## Notes From The County HD Agent

We in the four season climate areas have the wondrous pleasure of watching nature change her garb every few months. We, too, make changes in our garb to face the perennial problem of sorting and packing seasonal clothing.

Halfway between seasons, clothes closets, dresser drawers, and backdoor entries tend to become cluttered. And the more children there are in a family, the more muddled a mother may feel. A smooth transition involves several things.

First, list the major items in each child's wardrobe and accessories such as mittens, hats and scarves that are in good condition and wearable another year. Thinking ahead, if an item is outgrown by one and can be passed down, put it on the wardrobe list of the receiver. In a separate column note clothing that will have to be purchased. This way you can more readily take advantage of pre-season and special sales. Now is the time to discard worn out clothing and garments outgrown by the entire family.

Keep a sturdy box or plastic basket handy. When winter weather breaks, those heavy, space-taking clothes can be dropped in the box or basket - but still quickly retrieved in case of a blizzard.

A cardinal rule when storing clothing is to pack or hang it away clean. Clean fibers will not deteriorate as rapidly as soiled

fabric. Any dirt or food stains are the insects' invitation to dinner, so wash, rinse, and dry those that are washable. Also, mend rips, replace buttons and make other repairs as you go. You'll appreciate such foresight next winter. Remove belts from loops and close all fasteners. Many sweaters and knitted garments should be stored flat. Place tissue paper in the garment to prevent fold marks.

Suds-sponge the outside of lined boots; apply a shoe dressing to leather. Rubber and vinyl boots need only soap or detergent and water care. Be sure fleece lining is clean before storing. The crevice tool attachment of the vacuum cleaner is a useful tool in this respect. To freshen boots, pack them away with an unwrapped bar of soap tucked into each toe.

Storage space may be found in an attic or separate closet or in boxes. Strong generously-sized boxes, loaded with winter gear may be covered with stained wood tops to serve as tables in a family room or night stands in children's rooms. Select storage areas that are cool, dry, and out of sunlight.

If clothing is packed away, it's a good idea to number the boxes. Then number index cards and list what each box contains. The cards can be kept in a file box, on the box top, or taped to the back of the door to storage closet or attic. This saves time when looking for one particular garment in storage.

Store items according to probable use. Heavy coats and snow-pants needed for cold weather should go on the bottom leaving room for lighter weight jackets, sweaters and corduroys on top. Mothballs are good insurance

for wools. It is available in containers for hanging in closets or in packets of crystals or paper-impregnated with moth-proofing for drawers and boxes. Or, you can buy mothballs or crystals in bulk and make your own "mothball dolls." Cut three or four thicknesses of nylon net in a gingerbread man shape. Sew edges leaving an opening in the head section. Then stuff the dolls with mothballs or crystals.

Are you plagued by skunks? One way to get rid of them is simply to catch them. Here is a simple, tricky, safe way to catch a skunk.

- Place garbage can near area where skunks create disturbance. Keep lid nearby.
- Place 1" x 6", or 1" x 8", board on lip of can, resting other end on ground. Do not make angle steep - a long board is best.
- Place bait, such as sardines, table scraps, meat, inside can. Try to keep dogs and cats tied or penned.
- Early next morning, after trap has been baited night before, approach can very quietly, with garbage can lid in hand. Look into the can cautiously and if skunk is present, carefully place lid on can. Do not expose face to animal.
- Secure lid with rope or wire and haul to isolated area. Remove lid, overturn can with board and dispose of skunk with gun.




