Hearing Set On Proposed City Of Jayton Sewer System

Hobert Lewis, Mayor of Jayton, this week issued the following news release:

The City of Jayton, Texas, will hold a public hearing at 8 p. m. central daylight time, on May 17, 1974 at the city hall, on the planned sanitary sewage system, for the City of Jayton, Kent County, Texas. The project consists of collection lines, lift stations and treatment plant.

One of the purposes of this hearing is to discuss the potential environmental impacts of the project and the alternatives to it. Detailed information on this project including the complete description of the project, costs, and financing, information, alternatives to the project, and the environmental effects of all alternatives, if any, including a description of the effects of the project on land use is available at the city hall, of Jayton, Texas.

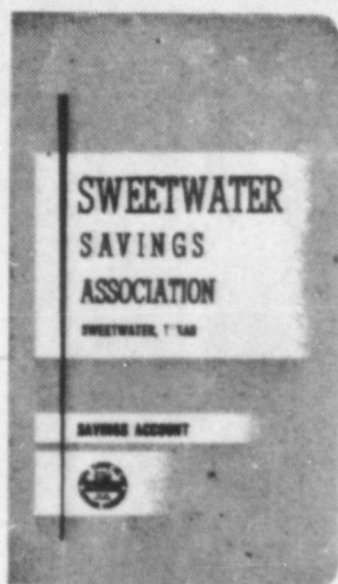

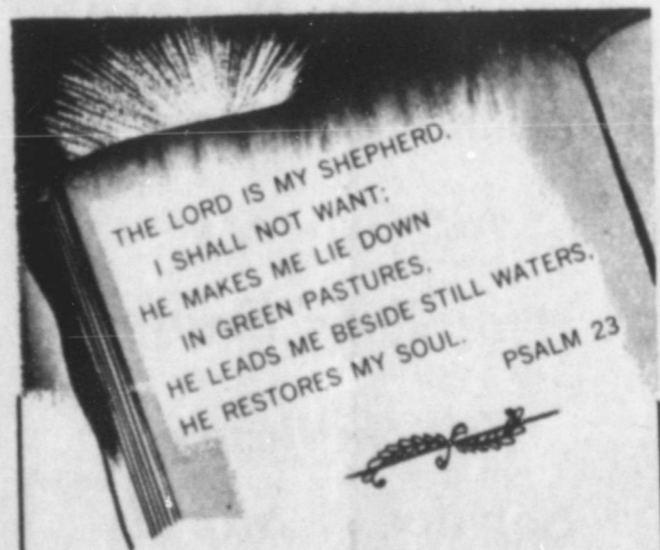
