UPT Class 81-04 gets wings today

This morning's graduation ceremony of Undergraduate Pilot Training Class 81-04 will mark the culmination of a year's intensive work and study for 49 new Air Force pilots.

Ceremonies are scheduled for 10 a.m. in Simler Theater.

Guest speaker for the event is Maj. Gen. Charles G. Cleveland, Air Training Command vice commander.

A graduate of the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, General Cleveland earned his master's degree in political science in Xavier University, Ohio, in 1966, and completed the advanced management program at Harvard University in 1969.

The general received his pilot wings in September 1950 upon completion of advanced pilot training at Williams AFB, Ariz. His first assignment was with the 31st Strategic Fighter Wing at the now-closed Turner AFB, Ga.

In Korea, General Cleveland flew F-86s as a flight commander with the 4th Fighter Interceptor Wing at Kimpo AB. While there, he was credited with shooting down four MiG-15s.

After several stateside assignments, General Cleveland was assigned in 1966 as executive assistant to General William Westmoreland in the Republic of Vietnam.

He returned to England in 1967, this time as a

student at the Royal Air Force College of Air Warfare, the top Royal Air Force service school. After several assignments in England, General Cleveland returned to the U.S. to assume command of the 3535th Navigator Training Wing at Mather AFB, Calif. He was transferred to ATC headquarters as chief of staff in June 1972.

The guest speaker went on to become deputy chief of staff for technical training in February 1974, and in July 1975 became director of personnel programs at Air Force headquarters. He assumed his present position March 12, 1979 and was promoted to the grade of major general effective Sept. 1, 1974, with a date of rank May 1, 1972.

General Cleveland is a command pilot who has accumulated more than 4,200 flying hours.

Class commanders during 81-04's training were Capt. Robert M. Burnside and Richard A. Kessler. Section leaders were Capt. Jack Schofield in Section I and Thomas Owskey in Section II.

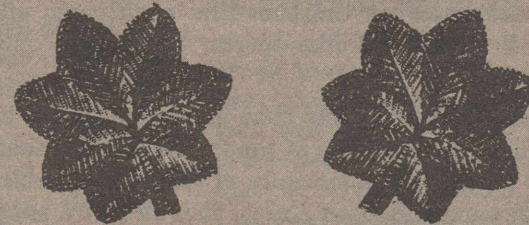

Five earn O-5 hike

Five Reese majors will soon be turning in their gold leaves for silver ones, joining 2,341 Air Force-wide who were selected for promotion by the 1981 Central Temporary Lieutenant Colonel Board that met at Randolph AFB, Texas in February.

Local selectees

Three of the local selectees are assigned to the 35th Flying Training Squadron: Maj. Michael R. Hollomon, Gary L. Lindner and Robert S. Muench. Maj. Carl D. Alberchinski of Supply and David R. Lloyd of the 54th FTS rounded out the Reese list.

Others selected for promotion include 2,088 line officers, 42 judge advocates, 32 chaplains, 92 nurses, 24 medical services officers and 63 biomedical sciences officers.

First timers

The selection rate for first-time-eligible line officers was 63 percent, 1,750 of 2,783. Second-time selection rate was 14 percent, 106 of 748. Overall, the total board line-officer selection rate was 30 percent, 1,931 of 6,545. Secondary-zone line-officer selection rate was 2.4 percent, 157 of 6,592.

Among rated officers in the primary zone, selection rate was 33 percent, 925 of 2,833. New eligibles selection rate was 66 percent, 857 of 1,301. First-time, primary-zone pilot eligible selection rate was 68 percent, 691 of 1,010; and navigator selection rate was 57 percent, 166 of 291.

In the secondary zone, 89 of 2,420 pilots, 3.7 percent, and five of 567 navigators, nine-tenths of one percent, were selected.

Non-rated

First-time-eligible non-rated officers had a selection rate of 60 percent, 893 of 1,481; while secondary-zone selection rate was 1.7 percent, 63 of 3,605.

Among all line officers, 33 percent of the regular officers and 16 percent of the reserve officers eligible were selected.

All 195 air force reserve line officers selected for promotion, who were otherwise eligible, were also selected for regular air force appointments.

DCO explains marquee

A few weeks ago there was an article in the Roundup describing the flying time-line position on the base marquee. Just to be sure everyone understands what the time-line position is and what it means, I'd like to run the article once again.

Each Wednesday the time-line position will be posted on the marquee at the front gate entrance. By no means is it a measure of the overall health or effort expended on Reese. It is in fact a snapshot of how our operational and maintenance investments have paid dividends. What the

numbers will tell you is how many days ahead or behind the ATC time line we are here at Reese.

There are many variables that affect that time-line position. Those variables which we control are the maintenance capability, operational availability, and scheduling flexibility. The uncontrollable variables are unpredictable mechanical problems, weather, and parts availability.

If the weather and other unpredictable variables work against us, the number may drop from the plus side to the minus side. What we really know is if the variables work in our favor, the outstanding folks we have in the maintenance and operational areas will meet the task and keep the number on the positive side of the ledger.

ATC warns of motorcycle danger

(ATCNS)—The number of motorcycle mishaps involving Air Training Command members continues to take a heavy toll in both lives and dollars, and that fact has ATC commanders and safety officials concerned.

Despite the fact that motorcycle accidents actually decreased by 20 percent from 1979 to 1980, the number of fatalities rose from three to seven in the same year. The sharp increase in fatal accidents translated into a 10 percent increase

in lost workdays and a phenomenal 202 percent increase in dollar costs.

Command safety officials attribute the rise in fatalities to several factors. Only four of the seven 1980 victims were wearing motorcycle helmets at the time of their accidents. The use of alcohol and inattention to traffic regulations or hazardous road conditions were also cited as contributing factors.

However, one of the biggest areas of concern within ATC is the relationship between inexperienced riders and motorcycle mishap rates. A disproportionate number of accidents seem to involve cyclists who

are inexperienced, uncertified and, in some cases, unlicensed.

As one ATC field commander recently put it, "The first few months of motorcycle riding are critical. Many riders can relate heart stopping incidents where sheer luck was the only difference between 'live-and-learn' and 'crash-and-burn.'"

Some commanders are attacking the problem by directing security policy checks of all motorcycle operators on their bases. The results are revealing.

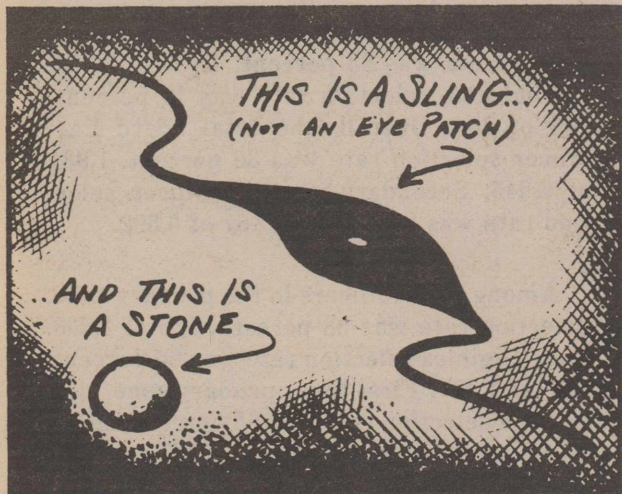
Since the checks began at one ATC base, the security police have identified 129 cyclists who had not

attended the mandatory Air Force motorcycle safety course, three without a valid operator's license, 30 without valid state registration and 79 without a base decal.

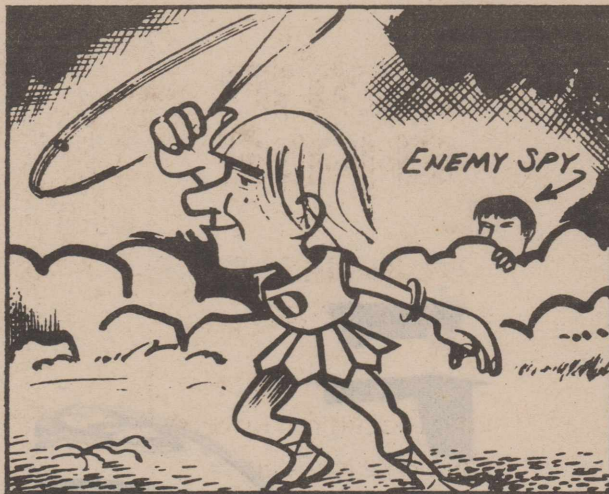
Statistics compiled through the first two months of 1981 show a slight decline in ATC motorcycle mishap reports. Yet that may not be grounds for optimism.

"The worst months are still ahead of us," said L.C. Walls, ground safety chief at ATC headquarters. "Spring and summer are traditionally peak periods for motorcycle mishaps."

Volunteer works full time

Everybody agrees, right? Working a 40-hour week gets to be a real pain. No time to yourself, getting up early, dragging out those last 30 minutes before quitting time.

Everybody seems to agree, perhaps, except Eugene Grimshaw, a Red Cross volunteer who has been working eight hours a day in the Reese emergency room since December.

And it didn't start there. For about nine months Grimshaw has been working as a volunteer; working towards the day "when my Dad retires. I'll go to college and get my degree in nursing."

His dad is SMSgt. James Grimshaw, supervisor of nursing services and NCOIC of hospital services, so he comes by his interest honestly.

Although answering phones, logging in patients and helping medical technicians with minor repairs is not the culmination of his desire to be in the medical field, Eugene calls it "good experience, like on-the-job training."

The volunteer not only gives

up his free time to help out in the emergency room, he actually quit a part-time job at the child care center to do it. "I only worked part time at the center," he says, "so I needed something else to do with the rest of my time." His father will retire in August and Eugene plans to attend a college located in Washington State where the family plans to settle.

Although Eugene is considering a commission in the Air Force, his foremost desire is to continue his work in the medical field, wherever that might take him. For all those who count dedication as an important attribute of an Air Force officer, Eugene Grimshaw would be a prize catch for any base hospital.

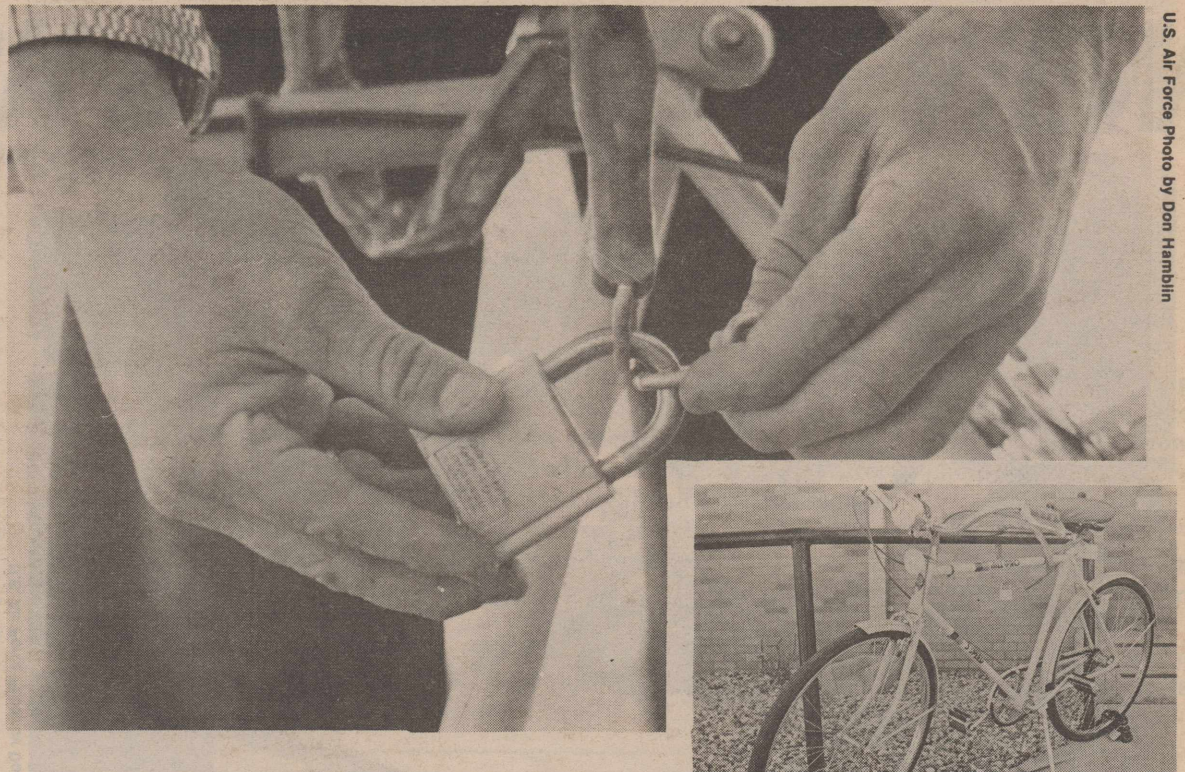

DOD pushes gasohol; Reese seeks supply

A Defense-wide effort to limit oil consumption by using gasohol in military vehicles may not have any immediate effect at Reese, according to fuels superintendent SMSgt. Harry Williams.

"It all hinges on a source of supply," said Sergeant Williams. "We already have a work order in to prepare a tank for use, including sand blasting, coating with epoxy paint and hooking up a water removal system, but we can't change to gasohol until we can get a guaranteed source of supply."

It seems the problem is limited fuel storage space. Starting use of gasohol, and then having an interrupted supply line, would necessitate running vehicles on regular gas since Reese does not have tanks for both unleaded and gasohol. Since federal law prohibits using regular in late-model cars, constant supply is a must.

Sergeant Williams estimates that Reese will not be using

gasohol for at least one year.

Gasohol is a mixture of unleaded gasoline and at least 10 percent alcohol. It has existed since the 1930s. Only recently did efficient processing methods and higher oil prices make gasohol profitable to produce.

According to a five-point policy memorandum issued by energy officials, Air Force motor vehicles using unleaded gasoline will switch to gasohol when price and availability make it practical.

The Air Force energy office said alcohol fuels can contribute to reducing both motor gasoline shortages and the quantity of oil imported to the United States. Also, DOD is the single largest consumer of gasoline in the nation, averaging nearly six million barrels annually. Energy officials said DOD has a responsibility to demonstrate the use of gasohol to the greatest extent practical and to stimulate the development of a viable U.S. gasohol industry.

In a recent interview with the Air Force News Service, the Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Lew Allen Jr., made the following observations:

—On pay and entitlements: "Pleased but not satisfied."

"I view the issues of pay and entitlements as critical to the future effectiveness of the Air Force. I'm convinced that the decision makers in the administration and in Congress understand that our people's needs have to be met if this country is to retain a quality Air Force. "I am pleased with the latest compensation gains—but not satisfied. With the effects of inflation on everyone's paycheck, it is still tough for many of our people to make ends meet.

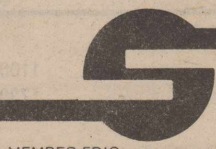

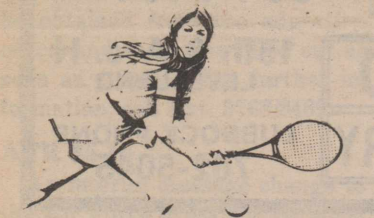
