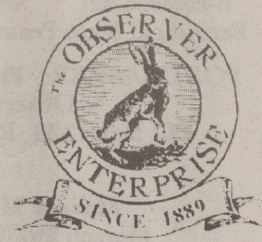

Letter to the Editor

Editor:

If you are tired of your property taxes constantly going up, then this message is for you. In the special called session of the Texas Legislature, we finally have a chance to fix at least part of the problem.

First, some background information. In the Texas Constitution, the County Tax Assessor-Collector was an elected position, so that he would be held accountable to the voters. But in the 1980's, SB 621 was introduced into the Texas Legislature. The bill itself was not so bad; it was designed to consolidate all the separate taxing entities- school, hospital, etc.- into one central appraisal entity. The problem came with the way it was implemented. It allowed an appointed state board to dictate to the counties how they had to set their appraisal values. The state board then took it upon themselves to demand that all the counties re-appraise all their properties. At the time I was president of our Farm Bureau, and another member approached me with some concerns about possible results. So we did some research on the subject, went to Austin where we met with the Farm Bureau attorney, and went to work fighting it. In an open meeting, I asked the appointed head of the state property tax board three times where in the law it gave him the authority to tell every county that all their property had to be re-appraised. His sole excuse was that it didn't specifically say that in the law; he just thought it needed to be done. We lost the battle to amend SB 621, and of course everyone's values and taxes went up. Once a bureaucracy is created, it is impossible to dismantle, because bureaucrats are hired or appointed rather than elected, they do not have to answer to the voters, and

their main function is to see that their positions are perpetuated, so they make their rules and claim "it's the law."

For years the Tax Assessor-Collector position consisted of two people in one office. Now the Assessor (appraiser) - Collectors are at least six people in two offices, complete with computers and technology they were told they had to upgrade to match the bigger counties so they could be more "efficient." The Appraiser is hired by a board whose members are appointed. That makes the position twice removed from the voters. Not only that, they all have to go to Austin to be "certified" as qualified to do their job and educated on how to "legally" take money from the public. On top of that, the State Property Tax Board visits the County Appraiser regularly and tells her that she has to raise their appraisal values to match the other counties, or they will revoke her license and thus cause her to lose her job. Either that, or money will be taken away from the school district. (If we did that, it would be considered blackmail; how can the bureaucrats get away with it?)

The Tax Assessor-Collector's office claims that they don't raise the tax rate. But when the appraised value of your property goes up, and the inflation rate is factored in, your taxes will naturally go up. So we now have what our Founding Fathers objected to: taxation without representation. The only thing you can do about it is to file a protest and appear before the Appraisal Review Board, which is basically a waste of time. In some counties, the board members either are employed by some branch of the government or they draw government retirement, so naturally since they are feeding

from the public trough they won't be inclined to lower the tax rates. All they do is look at the information you bring and decide that they can't change the appraisal value because "it's the law."

What needs to happen is this: we need to do away with the State Property Tax Board and get the control of the tax appraisals back into the electorate so the voters will once again have some say in what happens. Mineral appraisal values need to be set based on what was actually produced in the previous year, with allowance made for depletion, not based on some big city firm's formula for what they think is under the ground. (If a well is plugged, it ceases to have any appraisal value.) Ag values need to be set based on what farmers and ranchers in our area can actually produce, instead of on what someone in Austin thinks. The special session of the Texas Legislature is supposed to address the property tax code. Please contact your State Representative, your State Senator, and Governor Abbott, and ask them to stand with us and get the runaway tax appraisals out of the hands of appointed bureaucrats and back into the hands of the citizens.

Ag leases to be covered in workshops

After such a positive response last year, four new Rancher Leasing Workshops covering grazing, hunting and livestock leases are scheduled across the state by the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service.

The free programs are funded by the Southern Extension Risk Management Education Center, said Tiffany Dowell Lashmet,

AgriLife Extension agricultural law specialist in Amarillo.

"Last year, 100 percent of participants said they would recommend these programs to a friend, so we decided to offer them in more locations," Lashmet said.

The schedule will be:

- Aug. 22, noon-4 p.m., Texas A&M AgriLife Research and Extension Center, 1102 E. Farm-to-Market Road 1294, Lubbock.

- Sept. 1, 8:30 a.m.-1 p.m., Hildebrand Equine Complex, 3240 F&B Road, College Station.

- Sept. 19, 8:30 a.m.-1 p.m., AgriLife Extension office for Frio County, 400 S. Pecan St., Pearsall.

- Oct. 19, 8:30 a.m.-1 p.m., Tom Green 4-H Center, 3168 N. U.S. Highway 67, San Angelo.

Lashmet said lunch will be provided by two sponsors: Ag Workers Insurance for the Lubbock, College Station and San Angelo programs, and Security State Bank for the Pearsall program.

Participants will need to RSVP at least one week before the meeting they will attend to Kim Garcia, 806-677-5626 or kim.garcia@ag.tamu.edu.

Each workshop will address the legal risks associated with agricultural leases, Lashmet said. The goal is to educate

landowners and producers on the importance of utilizing written leases as a risk management tool.

Joining Lashmet on the program will be AgriLife Extension economists from around the state.

"We will discuss the potential legal implications of failing to have a sufficient written lease and the potential legal issues and litigation that the development of written leases can help avoid," she said. "The workshops will also familiarize participants with key terms and provisions that should be considered in lease negotiations."

Participants will receive a leasing handbook that covers legal issues, designing lease payment structures and calculating payments, landowner liability, as well as checklists and sample lease forms for negotiating lease agreements.

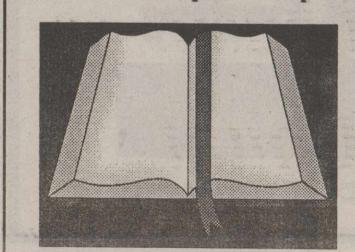

This week, we are highlighting a few of the offices of our county government. The table above shows the relationship between the voters and the officials.

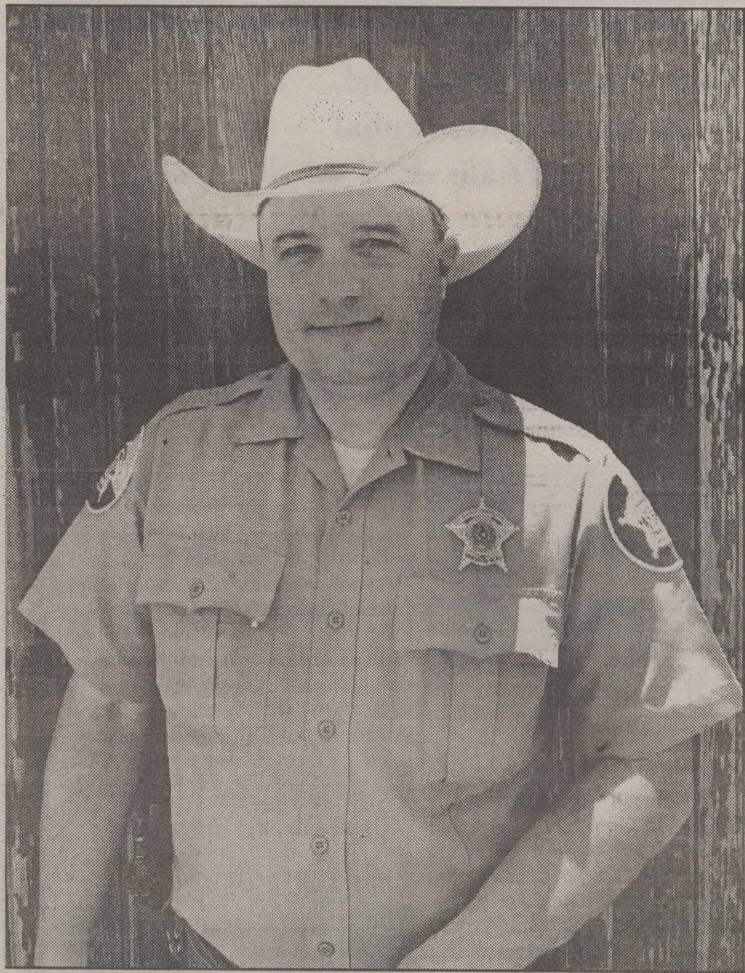
Sheriff Wayne McCutchen Elected to Office in 2008

The sheriff is the chief law enforcement officer in the county and has a range of duties that include criminal investigations, traffic enforcement, and operation of the jail, including the safekeeping of inmates and operation of the jail commissary. The sheriff also provides security for the courthouse, including the county and district courts, assists with service of subpoena and other process and accepts bail for prisoners in his custody. In a county without a Bail Bond

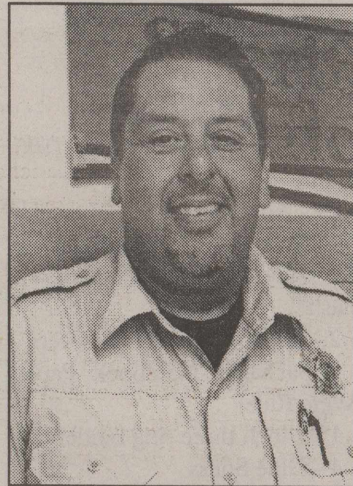
Board, the Sheriff sets bail bond policy for the county. Finally, the sheriff may conduct sales of forfeited property, property being sold at auction for failure to pay property taxes and property sold to satisfy judgments in civil cases. As with all elected county officials, the sheriff has ultimate authority over the operations of the office, including the authority to hire and fire personnel and direct their daily activities. The sheriff also has authority to determine how to use all other resources allocated to the office during the budget process.



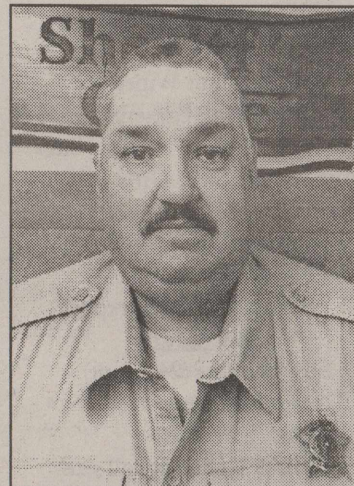
