The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service has scheduled a Texas Department of Agriculture private pesticide applicator training for December 15, 2016, at 9 am. The meeting will be at the AgriLife Extension office in Runnels County 608 Sealy Avenue, Suite A, in Ballinger.

"This is not a continuing education unit training," Wieghat said. "This training is specifically for persons seeking a Texas Department of Agriculture private pesticide applicator license."

Wieghat said the license is required in order to purchase and apply restricted-use herbicides and pesticides.

Voting on Producer Referendum to Establish State-Level Grain Indemnity Fund Scheduled December 5 through December 9

Texas grain producers can vote December 5 through December 9, 2016, for a producer referendum that, if approved, would create a refundable assessment of two tenths percent of the gross sales price of the grain in Texas. The assessment would be collected at the "first point" of sale grain buyer in Texas.

Eligible producers can vote at any Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service county office during each office's regular business hours. A mail-in ballot may be requested from TDA no later than December 2, 2016, and postmarked no later than close of business Friday, December 9, 2016.

If passed, the funds would be collected at the "first point of sale" grain buyer when producers sell their grain, and

remit to the Texas Grain Producer Indemnity Board (TGPIB). The rules adopted by the TGPIB set an assessment of two tenths percent of the gross sales price of the grain.

The TGPIB will set the minimum fund balance necessary to cover all anticipated administrative and operating costs, as well as a reasonable estimate for indemnity claim payments. Once the fund reaches an amount determined by the TGPIB as sufficient to cover the risk, a refund process will be initiated to refund assessments. The fund is managed by the TGPIB. This money will not be a part of the State Treasury, and can only be used for the indemnity fund program.

If producers pass the referendum, the fund will be managed by grain producers and industry stakeholders, a council appointed by the Texas Commissioner of Agriculture, and includes a representative from the Corn Producers Association of Texas, Texas

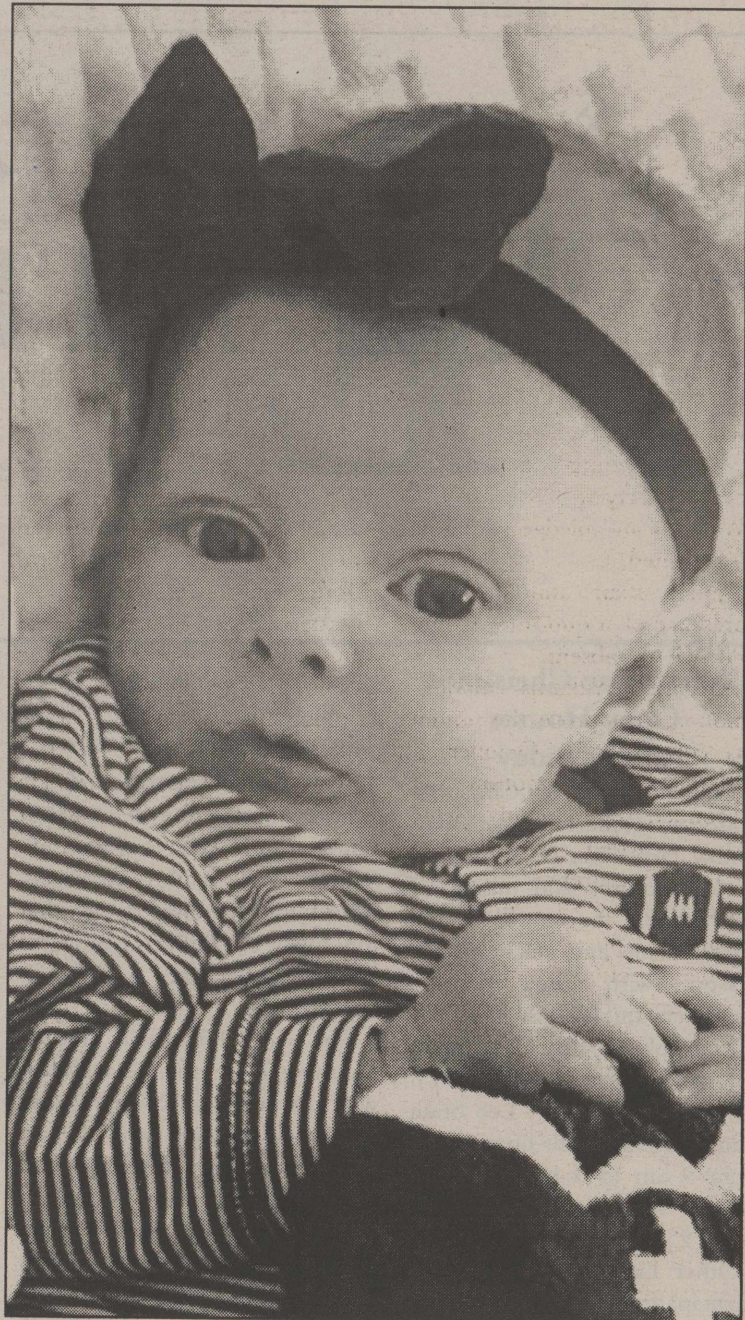

Agricultural Cooperative Council, Texas Farm Bureau, Texas Grain and Feed Association, Texas Grain Sorghum Producers Association, Texas Soybean Association and Texas Wheat Producers Association, as well as a member with expertise in production agriculture financing and a representative with the non-warehouse grain buying industry.

Any grain producer regardless of age who has sold grain in Texas anytime between December 5, 2013, and December 5, 2016, is eligible to vote.

A producer may be an individual or legal business entity, such as a corporation, LLC, LLP, or LP. Each producer (individual and/or legal business entity) may only vote once. Youth younger than 16 years of age must have a parent or guardian co-sign the ballot.

If approved, collection of the



assessment will begin February 1, 2017, and continue until the TGPIB notifies collection points to cease collection. For more information, including voting locations and hours, visit www.texasagriculture.gov.

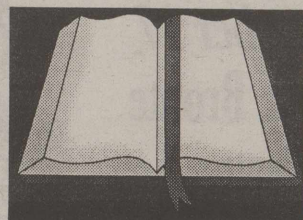

Commissioners Court minutes posted

The Coke County Commissioners Court met in regular session November 9, 2016, at the courthouse in Robert Lee. Members of the court present included County Judge, Roy Blair, Commissioner, Pct. #1 Gene Montgomery, Commissioner, Pct. #2 Paul Williams, Commissioner, Pct. #4 Joe Sefcik. Clerk Mary Grim was also in attendance.

The meeting opened with prayer given by Comm. Williams and pledge to the flag was recited.

Judge Blair announced the presence of a quorum. Comm. Pitcock was absent.

Comm. Williams made a motion to approve the minutes as corrected for October 25, 2016. The motion was seconded by Comm. Sefcik. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's Report was presented by Treasurer Hal Spain. Comm. Montgomery made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report. The motion was seconded by Comm. Williams. Motion carried.

The Extension Reports were given by Agent Morgan Runyon. Sheriff Wayne McCutchen presented his report.

Tax Collectors Report was presented by Tax A/C deputy Randi Hardesty.

County/District Clerk Mary Grim presented her report. She also reported on the election.

Constable Precinct 1 Marshall Millican presented his report.

Constable Precinct 2 Marty Boyd's report was presented by Judge Blair.

Justice of the Peace Jackie Walkers report was presented by Judge Blair.

Justice of the Peace Pct. 2's report was presented by Judge Blair.

The D.R. Report was presented by Judge Blair. There was no activity.

The Trappers Reports was unavailable.

No action taken on the burn ban.

Comm. Montgomery made a motion to approve the request from Frontier Communications to construct a communication line within the right-of-way located in the North Row of Silver Loop, along an existing copper telecommunications cable route 17,356 feet South of the intersection of Silver Loop and FM 1672, about 15 feet East of the existing drive to 1700 Silver Loop, within 3 feet of the North Row. The motion was seconded by Comm. Sefcik. Motion carried.

The rental prices for the County Recreation Halls, Senior

Citizen Buildings and Pavilions were discussed by the Court. This item was tabled for another meeting after the Court has done some research.

Comm. Williams made a motion to approve the Courthouse Holiday Schedule for Year 2017. The motion was seconded by Comm. Montgomery. Motion carried.

Judge Blair made a motion to approve the Coke County Resolution Indigent Defense Grant Program. The motion was seconded by Comm. Montgomery. Motion carried.

Judge Blair will call to question Jason Clinton about the invoice. No action taken.

Judge Blair reported that he will be gone November 15th-18th for school in Corpus. He also reminded everyone about the Employee Appreciation Dinner on December 12th.

Comm. Williams reported that he has 70 miles of road destroyed.

County Agent Morgan Runyon invited the court members for breakfast December 13th and that December 19th there is a meeting for Judges and Commissioners.

There being no private road work requests no action was taken.

Comm. Williams made a motion to pay bills with the exception of SKG. The motion was seconded by Comm.

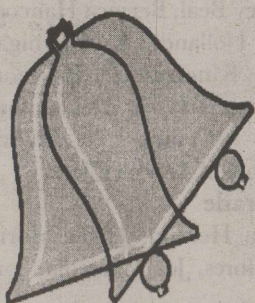
"The Texas Department Agriculture mandates individuals must complete this required training before they are able to test for a private applicator pesticide license, which is also obtained through that agency," he said.

Individual registration is due upon arrival. To ensure the

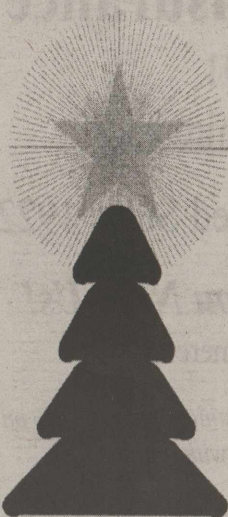
correct amount of study materials are ordered, pre-registration is required by December 8. Pre-register by calling the AgriLife Extension office in Runnels County at 325-365-5042.

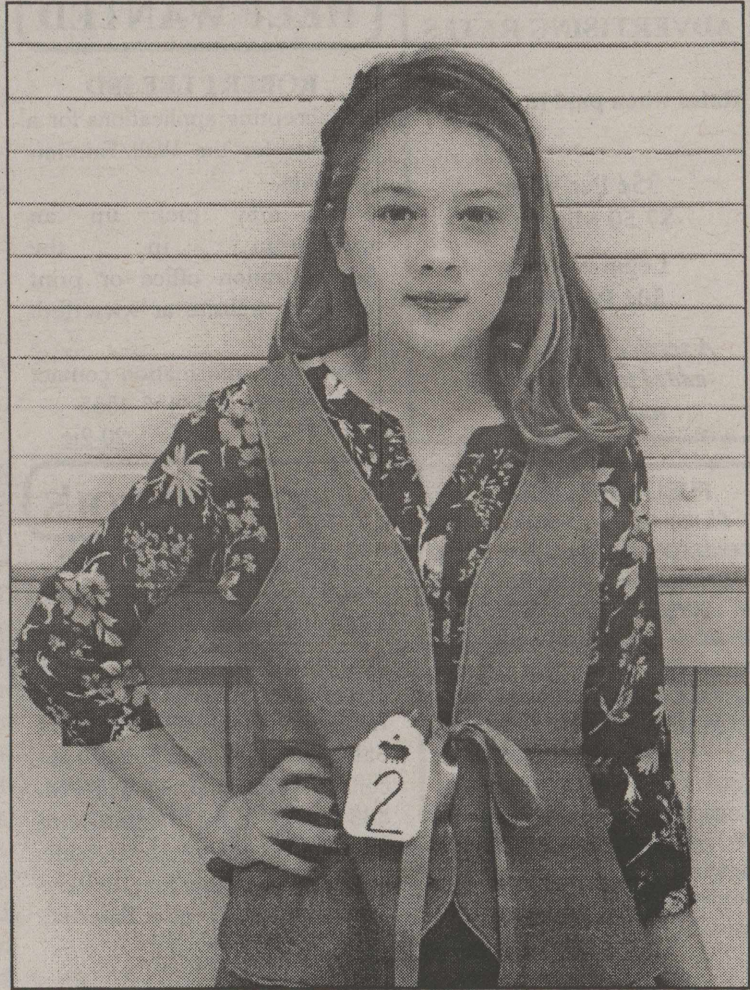

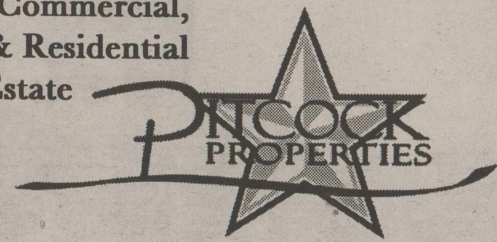

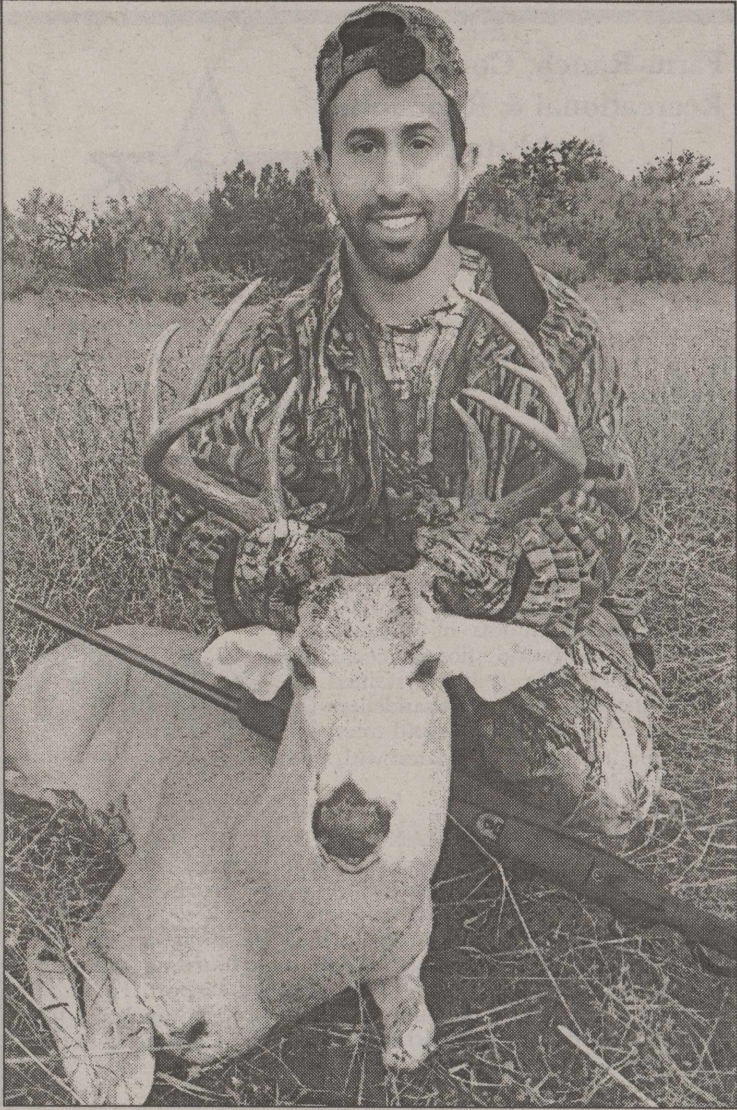
