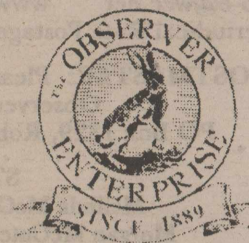

Entries to be taken for annual Livestock Show and Fair

The Coke County Livestock Show and Fair is not just a showcase for youngster's animal projects. There are divisions for photography, art, ag mechanics, re-purposed projects (trash to treasure), and a pie contest.

Age divisions include: Kindergarten - 2nd grade; 3rd - 5th grades; 6th - 8th grades; 9th - 12th grades; and adults.

Entries will be accepted Thursday, January 19, 2017, between 4 pm and 6 pm and again on Friday, January 20, from 1 pm until 3 pm at the Rec Hall in Robert Lee. Entries for the pie contest will be accepted from 1 pm to 3 pm Friday, January 20, 2017, only.

Entry forms will be available at the Rec Hall. If entries need to be dropped off earlier than the posted times, arrangements will need to be made with the Extension Office by calling (325) 453-2461.

Rules for the Photography division are: photos must be 8x10 (may be mounted, but not required); only two entries per category; entry card must be filled out and attached to back of each photo; and all entries must be original photography of entrant.

Art entries may be any size and categories will be determined by entries.

Projects in the ag mechanics

division may be handmade by the entrant.

At least fifty percent of the re-purpose project must come from repurposed materials.

Recipes must accompany each pie entry. Pies will be used as desserts at the Buyers BBQ lunch on Saturday, January 21.

All entries must be picked up at the Rec Hall between 2 pm and 4 pm Saturday, January 21, 2017.

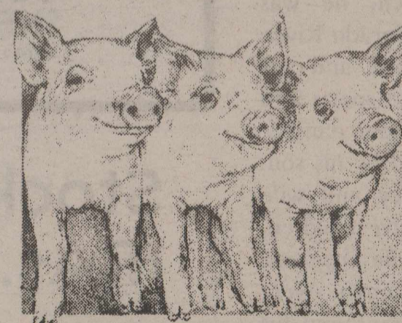

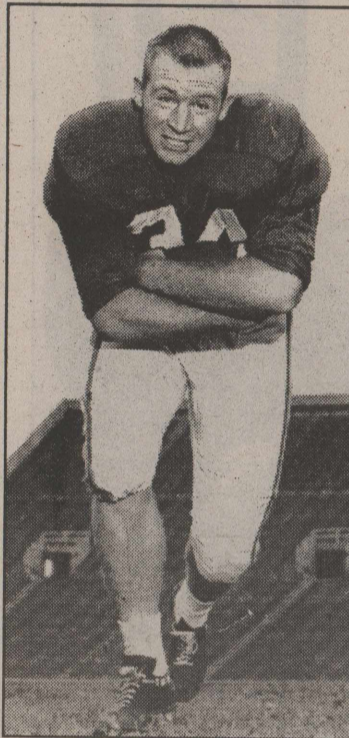

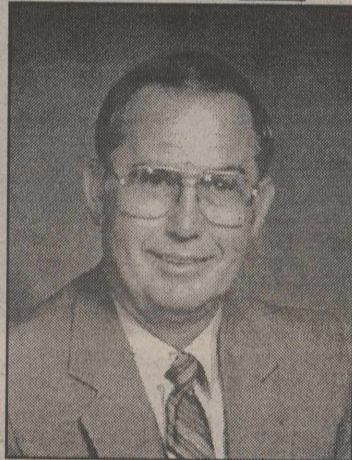

Scott

Horace "Scotty" Lamont Scott, Jr., Lt. Col (Ret), USAF went to be with the Lord on December 17, 2016, at his beloved ranch surrounded by family, friends and pets.

Scotty was born on June 6, 1923, to Horace and Leola Scott in Bronte, Texas. In 1945, Scotty married the love of his life, the former Mary Watson, of Alexander Nebraska.

Scotty attended Robert Lee High School and played football at Tarleton State University, under the great coach Gen. James Earl Rudder, one of World War II's foremost heroes. He then attended Texas Christian University on a

football scholarship. After Pearl Harbor, he joined the Army Air Force and was stationed at Concho Army Air Field in San Angelo. In 1944, Scotty graduated as a 2nd Lt. with his pilot wings at Brooks Air Field in San Antonio. He left the U.S. Air Corps in October 1945. He opened a Barqs Root Beer bottling plant and raised Quarter Horses in Del Rio, Texas. Scotty was recalled to active duty in 1953, when the strategic Air Command expanded to 137 Wings. With over 6,000 pilot hours, in 17 types of aircraft, from single engine to the 6 engine B-47 Bomber, 156 trans-oceanic crossings, he often said God was his copilot. His military decorations include the Air Medal which he was awarded for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flights in the combat zones of Southeast Asia.

After his retirement in 1970, Scotty returned to Robert Lee and established the Flying H Ranch. He was one of the first to introduce Beefmaster cattle to West Texas. He served the community in several capacities to include President of the Robert Lee-Silver Lions Club, President of the Mt. Creek Golf Club, Executive Board member and Wagon Boss of West Texas Boys Ranch and Director of Coke County Farm Bureau.

Scotty was a loving husband, father and grandfather who devoted his life to his family, country and friends. He was a

true gentleman and lived a full and rewarding life. His incredible spirit will live in our hearts forever. He said of his life, "It has been a good ride."

Preceding him in death were his parents, sister, Christine Roach; and wife, Mary Scott.

He is survived by his daughters, Sharon Simons and husband Mark; Marilyn Sneed and husband Sam; grandchildren, Kerry Bitterman, Jennifer Greyard, Jessica Hoopes, Michelle Hoopes, John Simons and Scott Simons; great grandchildren, Elizabeth Bitterman, Simon Bitterman, Jordan Greyard, Taylor Greyard and Tommy Greyard.

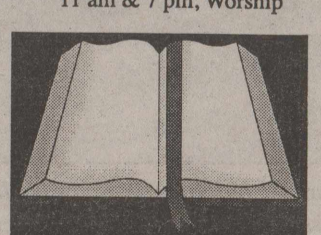

Just a bit of information for you to consider:

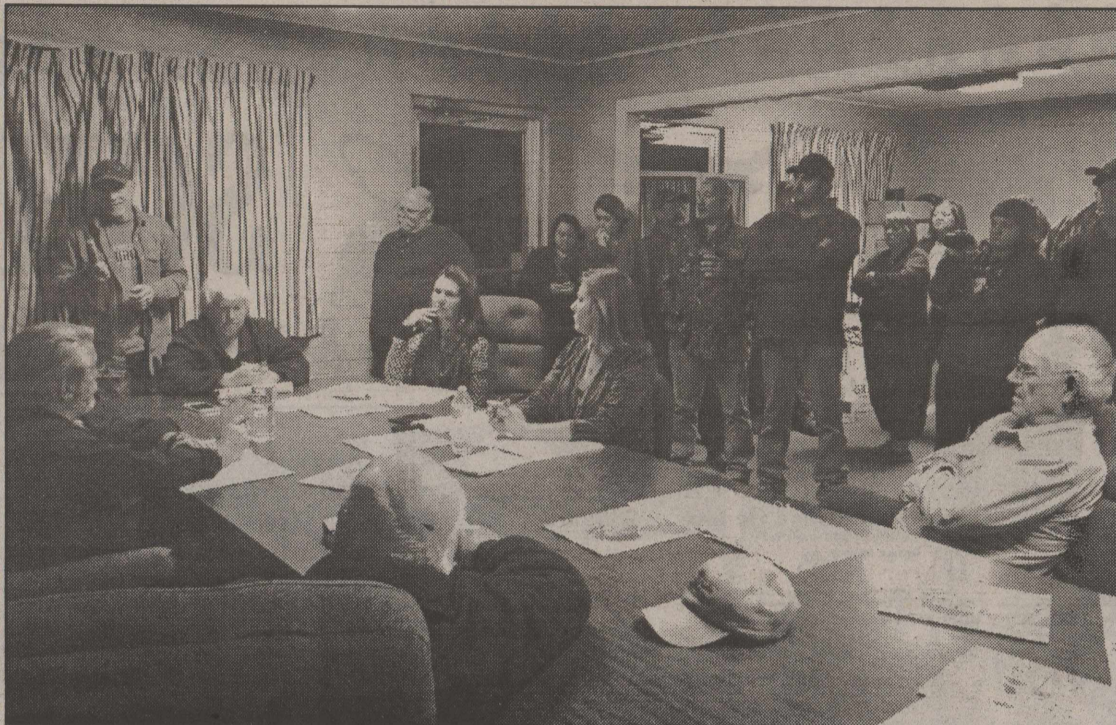

Those in attendance were: Board Members - Shane Kelton, David McWright, Nick Arrott, Blake Braswell, John Seales, Josh Schoenfield; Administration - Tim Siler, Josh Barton, Susan Henderson; and guests Heather Middleton, Maureen Youngblood, and Jodi Arrott.

The meeting was opened at 7:02 pm with a prayer by Blake Braswell.

A quorum was established at 7:02 pm with six members present. Ashley Braswell was absent from the meeting.

Minutes of the previous meeting were presented and read. A motion to approve the

Field Trip! Blackwell Junior High students toured the INVENERGY facilities at Turkey Track Ranch on December 12, 2016. During the tour students manipulated cameras used to monitor the generators and housings. They also worked the Infrared cameras used to monitor heat levels and detect possible problem sources before the problem destroys the windmill equipment. In addition to these activities, students were taught about electrical connections and how to detect problems with the various lines used to conduct electricity. The workers at INVENERGY allowed the students to suit up in the safety harness used when climbing the towers and to walk through a simulated climb. To round out the trip, the students accepted a donation for BCISD.

October 8, 2016, minutes as presented was made by David McWright, seconded by Nick Arrott. The motion passed.

A motion to approve the bill listing for October as presented was made by Blake Braswell and seconded by David McWright. The motion passed.

There were no audience items.

Principal's Report

A. Update on Student Activities:

Mr. Barton went over the current sporting activities including the end of the football season, the volleyball playoffs this weekend in San Angelo and the start of basketball practices this week. Upcoming student activities include the fall festival scheduled tomorrow from 5 pm to 7 pm, Veterans's day Friday and final exams for the second-six weeks.

B. Student Counts:

Mr. Barton went over current BISD student counts. As of October 1st, BISD has 260 total students including 135 in elementary and 125 in jr. high and high school.

Attendance is holding at 97.04% for the current month.

Superintendent's Report

A. Financial Report

Mr. Siler advised that the budget for the current school year appears to be on-track, with two areas that should be monitored closely. These two areas, which are better defined below, have higher expenses than normal this early in the year.

The forecast for the future budgets over the next three years seems to predict a shortfall of up to \$300,000 if the legislature continues as indicated, and BISD's student enrollment maintains as predicted. Mr. Siler cautioned that this is a just a forecast and can change but this possibility should be considered moving forward. Mr. Siler plans to bring the marketing plan next month. This plan is intended to increase future enrollment and revenue.

B. Facilities Update

Function 51 regarding facilities maintenance includes ~\$3,700 in HVAC repairs so far this year. This is more than previously expected and should be monitored moving forward.

C. Transportation Update

The district has expended ~\$4,300 in bus repairs under Function 34 - student transportation. The district has resolved some long-standing maintenance issues with some of the busses and these repairs were costly. The hope is that the permanent fixes will alleviate the continuous minor repairs we have had.

Mr. Barton presented the new District Improvement Plan for 2016-2017. After some discussion, Josh Schoenfield made a motion to approve the plan as presented. The motion was seconded by David McWright. The motion passed.

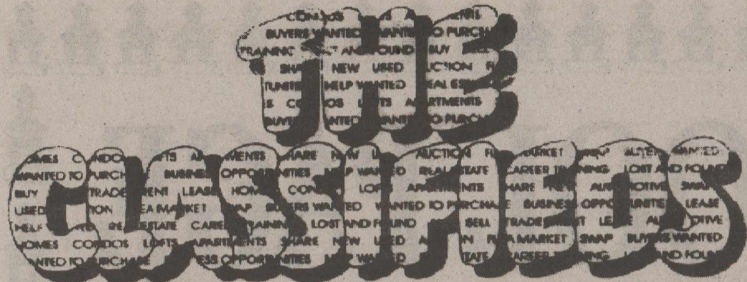

Commissioner Sitton weighs in on EPA Lawsuit Regarding Oil and Gas Waste Disposal

Texas Railroad Commissioner Ryan Sitton has issued a statement regarding the court decision in a civil complaint filed against the EPA: Civil Action No. 1:16-cv-842, which was filed on May 4, 2016. The court decision, announced Dec. 28, directs the EPA to review and update its regulations on oil and gas waste disposal.

In July of 2016, Commissioner Sitton sent a letter to EPA Administrator Gina McCarthy explaining that no additional federal regulation is needed in this area to protect the public and environment and asking EPA not to collude with environmentalists by settling the case.

Commissioner Sitton issued the following statement on the

decision:

"We have hundreds of rules in place at the Railroad Commission specifically to safeguard the public and the environment from any potential risks associated with oil and gas waste disposal. There is no rational basis for EPA to layer additional bureaucracy on top of our regulation of oil and gas waste disposal rules. As stated in my letter to the EPA, at the Railroad Commission we take our duty to regulate these processes seriously and have stringent requirements and comprehensive rules in place to ensure there are no harmful releases.

"The decision by EPA to settle caters only to environmental groups and adds unnecessary, burdensome regulation to an already suffering energy industry and economy. I am confident

that the incoming presidential administration will put an end to this "sue and settle" approach to regulation, stop this type of political gamesmanship and base future decisions on sound science and data, as we do at the Railroad Commission."

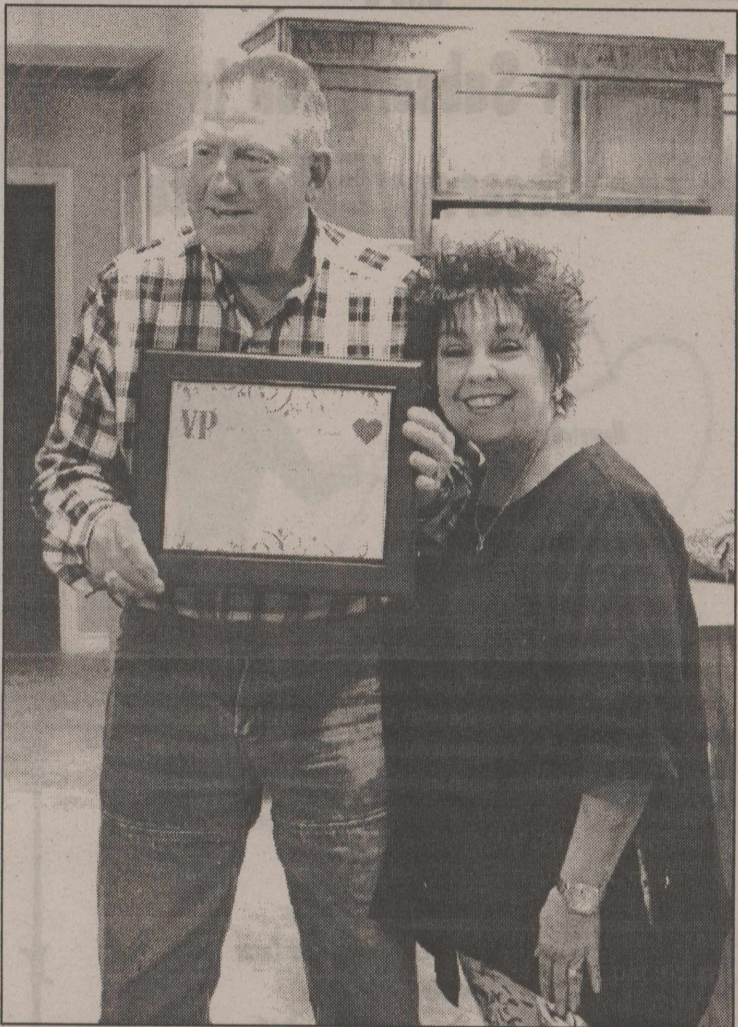
