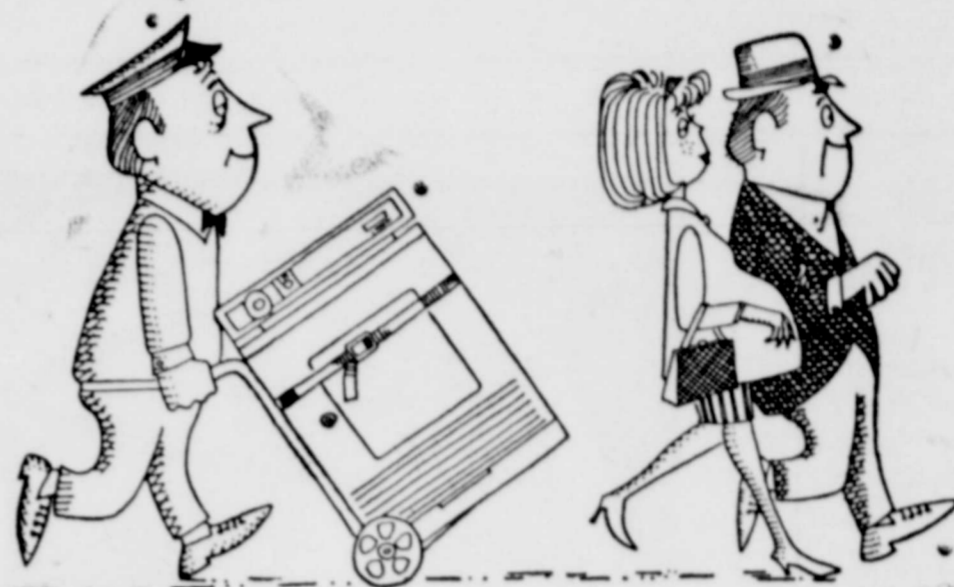
**'17 CLUB ANNUAL
