Bugs resided in Boulder for almost two years working for Furr's, when he was transferred to one of their cafeterias in Arvada, Colo.

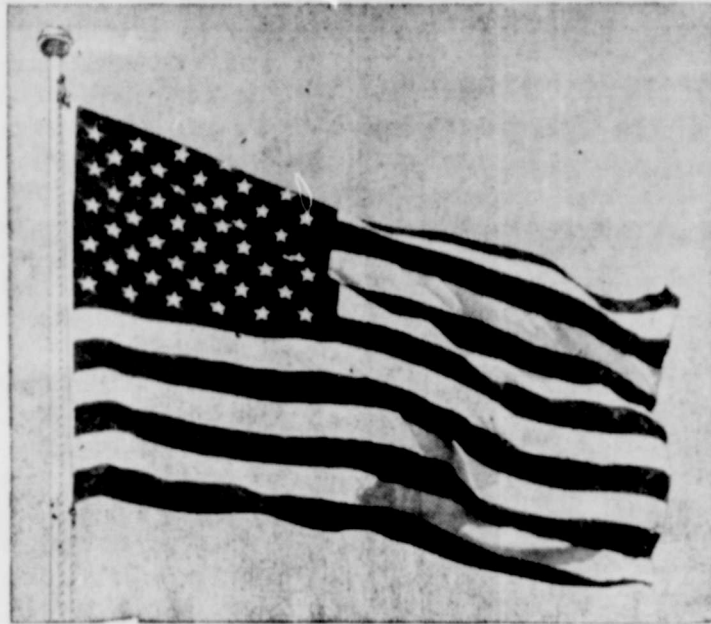
Jerry and his wife are glad to be back in Boulder and are very happy about his new position.

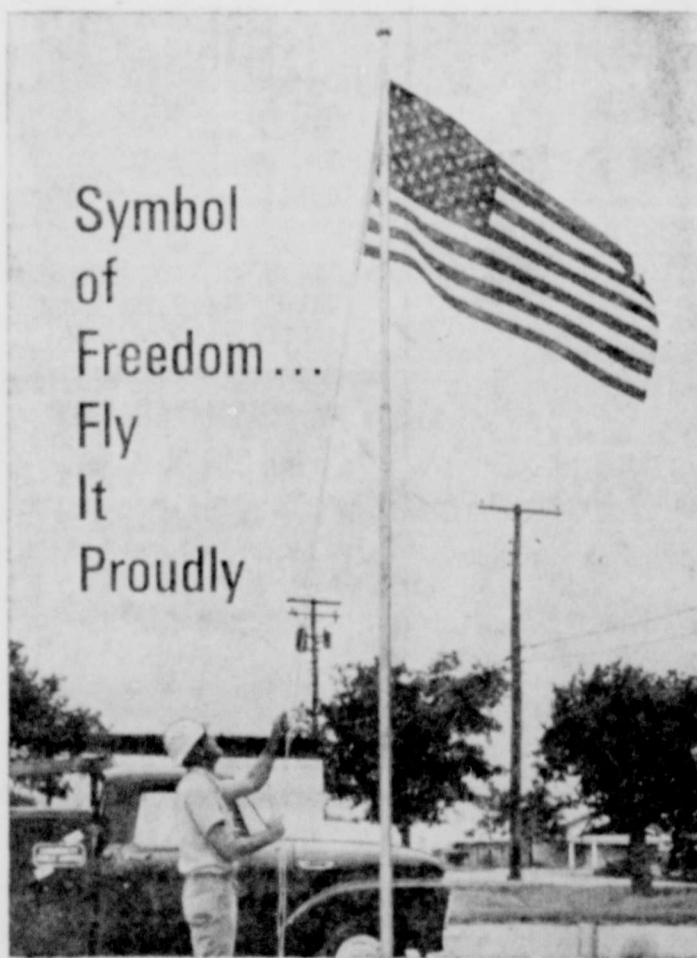
