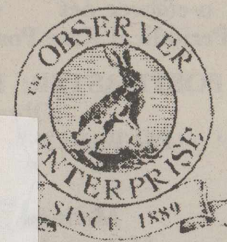

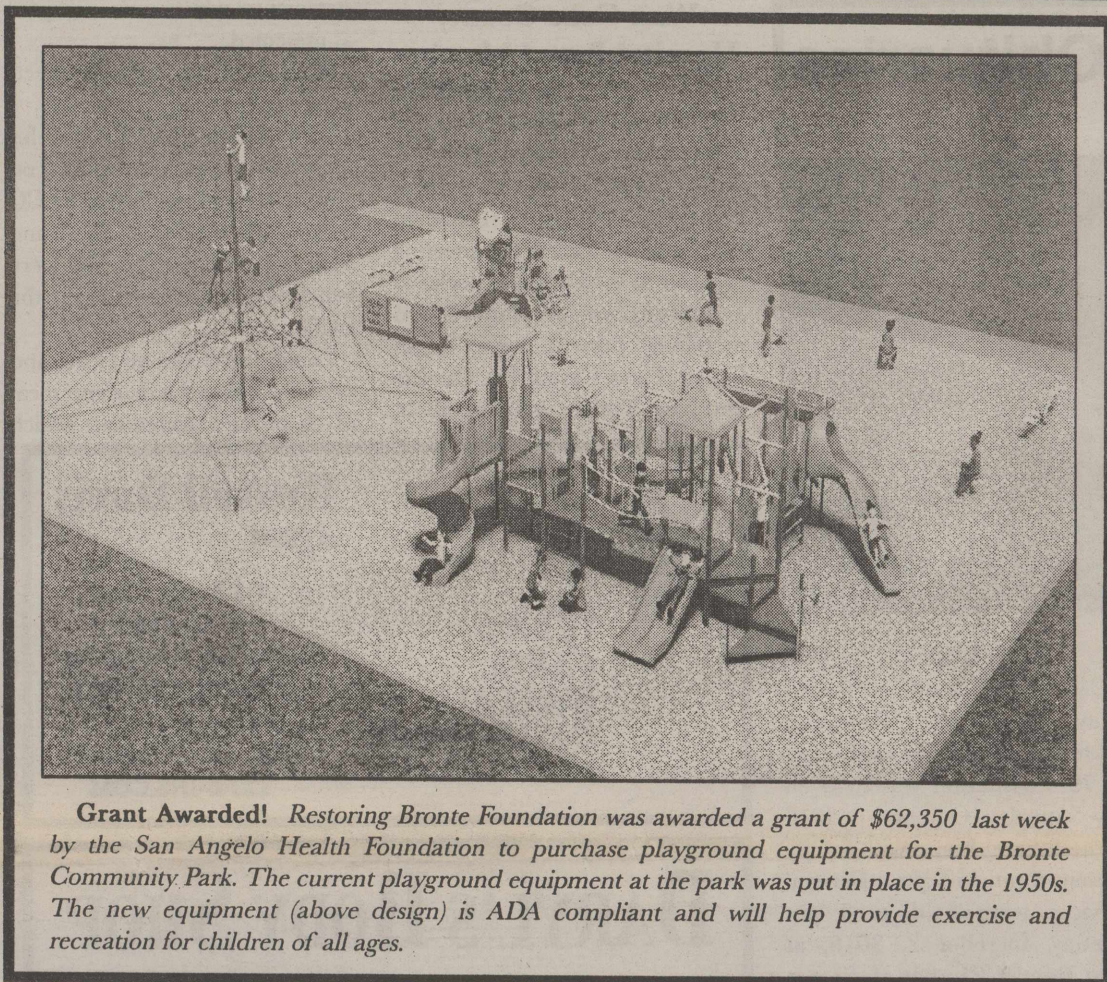
This event is a version of Oktoberfest but with a kick of West Texas added in!

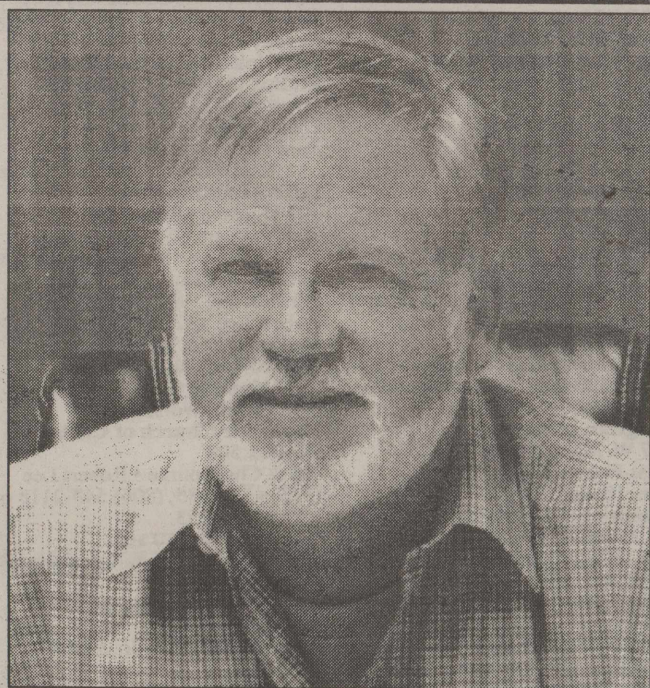
Christmas Cards available for Memorial Park

The Board of Directors of the West Coke County Hospital District met in regular session September 27, 2016. President Pat Stephens called the meeting to order at 9:35 am and declared a quorum was present. Board members present were Sarah Green, Patsy Cason, Pat Carwile and Noel Tinkler. John Rainbolt,

Administrator, and Janie Munoz, BOM, were also present at the meeting. The invocation was given by Patsy Cason. There were no absent Board members from the previous meeting, and the minutes from that meeting were approved. There were 2 visitors, Kristin Chandler and Jerri Janosik.

The census count shows there are currently 29 residents in the facility, with one pending, as of the meeting date.

In the staffing update, it was reported that the facility is fully staffed, with an on-going need for prn nurses and CNA's.

Accounts receivable were discussed, as were the financial statements, which were accepted as presented.

There are no capital projects pending.

The Administrator gave his report. He is currently working on advertising and marketing. RLCC is now fully certified in Music and Memory, which will be very beneficial for residents at the facility.

Lunch break was at 11:30, and everyone enjoyed a delicious meal of tacos and trimmings, which

was the resident's choice meal for the month.

A report was given on building maintenance, and some issues that are currently being addressed as a result of the survey.

Policy and procedures were discussed, as well as employee insurance. John will bring a report to the Board at a later date.

Miscellaneous items such as cell phones, debit cards, and tobacco use were addressed.

The Board voted to give longevity bonuses to employees for 2016.

The Thanksgiving meal in November for residents and guests was discussed and plans formulated for the event.

Future agenda items were discussed and the next regular Board meeting will be October 25 at 9:30 am. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

2016 Conservation Field Day at Fort Chadbourne

The Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) hosted the ninth annual Conservation Field Day on September 21, 2016. The event was co-sponsored by the Natural Resources Conservation Service, Texas Agri-Life Extension, The Coke County Underground Water Conservation District, First National Bank of Sterling City in Bronte, Robert Lee State Bank, Bronte Grocery, Super H, Wal-Mart, Sam's Club, Market Street, and HEB. NRCS personnel from the San Angelo and Ballinger team, the Zone Office, and with the help of volunteers, hosted the learning stations of the outdoor classroom. Students and adults were provided a Conservation Field Day t-shirt and a hotdog lunch.

Bronte and Robert Lee 5th and 6th grade students arrived at Fort Chadbourne, maintained and operated by Garland and Lana Richards, Ann Pate, and Brent Bryan, for their day of hands learning at 9 am. Station 1 was a tour inside the Fort's Visitors Center. Inside, they saddled up sawhorses, learned how little space a stagecoach has to offer, and saw numerous artifacts. The students were eager to learn about life on the fort and some were even able to catch a glimpse of the ground's ghost, Maggie! Ann Pate (above photo) gives more detail to the center's artifacts.

Morgan Runyan, Agri-Life Extension agent, and Kandice Everitt, County Extension Agent-Family and Consumer Science, hauled in the Stream Simulation trailer for Station 2. Mr. Winton Miliff, Underground Water Conservation District, offered his knowledge to this station, as well. Mrs. Runyan spoke with students about how water moves and cuts through the land and erosion. The students were able to carve out their own streams to see how different movement affects the soil. At Station 3, the students spoke with Dr. Travis Arledge of Pioneer Vet Clinic about animal care. He brought along calf fetuses at different stages of development, horse teeth, a calf puller, and what stole the show, a dogs tongue! Dr. Arledge explained the importance teeth health in all pets and livestock and why flea and tick control is so important. The children asked good questions which Dr. Arledge was happy to answer.

Preston Irwin and Aaron Johnson, both NRCS, manned Station 4 teaching students the

Marshall stated earlier in an article during his primary campaign for the Republican candidate as Coke County Commissioner of Precinct 3 that the decrease in our oil valuation could cause a significant loss in revenue for our county. This has happened! In the County General Fund, the valuation decreased \$66,691,000.00. In the County Road and Bridge Fund, the valuation decreased \$66,653,000.00. This was a 20.66% decrease in our county revenue which amounted to a loss in revenue of \$427,324.00 which was needed for a balanced budget.

Marshall also stated in the earlier article that the loss in revenue could cause an increase in our taxes or cause a decrease within. The "decrease within" has happened! The General Fund was cut \$216,127.00. This was not easy and will take some adjustments in the departments. Two of our county road hand positions were cut from the budget. The two Justice of the Peace and Constable precincts will be consolidated into one. One Justice of the Peace's and one Constable's budgets were cut from the budget. The 32 hour a week County Attorney Secretary position was cut from the budget. The 20 hour a week County Extension Agents Secretary position was also cut from the budget. The remainder of the \$211,197 loss in revenue will be taken from the reserve account. The bottom line is that our County Judge and our Commissioners did not increase our taxes. They made difficult decisions with our taxpayers in mind. "I would like to say thank you for a job well done!"

Marshall says "If I am elected as your County Commissioner of Precinct 3, I will work diligently to keep taxes at their lowest, listen to your concerns and keep you informed about our county government."

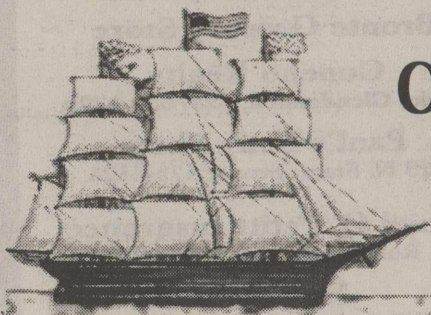

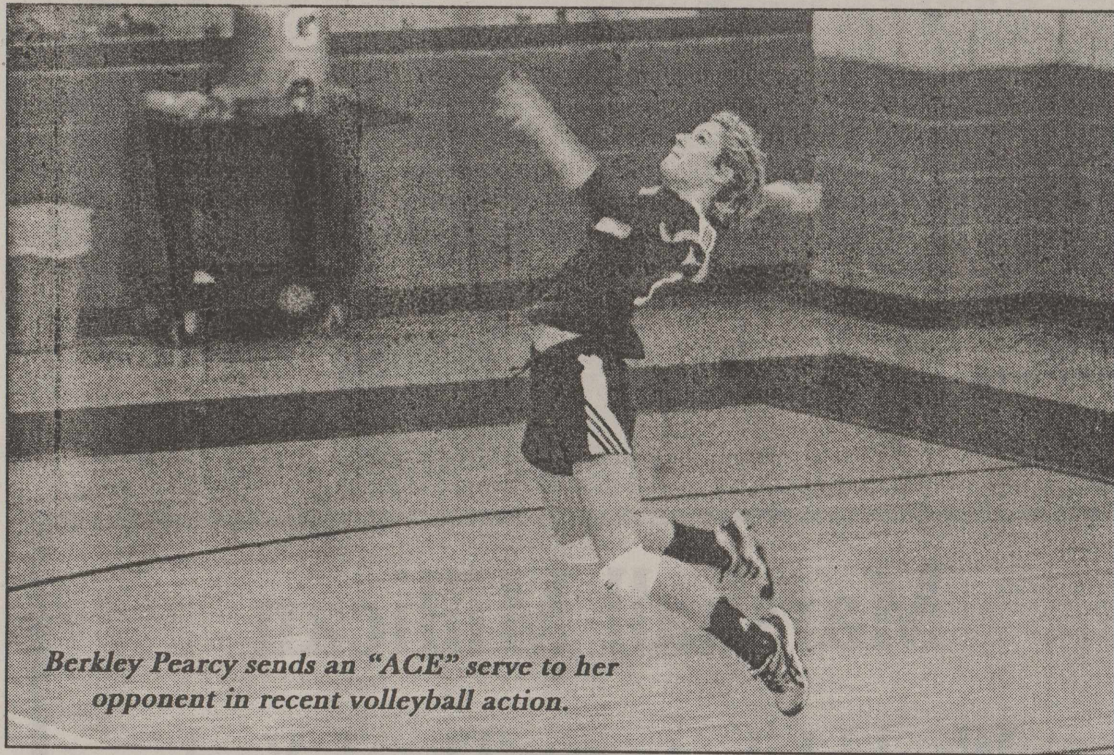

Bronte ISD receives TEA District of Innovation designation

Bronte ISD has received notification that TEA has designated Bronte ISD as a District of Innovation this last week. The concept of a District of Innovation was passed into

legislation during the 84th Legislative session. It allows public school districts, in conjunction with local community members, business members, parents, staff, and the local school board, the flexibility from certain educational guidelines or rules to implement innovated strategies to build an environment to fit the needs of the students in that individual district.

The plan is posted on the District's website, and at the conclusion of 30 days, will be presented to the Board for final approval. The plan is part of a strategy, working alongside the technology plan, being implemented at Bronte ISD to

create a learning environment that can be customized to fit the individual needs of the students. The end product of the "Pathway to Success" initiative, will be an individual graduation plan tailored to the individual student's post-secondary goals.

"We intend in the upcoming months and years, to be able to offer for our students industry recognized certifications, such as EMS, CNA, welding, and technology certifications, and an endless opportunity for rigorous course offerings, such as engineering, business law, and sports medicine, to better prepare our students to be goal oriented, success driven, lifelong learners." Mr. Siler, Superintendent of Bronte ISD. "With this first step behind us on the pathway, along with being designated as a Future Ready School, we have the opportunity to move into the 21st century

with graduates that, no matter what the future may hold for them, will be equipped and confident in their skill sets to be successful in whatever their dream may be."

livestock and how to manage animals with what is growing native on the land. Mr. Irwin explained how animals have adapted their way of eating in West Texas so that some undesirables become a viable food source.

At Station 5, Grant Teplicek and Wade Day, both NRCS, introduced students to the rainfall simulator. The men showed the students how the rain is soaked into the soils. They asked the children about how important the rainfall is to them, explaining how lack of rainfall effects us all. They shared with the student how lack of grass hurts livestock thereby affecting food sources and even the clothes they wear.

Amanda Bragg and Donnie Lunsford, both NRCS, ran Station 6, Soil Types and Healthy Soils. Mr. Lunsford explained and showed the students the different soils and how they differ. Miss Bragg demonstrated clay content by wetting the soil and squeezing it into ribbons, you can measure the clay content in the soil by how long the ribbon is. The children also learned about soil health and why it is important to maintain healthy soil for planting.

After a hotdog lunch, the students broke out into groups once more. One group stayed under the pavilion and the other

loaded up into trailers to visit the buffalo pasture. At the pavilion, Morgan Runyan demonstrated how pollutants affect neighboring wells and aquifers. Each student received an edible aquifer made of gummy bears, ice cream, chocolate syrup, Sprite, and sprinkles. The buffalo pasture tour was a big hit with the children. Their ride brought them face to face with gentle buffalo, longhorn, and a friendly donkey.

All the students, teachers, and volunteers seemed to have enjoyed their day of outdoor learning. As a result, Coke County SWCD is looking forward to planning and hosting next year's event!
