### Protecting You From Yourself

Strange as it may seem, the motorcycle helmet has become the center of a raging constitutional debate. It came about in the following manner:

A number of states, worried about the soaring rate of motorcycle accidents, have passed laws requiring every rider to wear a helmet. However, these laws are being challenged on the ground that the government cannot force a person—just because it is good

for him—to do something he doesn't want to do.

Of course, the government does have a right, under the "police power," to step in when there is danger to others as well. This



compulsory vaccination was held constitutional long ago because the disease they endeavor not only the person himself but also others in the community.

But in the case of motorcycle helmets, the primary purpose is not to protect somebody else but to protect the motorcyclist from his own negligence. That is, the government is trying to protect him from himself.

So far, a few courts have held the helmet requirement to be unconstitutional, on the theory that the individual should be "master of his fate and captain of his soul." As one opponent put it, if the government can go this far, it could just as logically require everybody to be in bed by 10 p.m.

On the other hand, a majority of courts have held these laws valid. They argue that there is at least some benefit to others, because a helmetless rider, if struck by bugs or flying pebbles, may lose control of his motorcycle and cause a collision.

Besides, they add, some safeguarding of the individual is justified, because if he is injured, he (or his family) may become a public burden.

"It is in the interest of the state," said one court, "to have strong, robust, healthy citizens."

Of course, not all motorcyclists are concerned about the fine points of constitutional law. However, they all might take note of a harsh statistical fact: the vast majority of motorcycle deaths are the result of injuries to the head.

## pantry patter

If there is any vitamin likely to be missing in a day's meals, it will most likely be thiamine, B-1. It is distributed widely, but only sparingly in many foods.

The chronic grouch, the lazybones, the nervous man or the homemaker with vague complaints may be showing the effects of a lack of B vitamins. Thiamine promotes growth; aids in changing starches and sugars to body energy; aids digestive processes; maintains appetite; and helps keep nervous system healthy. Loss of appetite and loss of energy are early signs of a deficiency.

The nerve disease Beriberi is the result of a severe lack of thiamin. Dry beriberi results in loss of strength, loss of feeling in the skin, and paralysis beginning in the legs and finally extending upward. Wet beriberi is marked by great swelling in the arms and legs, and finally the trunk. Great enlargement of the heart results in death from heart attack. Beriberi often follows prolonged fevers, especially

malaria.

Whole grain and enriched cereals are excellent sources of thiamine, with legumes the next best source. Legumes include peas, limas and dried beans and peas. Pork and glandular meats as liver and heart are high in thiamine.

### APRICOT BREAD

- 1 cup dried apricots, chopped
1 cup granulated sugar
2 Tbs. Shortening
1 egg, well beaten
1/2 cup Orange juice
2 cups sifted flour
2 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. soda
1 tsp. salt
1 cup chopped nuts
Soak dried apricots 20 minutes.
Meanwhile cream together 1 cup sugar, the shortening and egg. Add dry ingredients, blend well. Drain apricots; stir apricots and nuts into batter. Bake in greased and floured loafpan at 300 degrees for 65 minutes, or until done. About 12 servings.
