## Governor John Connally will be in Olney March 31 to launch Industrial Week

Olney Manufacturing Company will be dedicated Tuesday, March 31, with Governor John Connally participating in one of the first events of Texas Industrial Week. J. M. (Joe) Hagggar Jr., executive vice-president of Hagggar Company, announced today.

The Terrell ranch was composed of some 2000 acres, with 300 acres in cultivation. Terrell run 400 head of stock, cattle and 400 head to feed out for the market. He had 500 head of choice steers bought in Old Mexico on his Whiskey Creek Ranch in Young Co. He was married in 1873 to Miss Nannie Penn of Dallas Co. Eight children were born to this union. George W. Terrell was the first president of the First State Bank in Newcastle. He passed away in 1911. Ben W. Waters was active in ranching in Denton county where he built up a herd of 1500, but at the end of the civil war, Mr. Waters found his cattle had all been stolen. He had been living in Young county for some years where he had valuable holdings in land and cattle. He owned a ranch of 7000 acres on Little Salt Fork of the Brazos. He run some 3000 head on this ranch. He had 17,712 acres of pasturage in Crockett county. He kept about 50

Today's teachers must stimulate clear and creative thinking and awaken in students a sense of responsibility, as well as respect for and tolerance toward their fellow citizens. She suggested that the accent be shifted to teaching more principles and fewer techniques, since techniques change rapidly.

Mrs. Alene Hankins of Newcastle stated that today's young people need adults who will help free them from mounting pressures. Teachers are in a position to do much in preparing children for society. She said, day in and day out, teachers can enlighten and strengthen, or poison and mutilate.

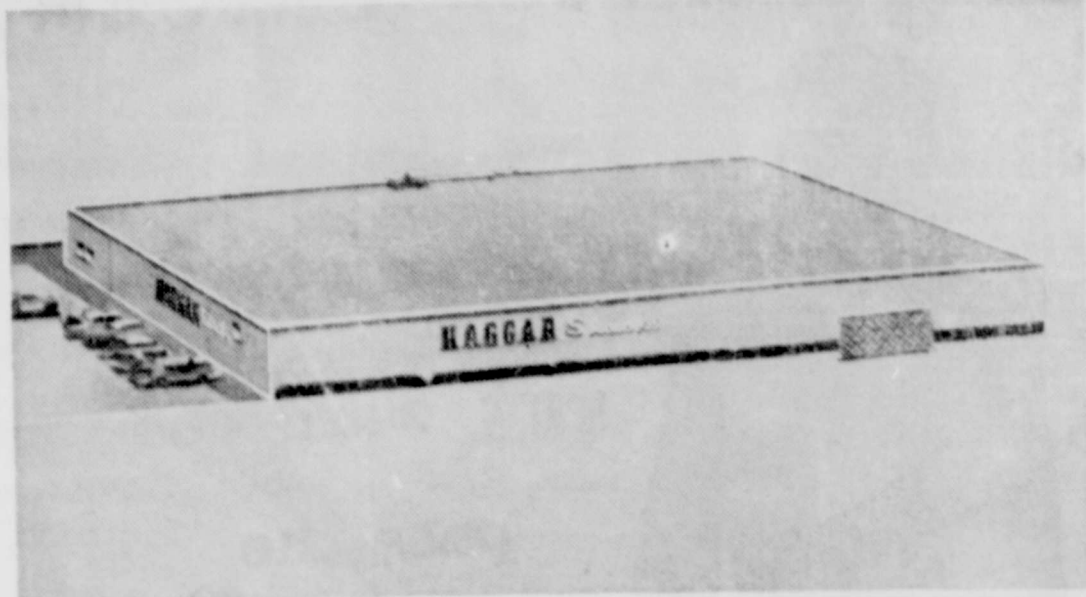
