Yacht Basin Water Being Polluted

State Game and Fish Commission Warden report local widespread violation of statutes prohibiting tidewater pollution in and around bays and harbors of the State.

There are several ways of violating the provisions of this act, but the one most commonly practiced in the Rockport Yacht Basin is the habit by certain boatmen of pumping oil or oily bilge water overboard while tied up to dock or shortly after leaving harbor. Not only is this a direct and unnecessary breach of the law but it is a complete and filthy disregard for the rights of others. Those indulging in such practices know full well that the resulting scum will spread over a wide area and not only foul up newly painted boats but make nearby beaches unfit for use. In addition the oily film will kill marine life, particularly bait shrimp laboriously obtained by local dealers for supplying the ever increasing demand of fishermen who visit here.

The law prohibiting this sort of vandalism comes under the direct supervision of the Texas Game and Fish Commission. All wardens are under strict orders to arrest and vigorously prosecute offenders. The minimum fine to be imposed upon conviction in any such case has been set by statute at \$100.00 dollars, plus costs. Convictions can also, at the discretion of a presiding judge, mean loss of licenses and privileges. Courts have little sympathy with violators of this law and except in unusually extenuating circumstances will not accept excuses. Conviction not only means loss of money and time but carries the stigma of being on a permanent criminal docket of the Court in which tried.

An outline of the law in question follows herein, and it is suggested that those involved read it carefully: "It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, association, town, city or other political subdivision of this State, or any agent, officer, employee representative of any person, firm, corporation, association, town, city or other political subdivision of this State to pollute any public body of surface water of this State. "Pollute" is hereby defined to be the throwing, discharging or otherwise permitting to reach or be introduced into any public body of surface water of this State any substance, material or thing in such quantity that the said water is thereby rendered unfit for one or more of the beneficial uses for which such water was fit or suitable prior to the introduction of such substance, material or thing, or is thereby rendered harmful to public health, game birds or game animals, fish or other edible aquatic animals, or endangers any wharf, or endangers or hinders the operation of any boat, or renders insanitary
