

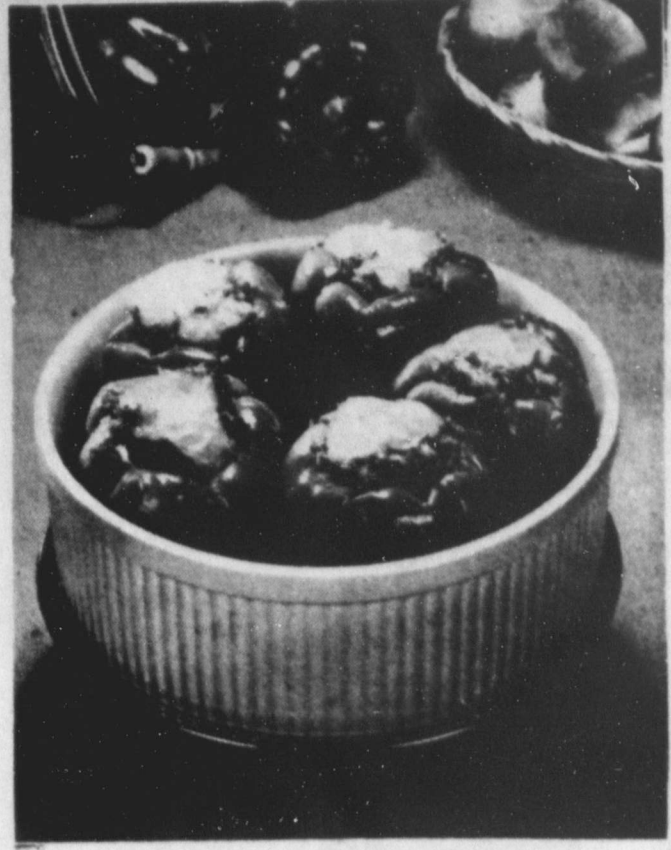

1040 U.S. Individuals Taxpayers Ask IRS

This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers.

Q) Does the increased deduction for child care and household services apply to amounts spent to care for a teenager? A) You are allowed a deduction of up to \$400 per month for expenses for dependent care and household services provided in your home: 1) if your dependent is under 13 and you are entitled to claim an exemption for him; or 2) if your dependent is physically or mentally incapable of caring for himself, regardless of age.
