





### Wayland To Inaugurate 5-Year Plan

A five-year development program for Wayland Baptist College has been officially launched by the executive committee of the college's Board of Development.

In a meeting at the college the group voted to expand the committee's membership from 15 or 30 or more persons. Members of the executive committee will be drawn from communities "within the influence of the college."

Earlier the executive committee adopted a basic plan for the Board of Development, according to W. Neil Record, Wayland's development director. "The plan is to select two members from each community, or church, for every 500 in attendance at Sunday School, with no community having fewer than two members," he stated.

By authority of the trustees and in cooperation with the college administration the board members will furnish names and assist in solicitation of persons interested in supporting Wayland College. Pastors will be asked to suggest persons for the Board of Development.

In other action the executive committee authorized the naming of a subcommittee to assist in contacts with foundations, corporations and individuals for major gifts in connection with the five-year program.

### King Ranch Makes Gift To Texas Tech

The King Ranch has given Texas Tech's School of Agriculture two Santa Gertrudis heifers and a bull to enable Tech to establish a foundation herd of the famed breed for teaching and research.

Tech Agriculture Dean Gerald W. Thomas, in announcing the \$9,500 gift Wednesday, said "this generous action represents a significant contribution to our animal husbandry program."

The animals were donated by Richard M. Klebreg, Jr., executive vice president of the King Ranch, Inc.

Dr. Thomas said "we will plan to utilize the animals as effectively as possible in our teaching and research programs."

The animals will be sold after they complete their service to the college and proceeds will be used to establish a scholarship at Tech in the name of the King Ranch.

Santa Gertrudis is a breed developed on the King Ranch at its sprawling installation near Kingsville. The first recognized breed of beef cattle, sonized breed of beef cattle, it has spread rapidly throughout the United States and abroad.

The breed, obtained by using Shorthorn and Brahman crosses, is highly prized because of its heat and insect tolerance and high performance ability.
