## Brooks home named historic landmark

The historic Lewis Pinkney Brooks Home west of Graham has been named a Recorded Texas Historic Landmark, significant to the history of Texas. This announcement was made today by John Ben Shepperd of Odessa, president of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee.

Having completed the requirements for this high state designation, the Texas Historical Building Medallion with interpretive plate will be affixed at or near the structure with a Certificate of Award presented by Mrs. J. W. Bullock, Chairman of the Young County Historical Survey Committee.

The Medallion and plate marker, made of cast aluminum with Swedish steel effect is sponsored by Mrs. Barbara Ledbetter and Mr. L. W. Brooks. It consists of the Medallion of Texas and the 12"x6" interpretive plaque attached below it.

The plate states:

Home of Lewis Pinkney Brooks, Civil War Veteran. He Rode Mule, Georgia to Texas, 1866. Stone For Home Quarried On Place 1875. Recorded Texas Historic Landmark, 1965.

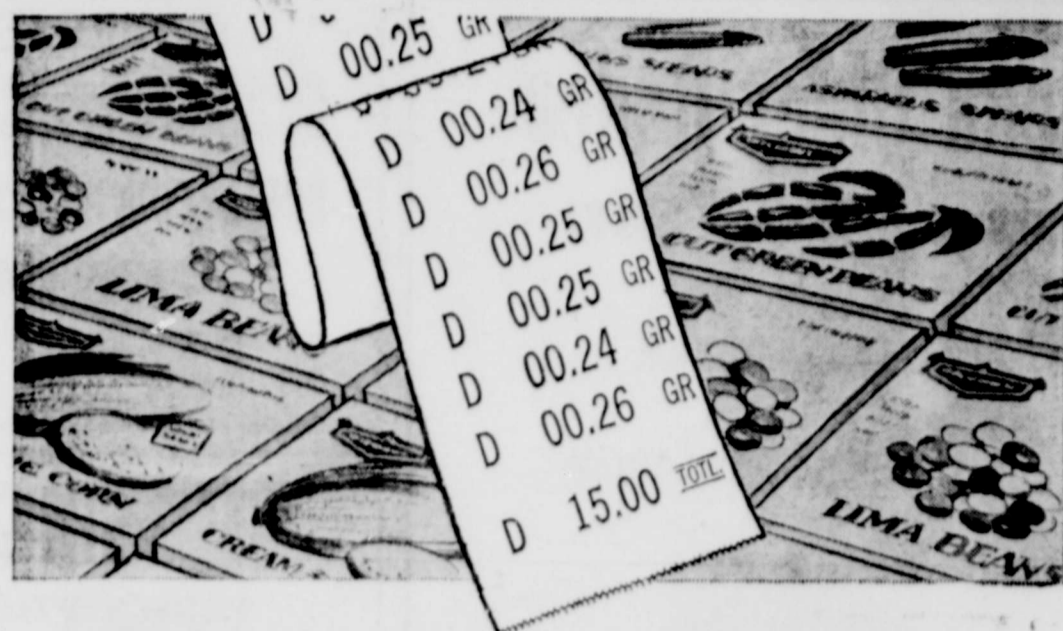

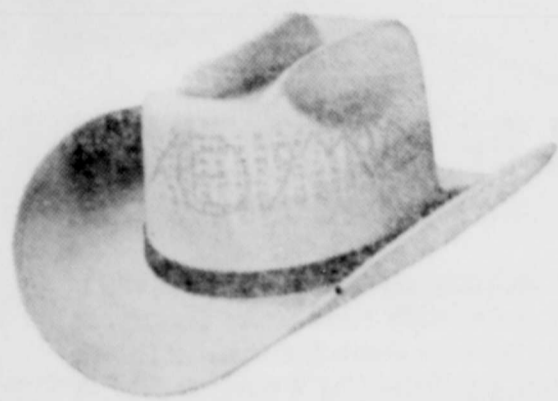

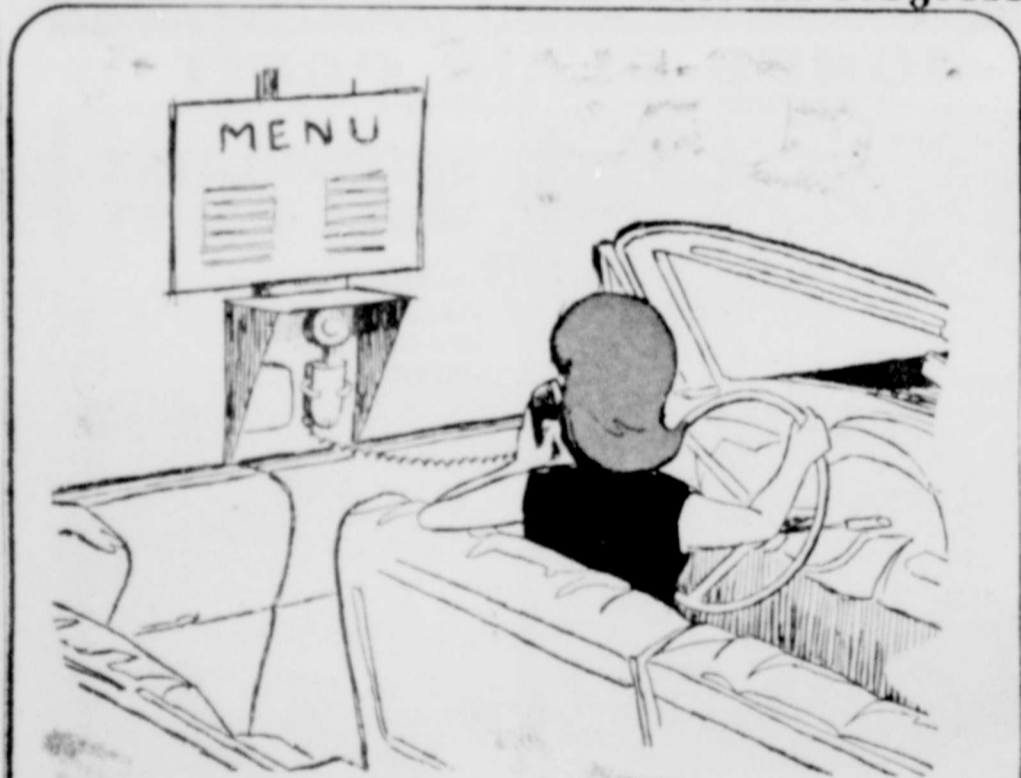
