Mrs. ONeal makes opening address at Historical meet

Mrs. Ben G. ONeal, widow of the late Ben G. ONeal, who sponsored the restoration of Fort Belknap, gave the opening address at a meeting of the Fort Belknap Historical Society at Fort Belknap Saturday.

Highlights of the program were book reviews, a play, and a performance by the Midwestern University Pershing Rifles Drill Team.

Dr. John Stevens, professor of history at TWC, and Judge Rennee Allred of Bowie, announced a list of gifts of various historical documents to the society. These included a volume of the Texas Colonists, 1821-1836, a facsimile of the Fort Belknap memorial, and a catalog of military goods and landmarks of Austin.

The play which concerned a journey made by a Mrs. A. S. Johnson from Missouri to Fort Belknap, was presented by the drama department of TWU. Mason Johnston, professor of drama and speech at TWU, directed the production, assisted by Cecil Cole. Mrs. Johnston traveled from Missouri to Texas by coach in 1885, and kept a vivid and humorous record of the journey in her journal. The play was written by Mrs. E. E. Clock of Burk Burnett, a member of the writers department of the Wichita Falls Woman's Forum.

Dr. Kenneth Neighbours, professor of history MU, reviewed the book, "The Frontiers of Northwest Texas, 1846-1876" by Dr. R. N. Richardson, who is professor emeritus of HSU and is currently professor of history there. He is frequently referred to as the "Dean of Texas Historians."

Reports were given by members of the Fort Belknap Junior Historians from Stephens county by Mack Cook, Kay Thornton, Gary Coleman and Kathy Anderson.

Mrs. Barbara Ledbetter, Young County historian and Fort Belknap assistant archivist, reviewed her book on the Fort. State Senator Geo. Moffett of Chillicothe talked about the television series "Bonanza."

More than 200 people from all parts of the state attended the affair, and those included W. R. Conger, director of local history and genealogy of Dallas county, Robert Gill, a Fort Worth historian and Dr. Law Sone, president of TWC.

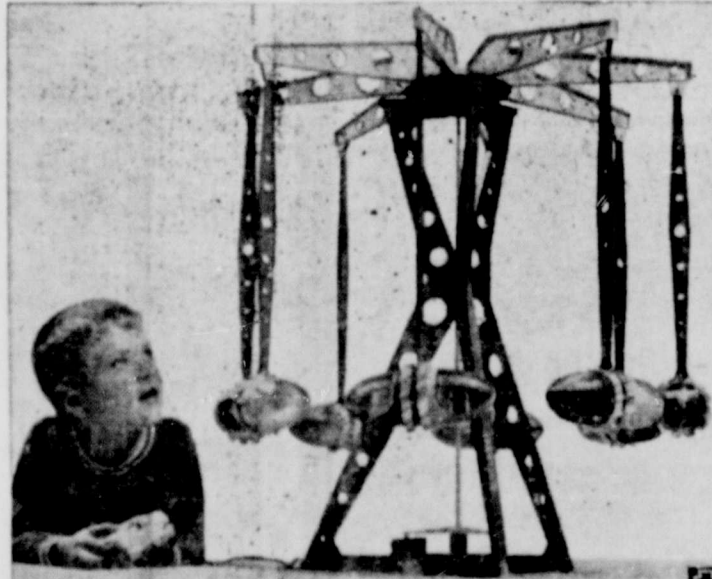
