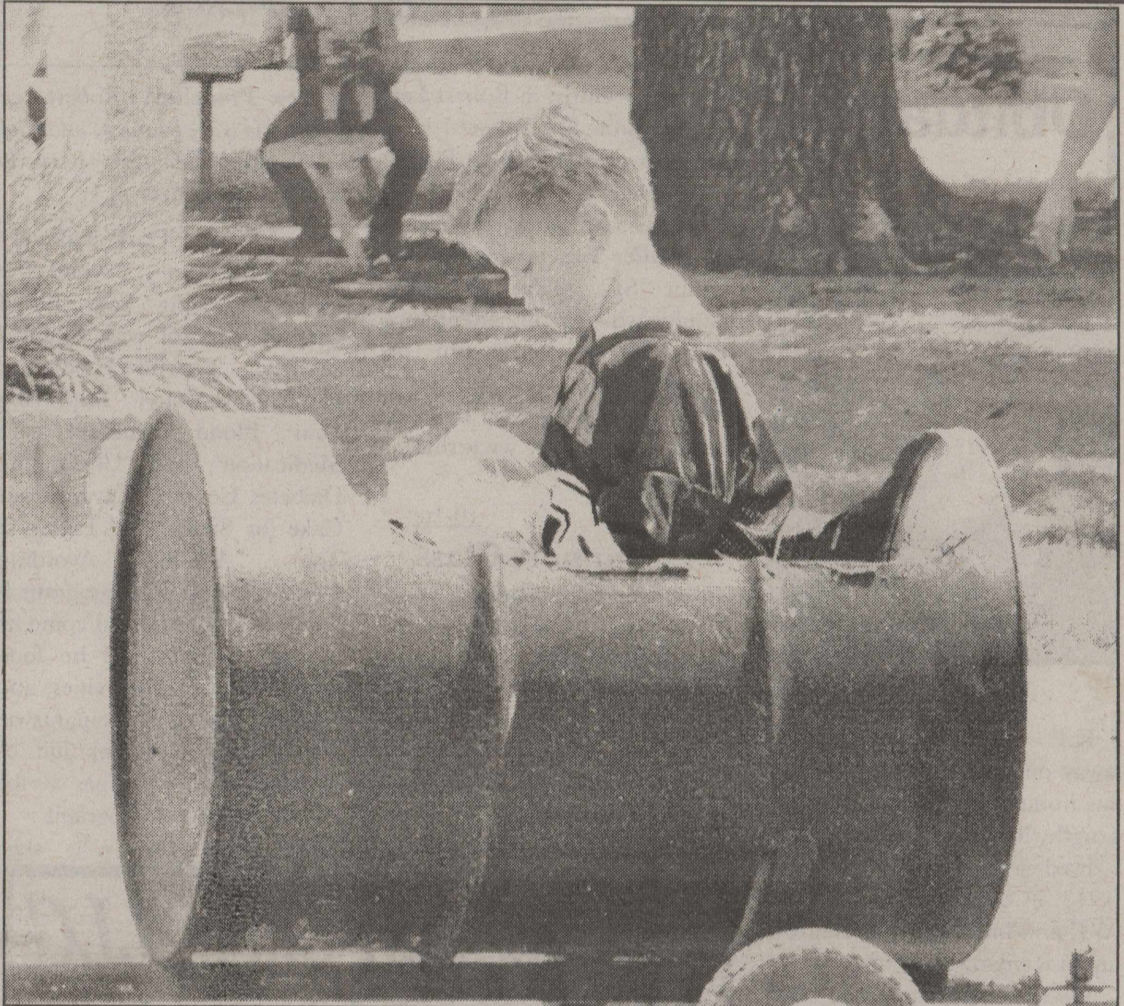

K.F. (Fred) Moore passed away on September 5, 2016, at his home in Robert Lee after a lengthy illness.

Fred was born, August 18, 1943, in San Angelo, Texas, to W.F. and Inez Moore. Fred grew up in Rankin.

Fred served his Country honorably during the Vietnam War where he utilized his welding and construction skills to build a swing set for a South Vietnamese orphanage. Fred was Honorably Discharged from the service in December of 1965.

Fred and Sherriel married in December of 1967. Sherriel's two children were fortunate to be adopted and raised by Fred as though they were his own. Jeremy completed the family in January 1970.

Fred began his career as a welder in the west Texas oilfields. He then spent over a decade working on offshore platforms in Norway, Scotland and Ivory Coast as a Mechanical Maintenance Supervisor. His career continued stateside with stints in Odessa, Pampa and Andrews, Texas. He retired in Artesia, New Mexico in 2005.
