### Pat H. Greene To Head Local **School System**

Pat H. Greene who resigned as head of the Clear Creek Consolidated Independent School District in February, has accepted a threeyear contract as superintendent of the Aransas County Independent School District, effective July 1.

Mr. Greene has been named by the local school board to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of J. F. Harbin who resigned as school superintendent March 10. Harbin has held the position of superintendent of local schools for the past seven years.

Mr. Greene came to Webster in 1924 as superintendent. During his administration the school grew from a non-affiliated school to one with fifty units and has affiliation with the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

In 1948 Mr. Green played a major part in consolidating the schools of Kemah, League City, Seabrook and Webster into Clear Creek Consolidated Independent School District.

Under his leadership new schools Tax Assessments have been built at Kemah, Seabrook and Webster, and additions have been built at League City.

#### Students Who Plan To Work Should Get S. S. Numbers Now

Students whon plan to work this summer, will need social security account number cards, says H. M. Cleveland, manager of the Corpus Christi social security office. He urges them to apply at the social security office if they have never had a social security card or if they had one which has been lost There is no charge for a card, and there is no age requirement.

Application blanks for the numbers are available at any postoffice, the State Employment office, or the Social Security Administration, 424 Taylor Street, Corpus Christi.

Cleveland pointed out that it takes several days to get a social security card, so he suggests that applicants not wait until an employer tells them that they can't go to work until they have a card. 'Apply for a card now," he ad-

Any person who works on social security jobs and received wages of \$50 or more in six different calendar quarters is insured under social security at this time. When an insured worker dies leaving a widow and a child, monthly benefits may be payable to them until the child reaches age 18. A lump sum death payment can be 'paid even if the worker never married.

"These are some of the reasons which emphasize the importance of getting and using your social security card. Use it! Don't lose it!" Cleveland said in conclusion.
