"The specific initial goals of the National Foundation are polio, virus diseases, arthritis, birth defects and disorders of the central nervous system," Mrs. LeBlanc

Birth defects cause the death of 34,000 U.S. infants a year.

This is one-fourth of all infants who are stillborn or die within the first month of life. A total of 250,000 U.S. infants are born annually with one or more significant birth defects. Half of them will grow up afflicted with serious illness, crippling or chronic disease.

Patient aid for children through 18 suffering from birth defects involving the central nervous system soon will be offered by the National Foundation. Included are spina bifida (faulty structure of the spine); encephalocele (open skull); and hydrocephalus (excess fluid in the brain cavities). This age group is the most hopeful For Battle with which to work, with the possibility of bringing many to maturity able to live normal and productive lives.

These defects are caused before birth, not during the act of birth. Known causes are injuries to the germ cells and factors which act the mother, or both.

'The importance of birth defects as a cause of death and crippling is increasing. In 1939, a total of 12.413 infants died of this cause, but by 1953 the number rose to 20,012. Furthermore, the number of persons surviving crippling birth defects gains with improvement of surgical medical tech-

National Foundation researchers will study the causes of all of the more than 600 kinds of birth defects. They will seek methods of prevention as well as improved resulting in damage to cars, al- techniques for diagnosis and treatment. The earlier birth defects are detected, the better they respond to medical care or surgery.





Complete Eradication of Polio Still Prime Concern

The complete and final eradication of polio still remains a prime concern of the National Foundation as it goes into its 21st annual March of Dimes on Jan. 2 it was emphasized here today by Mrs. Leonard LeBlanc, campagn director of Aransas County.

"The Salk vaccine, developed 4 p.m. with March of Dimes funds," the director said, "gives us a powerful weapon for knocking out polio. With this victory in sight, even though not yet achieved, the National Foundation is preparing to march 'Toward Greater Victories' in the realm of public health. But Mrs. Urban Chupe, Mr. and Mrs. the National Foundation is still Rudy Nava, Hillis Dominguez and pledged to give patient aid to all polio victims past or future who need its help."

Estimates indicate some 150,000 survivors of paralytic polio might benefit from modern techniques of THE STATE OF TEXAS rehabilitation pioneered by the National Foundation. Some 50,000 are already on its patient aid chapter

"In polio research," the director said, "the National Foundation is seeking to increase the effectiveness of the Salk vaccine; indications are that it is 90 per cent effective with three properly spaced shots. Also being studied is a 'live' virus vaccine that can be taken orally. The Salk vaccine is a 'dead' virus vaccine requiring a series of injections. Other National Foundation researchers are looking for better ways to lessen polio."

The campaign director pointed out that while polio is on the run than three years after development of a preventive vaccine.

"We must keep up our vaccnation education program to prevent unnecessary crippling," the director said, "and we must take

# RON de BASTROP

First Friend of "The Father of Texas"

Every Texas school child knows the inspiring story of Moses and Stephen F. Austin, but few remember that these two champions of freedom had a friend whose wisdom, skill and diplomacy made their great colonization project possible. 
