## Early voting begins October 24

Early voting in this year's General Election slated for November 8, 2016, will be held from Monday, October 24, 2016, through Friday, November 4, 2016. Friday, October 28, 2016, is the last day for the clerk to receive an application for a mail-in ballot.

Early voting will be held at the Coke County Courthouse. On election day, voters in Precincts 1 and 3 will vote at the Coke County Courthouse with voters in Precincts 2 and 4 voting at First Baptist Church in Bronte.

There is only one local contested election. Voters must choose between Marshall Millican, Republican candidate, Charles Yorke, Democrat candidate, and Bill Burns, write-in candidate, for Coke County Precinct 3 Commissioner.

Others on the local ballot include Donnie Robertson, Coke County Precinct 1 Commissioner; Constable Precinct 2 Marty Boyd; Nicholas E. Arrott, II, County Attorney; County Tax Assessor/Collector Josie Dean; and County Sheriff Wayne McCutchen.

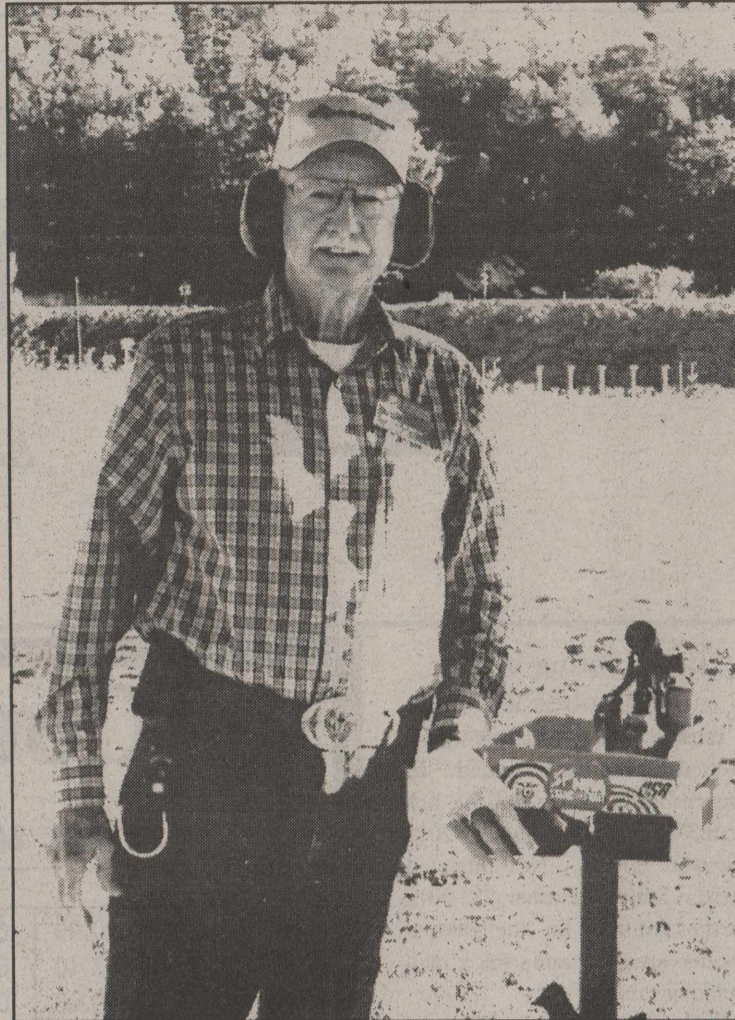
The meeting was adjourned with Gaylon Childers closing with prayer.

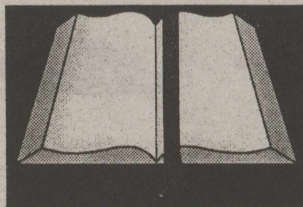

# Marshall Millican Will Continue to Improve Our Community

Marshall has worked faithfully to improve our community for the past 38 years. Many of these years have been spent in law enforcement. While serving as Coke County's Sheriff from 1981 thru 1996 he and one deputy sheriff, stationed in Bronte, held the front line in law enforcement for several years. By the end of his term Marshall was able to secure the position for an additional deputy in Bronte and one in Robert Lee. This improved the safety and quality of life in our community. During this time Marshall worked with the City of Robert Lee, under a contract agreement, to allow the deputies to enforce City ordinances. This made a significant improvement in Robert Lee.

In 2007, Marshall was elected as one of the Coke County Constables. At this time Marshall received his state certification and license as a Code Enforcement Officer. Marshall has worked with the City of Robert Lee, under a contract agreement, to provide the services of Code Enforcement. This has given Marshall the opportunity to make many improvements for Robert Lee. This service includes a multitude of duties. One of the most noticeable improvements in Robert Lee has been the demolition and cleanup of substandard/nuisance structures. This has involved 19 different properties that included 15 residential structures, 4 mobile homes, and 21 accessory structures. Marshall works with the 5 members of the Board of the Property Maintenance Code and Board of Appeals of the City of Robert Lee who met October 4, 2016. With the recommendation from Marshall the Board ordered the demolition of substandard/nuisance structures located on 6 different properties. Many of these cleanups have involved the cooperation and joint efforts with County Commissioners of precincts 1 and 3 and the City of Robert Lee. With the Inner Local Agreement in place with Coke County and the City of Robert Lee, the two entities can continue working together to improve our community.

Marshall says "If I am elected as your County Commissioner for Precinct 3, I will continue working with the City of Robert Lee and for Coke County to improve our community."
