

### Along The Waterfront



Duck hunting and fishing were both exceptionally good this week and all the sportsmen are very happy.

Mr. and Mrs. Charles Cleveland went hunting the first morning of the season and got their limit in just twenty-five minutes.

Fishing was very good at Floyd's Boat and Sales Company. Mr. Fahr and Eric Ekstrand caught 60 nice trout there Sunday and Mr. Fletcher and Earl Armour of San Antonio got 17 trout and 2 pompano. Saturday Bob Lee, of Rockport, landed 47 trout and Mr. Jameson and friend, of San Antonio, brought in 60 trout. H. E. Nichols and G. G. Gilson, of Rockport, caught 17 redfish that averaged over 8 pounds each. Dick Denny saw this catch and went right out and landed a 9 1/2 pound red.

At Mill's Wharf they have been so busy with hunters that they have not paid too much attention to the fishing. There has been a large number of hunters out there and practically all have brought in their limits every day. Andrew Becker fished with Jack Lawler Thursday and Friday, getting 28 fish Thursday and 74 on Friday. Willard Wood went out with Herb Mills Thursday, catching 62 trout. Mr. McNatt, of Dallas, caught 69 rat reds and trout Friday and there were 35 hunters out from the Wharf Friday and all got their limits. On Saturday C. H. Goldson, fishing with Jack Lawler, caught 231 fish. Mr. Cushman was out with Harry Mills, also getting a good string of fish. Sunday Mr. Schmidt, of San Antonio, fished with Herb Mills, catching 235 fish and Mr. Tandy, fishing with Jack Lawler, had a good catch. Mrs. J. C. Millican and Mrs. Willard Beck, both of Refugio, fished with Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Mills Monday, bringing in 70 trout.

Thursday Carl Edwards fished with Fred Christies. He caught 41 trout, and Saturday Mr. and Mrs. Allison, of Houston, landed 91 trout. C. L. Wheatly, of San Antonio, caught 70 nice big trout Sunday and Wednesday Wm. Stuart, of San Antonio, got 49 trout. Jim Philpott, of Miami, Texas, caught 5 redfish this week which tipped the scales at 46 pounds.

Mr. and Mrs. Wallace Simpson, of Paducah, Texas, have been fishing this week, getting a number of small fish and Mrs. Simpson caught one 8 1/2 pound red. Mr. Keltner and party, of Houston, fished with Earle Thomas Saturday, bringing in 83 trout and 1 pompano. Sunday Mr. Jaosser and party, of San Antonio, got 74 trout and 1 pompano. All the guests at Walton Courts who have been hunting have brought in their limit of ducks.

Hugh Morrison took a party from the Glace Construction Co., of Ft. Worth, out Sunday, catching 103 fish which dressed 67 pounds.

Good fishing was reported at Perry Jones' wharf over the week end. Mostly trout being taken, with a few reds.

Out at Port Bay Club all the hunters have gotten their limits, some of them in only two or three minutes.

Shorty Townsend took R. M. Laughlin, Wade Smith and Gambel Smith, all of Dallas, up the bay hunting and fishing Friday. They came in Monday with 200 fish and their limits of ducks.

Gerald Adolphus is also taking hunters out this fall. All parties have returned with their limit.

Tuesday Mr. Roof and party of two fished with Bill Crist on the Freda, catching 35 nice trout. Mr. and Mrs. Chavez, of San Antonio, caught 58 real large trout Saturday and Sunday. Mr. and Mrs. Brabson got 142 nice trout. Mr. Fiehner and Mr. Gordon brought in 140 large fish Monday and Mr. Denny and Mr. Fountain got 75 trout.

At the Jolly Roger Camp they are catching drum, trout and a few reds, mostly off the pier, although the boats going out get nice strings of fish, too.

### Aransas Find Is Shutin; Mud Flats Test Spotted

An Aransas County gas-distillate strike five miles north of Rockport was shutin this week awaiting flow lines.

Hunt Oil Co. No. 1 State Tract 91 was shutin with bottomhole shutin pressure of 3,275 pounds. Surface pressure leveled off at 2,200 pounds during preliminary testing from perforations at 7,073-77 feet. The strike has 5 1/2-inch casing set at 8,636 feet, the total depth.

Hunt's No. 1 State Tract 92 was drilling at 6,150 feet. This test is northeast of the No. 1-91.

M. C. Susman of Beverly Hills, California, has staked a deep semi-wildcat three miles southeast of Bayside just north of the Mud Flats Field.

His No. 1 F. G. Gabriel will be 660 feet from the southwest and 467 from the southeast lines of Lot 4 of Section 48 of the Fifth Addition of Taft Farm Lands in William Steele Survey. Located in an 80-acre lease, the test will drill from a ground elevation of 15.8 feet.

The test will be 1,355 feet north-northeast of the Ryan, Hayes, and Burk No. 1 Martin Wheeler, an oil well.

Sun Oil Co. A-1 St. Charles Bal State Tract 368, Aransas County wildcat 14 1/2 miles north-east of Rockport, was waiting on cement after running 7 5/8-inch casing to 8,498 feet. This test is projected to 11,500 feet.

Union Producing Co. No. 1 St. Charles Bay State Tract 377, wildcat 3 1/2 miles northeast of Lamar, has been plugged and abandoned at 9,105 feet.

Western Natural Gas Co. No. 23 St. Charles Ranch, proposed 12,000-footer in the St. Charles Field 6 1/2 miles northeast of Lamar, was drilling below 7,104 feet.

A Blackjack Field test 10 1/2 miles northeast of Lamar, Western Natural Gas Co. No. 23 St. Charles Ranch Co. was drilling below 6,750 feet.

Hunt Oil Co. No. 2 State Tract 84, in the Lamar Field, was preparing to reshoot and test a section at 7,288-7,308 feet.

Humble Oil and Refining Co. No. 1, Aransas Bay State Tract 196, in Rockport Field, will be 330 feet from the south and east lines of Tract 196. Permit depth is 9,500 feet.

Placid Oil Co. and others No. 1 Holden Unit No. 2, in the East Fulton Beach Field, will be 330 feet from the northeast and south-east lines of a 40-acre lease in William Carper Survey, A-47. Permit depth is 8,000 feet.

Sun Oil Co. No. 104-5, in the Salt Lake Field, will be 1,703 feet from the north and 467 from the east line of Copano Bay State Tract 104. Permit depth is 8,200 feet.

### Aransas County's USO Quota Set At \$400.00

Aransas County today opened its 1952 campaign for the USO. County Chairman Marion McElveen announced that within the next few days the county will seek to raise its proportionate share of \$400 of the Texas goal of \$740,896.

"We can no longer think of our own boys and girls serving in the uniform of their country without thinking of the wonderful job which USO is doing in their behalf," Mr. McElveen said. "The USO, in effect, has become an unofficial branch of our armed forces."

"We must strengthen all of our defense efforts, and USO is no exception, for the draft calls will continue to drain off our young people and to place them on duty on cold war fronts around the globe," the chairman said.

USO has established 104 new units during the past 12 months in the areas of greatest need at home and overseas, bringing the total number of clubs and lounges to 271. Seventeen of these are located in Texas.

Money is needed to support these units so let's give freely.


### Fulton P.-T.A. Carnival Well Attended

### ZIP-TRAIN OF THE FUTURE



Whizzing over tomorrow's landscape, the high-speed monorail superliner seen at left above may be the railroad's answer to challenge of the airplane. Built near Cologne, Germany, for test runs only, the model car is two-fifths normal size, travels 100 miles per hour. Backed by Swedish millionaire Axel Wenner-Gren, the new train was kept secret by the Rail Transportation Research Society until this year. At right is the unique monorail track at a switching point which is set to curve right. Electric power is fed to the engine through metal bands on the rails. Rollers, built into a deep slot on the engine's underside, ride on the one rail which is six feet above ground. Full-scale models are expected to travel 210 miles per hour.

### HUNTING BOAT RULE CHANGED

AUSTIN—The Executive Secretary of the Game and Fish Commission called Texas hunters' attention to a 1952 change in the waterfowl regulations affecting power boats.

He said gunners may now use a boat with an inboard motor or boats with an outboard motor providing the boats are tied or secured to a permanent blind.

The law covering this phase previously forbade use of inboard motor boats altogether and stipulated that boats using outboard motors had to have the motor immobilized and placed in the bottom of the craft when it was kept in a duck blind.

The Executive Secretary said the liberalizing regulation is expected to accommodate many hunters in the coastal area where power boats are commonly used.

He cautioned hunters that use of motor boats to disturb or chase waterfowl is unlawful, although motors may be used to retrieve dead or crippled ducks or geese.

The Executive Secretary said the regulation governing baiting waterfowl has been tightened in that shooting over baited areas is forbidden altogether.

### Navigation District Will Hold Election

The Aransas County Navigation District Number One will hold an election on Tuesday, December 2, 1952, for the purpose of electing three commissioners.

The present commissioners, who were appointed by the Commissioners Court are: James A. Jarboe, B. W. Hamblin and C. Jacobsen. Their terms expire January 1, 1952.

Since commissioners of the navigation district can either be appointed by the County Commissioners Court or elected by the people it was decided to hold an election so that the entire county could have the privilege of voicing their opinion in the selection of the commissioners.

Candidates for the office must make application to the secretary, B. W. Hamblin, so that their names may be printed on the ballot. Such application must be made at least twenty clear days before the date of election. Names of candidates may be placed on the ballot by a petition of twenty or more qualified voters.

Of the three commissioners elected, one will serve for two years, one for four years and one for six years. Such terms will be decided by lot after election. Thereafter every two years an election will be held to elect one commissioner, so that at all times there will be two holdover commissioners on the board.

### OIL FIELD WORKER KILLED IN FALL FROM DERRICK

### Aransas County Goes Republican By 2-1 Majority

The voters of Aransas County cast 818 votes for Dwight D. Eisenhower and Richard M. Nixon and 504 for Adlai Stevenson and John C. Sparkman, 1 vote for Douglas MacArthur and Vivien Kelems, and 2 for Stuart Hamblin and E. A. Holtwick, in the general election Tuesday which swept the Republican party into control in Washington.

The Democratic state and county officers were elected, although the ticket was split, there appearing to be about one third of the votes Republican and two-thirds Democratic cast for the state officers.

Lt. Gov. Ben Ramsey led the ticket with a vote of 1,261, and Gov. Shivers received 1,180 votes.

With one exception county officers were unopposed. J. M. Jack Sparks, Jr. ran for County Commissioner in Precinct Two on the Democratic ticket and Chester Johnson on the Republican. Sparks received 286 votes and Johnson 228, giving Sparks a 58 majority.

Both Constitutional Amendments carried in Aransas County by a large majority. No. 1—Authorizing the legislature to provide Workmen's Compensation for Employees of Cities, Towns and Villages. 131 votes were cast for the amendment and 55 against it. The second amendment calls for the establishment of a State medical education fund from which grants, loans or scholarships may be made to students desiring to study medicine.

A brief picture of the national election Thursday morning shows Eisenhower elected president by the largest popular vote ever given any presidential candidate, 31,691,542, Stevenson, 25,501,568, in 131,498 of 146,361 precincts in the nation. Eisenhower led in 39 states with 442 electoral votes and Stevenson in 9 states with 89 electoral votes. It appears that the Republicans will have a very slight lead in both the Senate and House.

Aransas County cast the largest vote in its history, approximately 1,325,468 ballots were cast in Precinct 1 which includes that part of Aransas Pass which is in Aransas County; 539 in Precinct 2; 231 in Precinct 3; 35 in Precinct 4. There were 52 absentee ballots cast.



**'Miracle of Our Lady of Fatima' Due to Surf Nov. 11-12**

The outstanding religious film, "The Miracle of Our Lady of Fatima" will be shown at the Surf Theatre, Tuesday and Wednesday, November 11 and 12.

In a reverent, moving, delicately emotional and highly dramatic motion picture, Warner Brothers here present a carefully authentic document of faith. It is reverent in its approach to an event of modern times little known until recently, which is explainable only in terms of a 2,000-year-old faith; moving in its depiction of the results of that event; emotional in the sense that the witnesses and participants acted under the strongest of human emotions, and dramatic because the event itself and its surrounding circumstances were of the essence of drama.

The year is 1917, the place a tiny hill town in Portugal named Fatima. After seven years of persecution and ruthless suppression of the Church under a left wing totalitarian government, the country people retain their simple faith. One morning tending sheep in a hill pasture known as the Cova da Iria, a 12-year-old girl and her two younger cousins are frightened by a sudden thunderstorm. Then they are calmed and awed by a vision of a beautiful lady who tells them she wishes them to tell the people of the world that they must return through prayer to God.

She tells the children that she will appear again to them at the same spot on the 13th day of each month for six months and that on the final day she will give them a sign by which all the people may believe.

How the three children, portrayed by Susan Whitney, Sherry Jackson and Sammy Ogg, hold to their account of the visions in the face of the strongest scepticism on the part of their parents, their pastor and the church authorities, and cling even more tenaciously to their faith before the ferocious physical

threats of the civil authorities, is the dramatic substance of the picture.

The account is climaxed when on the day of the final vision 17,000 people are brought to fervent conviction by a wholly unnatural rain-storm and a displacement of the sun visible to everyone. The final sequence is a panorama of the 1,000,000 pilgrims who visited Fatima last year.

The faithful recounting of these facts in the picture is woven into a deeply moving, wholly absorbing screen drama, even while retaining its meticulously documentary character. Credit for this remarkable unity must be divided among the direction of John Brahm; the performances of the players even in minor roles but most especially by Susan Whitney as Lucia and Gilbert Roland as Hugo, the gently cynical ne'er-do-well who is convinced only by the final miracle; and the screenplay by Crane Wilbur and James O'Hanlon. Production credit goes to Bryan Foy.

The photography in WarnerColor is notable for its careful balancing of color values and the music score by Max Steiner sustains the mood of the picture.

Because it is a religious picture in the sense that it is the story of a particular manifestation of a particular faith, the production inevitably will be compared to previous films in the same category. Its uncompromising adherence to the documented facts and its overall human dramatic values should make its appeal to any motion picture audience greater than any of its predecessors in its field.
