

#### Salad With Deep Sea Flavor •




Happy summer days are gone, but need not be forgotten. Conjure up memories of sea and salad days with an exotic new craband-rice dish. A breeze to prepare, this chilled and sparkling flavor-combination of Chinese vegetables, pineapple juice and mayonnaise is guest-proof, too. It can be kept for hours in the refrigerator and served at your convenience. The recipe may be doubled to serve twelve, if desired.

Tropical Crab Salad cup uncooked rice (NOT precooked variety)

- 1 cup uncooked rice (NOT precooked variety)
  Unsweetened pineapple juice
  2 pkgs. (6-oz.) frozen Alaska King crab meat,
  thawed and drained
  1 (1-lb.) can mixed Chinese vegetables, drained
  1 (5-oz.) can water chestnuts, drained and sliced
  1 cup thin diagonally sliced celery
  1/4 cup light cream or unsweetened pineapple juice
  2 cups real mayonnaise
- cups real mayonnaise
  /3 cup chopped scallions
  teaspoons curry powder Salad greens

Cook rice according to directions on package, substituting unsweetened pineapple juice for water. Toss with crab meat, Chinese vegetables, water chestnuts and celery. Gradually blend cream or pineapple juice into real mayonnaise. Mix in scallions and curry powder. Toss with rice mixture, mixing well. Chill. Serve on salad greens. (Makes 6 servings.)

The U. S. Government has noted that more than twelve million people in the United States are suffering with arthritis. Some



## VE REMEMBER ..

The 24th Infantry Division "The Victory Division"

Korea July 1, 1950

When the North Koreans invaded the Republic of Korea they were opposed by an army of about equal size but without armor or anti-tank weapons. The Reds, amply supplied with Russian-made equipment, easily advanced against the defenders.

The first American troops committed to aid the ROK forces were 1,000 infantrymen of the 24th Division. They were flown from Japan where they were on occupation duty to Pusan. From the port city they moved north by rail and



On July 3d, nine days after the invasion, the Americans entered action. Without tanks, outgunned and outmaneuvered the infantrymen could fight only delaying actions to gain time. The defense moved back to the Pusan perimeter and from there launched a counter-offensive in November. To the 24th Infantry went the honor of being the first combat unit in history to fight under the ban-
