## Bobcats finish season with win over Valley View

The Newcastle Bobcats finished out the season with a 22-16 win over Valley View and a 7-3 season's record.

The Cats, playing without All-State Candidate, Tailback Donnie Hulse, came to play football. The Cats, led by the running of Wayne Fields and Freshman Preston Pitts, along with the fine blocking of the line, broke loose time and time again for long gains. The Cats dedicated the game to their seniors, but got a help plenty from seniors center, Jim Mitchell, Tackles, John Taack and Alton Beekham, and End Terry Creel. The Cat's superb defense in the first half was the difference. Linebackers Harold Whiteley and Mike Mitchell dropped big John Stewart of the Warriors for losses on several occasions; and Mike Mitchell blocked QB Young's attempted punt to set up the first Bobcat score. The Cat's took over on the Warrior 27, after the blocked punt. Two plays later FB Wayne Fields hammered in from 4 yards out for the TD.

An on sides kick by QB John Tomlinson that was recovered by Mike Mitchell, set up the second Cat score. After Preston Pitts picked up the first down to the Warrior 20, Mike Mitchell passed to Pitts for the TD. Danny Casteel passed to Mitchell for the two points after. Valley View almost scored just before the half, but John Taack jarred the ball loose from David Jackson and Preston Pitts fell on the ball. Half time score 14-0.

Valley View came back in the third quarter and started a drive. The drive continued in the 4th to score on a six yard run by FB David Jackson. Jackson also scored the two points after.

The Cats came back with Tomlinson at the helm and in just eight plays Fields scored from 12 yards out, and Tomlinson added the points after. Valley View scored again on a three yard run by Stewart, and Stewart added the points after. With 2:58 remaining the Cats picked up two first downs and ran out the clock as the Cats stayed in the huddle and watched the last 20 seconds click off on a good season.

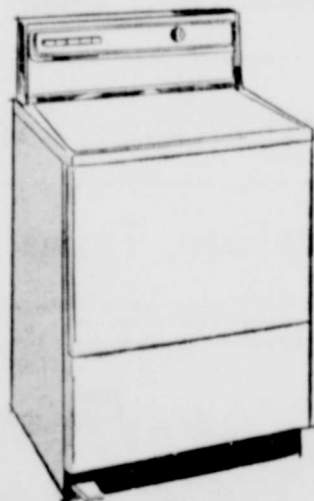

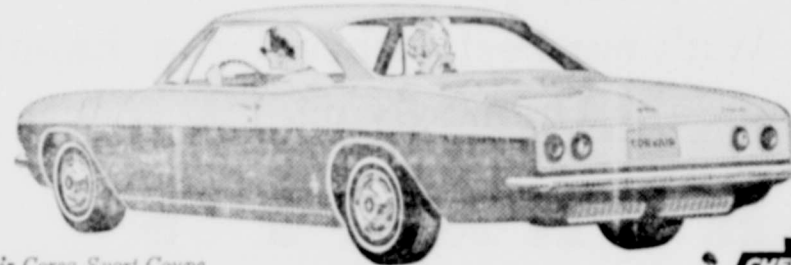

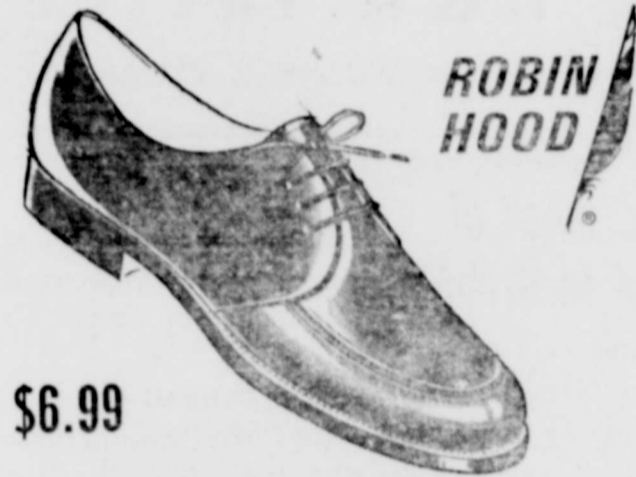
